Statistics on those served by CDLRE in 2013

(FPF = Failure to Pay Forfeiture)

As of October 16, 2014: 114 of 243 (46.9%) of the participants served by CDLRE in 2013 were re-suspended within 1 year.

- Of the 114: 39 re-suspended just on old FPFs
 - 28 re-suspended on both new and old FPFs
 - 15 re-suspended just on new FPFs
 - 12 re-suspended on old and new FPFs and upon DOT action
 - 8 re-suspended on new FPFs and upon DOT action
 - 8 re-suspended on old FPFs and upon DOT action
 - 4 re-suspended on DOT action alone

Of the total 243 served: 30.9% of them were re-suspended within 1 year for something more than just the old FPFs being re-enforced.

Of the 114 that re-suspended: 65.8% of them were suspended within 1 year for something more than just the old FPFs being re-enforced.

Other data on those that re-suspended:

- 72 of 114 participants (63.2%) appear to have had a valid driver's license (DL) during the month that CDLRE reported working with them
- 24 of 114 participants (21.1%) were cited for subsequent Ch. 346 violations
- 66 of 114 participants (57.9%) were cited for subsequent violations of any kind (this includes the 24 with Ch. 346 violations)
- 7 of 114 participants (6.1%) caused reportable accidents within 1 year of reinstating
- 1 participant's DL record indicates they are not medically certified to drive
- 1 participant's DL record looks like this:
