AMENDMENT INTENT

Transfer funding equivalent to 12 Police Officer recruits to add funding, FTE and position authority for 12 Trauma-Informed Care Specialist positions in the Health Department's Office of Violence Prevention:

BACKGROUND

The 2015 Proposed Budget provides salary funding to maintain an annual average of 1,880 filled sworn positions (out of 1,942 total authorized sworn positions). This is an increase of 12 positions (+0.6%) from the budgeted average annual sworn strength for 2014. To maintain this sworn strength level, the Proposed Budget calls for one 35-member Police Officer recruit class starting in mid-2015. In addition, a 50-member recruit class will start in December 2014 and graduate in mid-2015.

DISCUSSION

- 1. This amendment decreases the funding necessary to decrease the size of the Police Department's December 2014 recruit class from 50 to 38 recruits. Specifically, it reduces the department's personnel cost adjustment by \$555,160 and decreases FTEs by 12.
- 2. The amendment creates a Crisis Rapid Response Team in the Health Department by providing \$510,000 in funding for salaries for 12 Trauma-Informed Care Specialist positions.
- 3. The amendment provides an additional \$29,855 for Social Security taxes.

EFFECT .

The net impact of this amendment on the 2015 Budget is \$-15,305.

The tax-levy impact is \$-15,305 resulting in a tax rate impact of \$-0.001 per \$1,000 assessed valuation.
