## **Location-Based Opportunities**Action Item 4.2.1

Regularly communicate with M7 and key asset industry organizations to learn more about their location needs, and keep suitable Milwaukee sites on the radar

- City of Milwaukee taking a leadership in M7's new Next Generation Manufacturing Council.
- City and NGMC jointly wrote successful application for federal Investing in Manufacturing Communities Partnership designation

Advocate for infrastructure and policy changes that promote investment in public transportation options

 Common Council currently considering expanded streetcar initiative and funding plan



### **Location-Based Opportunities**Action Item 4.3.3

Explore and advance opportunities for live/work/sell space to support artists and entrepreneurs alike

- Bronzeville artists housing initiative
  - Reusing City-owned, foreclosed residential property
  - Adaptive re-use of Garfield School





#### **Human Capital Development**Action Item 5.1.5

Investigate proven national models, such as Children's Savings Accounts and "Say Yes to Education" that improve odds of college entry for students of low-income families

- Dept. of Administration exploring Children's Savings Accounts
- Outreach to local foundation regarding financial support



#### Entrepreneurship & Innovation Action Item 6.1.3

Establish a Local Business Action Team within City government to focus on improving services to businesses

- Action Team formed via Council file #140081
  - Co-chairs: Ald. Terry Witkowski, DNS Commissioner Art Dahlberg
- Two meetings held to date



#### Entrepreneurship & Innovation Action Item 6.2.1

Invite KIVA to partner with City government and local organizations to develop micro-lending to small businesses

- KIVA fellow has been working in Milwaukee since September to recruit trustees, build loan pipeline
- KIVA matching loan fund established
- 2015 City budget includes City financial support
- Fundraising goal achieved
- 6 trustees have signed on
- Formal launch in early 2015



#### Entrepreneurship & Innovation Action Item 6.2.3

Improve communication between City agencies and the intermediaries that provide service and technical assistance to local businesses

- Commercial Corridor team expanded by two positions
- City staff taking active role in Business Improvement District (BID) Council
- City staff participating in LISC Small Business and Entrepreneurship Affinity Group



#### Entrepreneurship & Innovation Action Item 6.3.1

Develop and host an annual "Entrepreneur Week" to showcase local talent and resources

- First Entrepreneur Week held Nov. 9 14, 2014
- 13 events sponsored by City and partners



Implement ReFresh Milwaukee plan to make Milwaukee a more sustainable city while improving quality of life for all residents

Progress made on 87% of target recommendations





Encourage and support grassroots organizations that engage in neighborhood improvements

 Strong Neighborhoods mapping application developed to assist community partners understand foreclosure in their

neighborhoods.

 Public Ally has joined DCD staff to expand Healthy
 Neighborhoods Initiative and Community Improvement
 Project grant activities



# Quality of Life & Place Action Item 7.3.1

Develop a menu of intervention strategies targeted to the different neighborhood categories identified by the Market Value Analysis

- City has applied for Technical Assistance Scholarship Program through the Center for Community Progress
- If successful, City would receive TA from CCP to develop neighborhood intervention strategies.
