File #011100 is a substitute ordinance relating to the Employe's Retirement System (ERS).

## **Background**

- 1. This substitute ordinance pertains to Mr. Vance Coleman. When Mr. Coleman left the City, on September 28, 1987, he elected a deferred retirement allowance commencing at age 60. At age 60 (May 22, 1990), Mr. Coleman began receiving a service retirement allowance of \$1,362.67 per month. While receiving his service retirement allowance, Mr. Coleman continued to serve on the Milwaukee Metropolitan Sewerage District Board (MMSD) until July 8, 1996.
- 2. On July 26, 2001, the City Attorney issued an opinion that under s. 36-11 of the Milwaukee Charter because he was on the MMSD Board, Mr. Coleman should not have been able to retire with a deferred service allowance. Rather, Mr. Coleman should have retired on a service retirement allowance when he left the MMSD Board on July 8, 1996 with his retirement allowance being computed on his total benefit to that date.
- 3. The City Attorney's opinion stated that because under s. 36-11 of the Milwaukee Charter Mr. Coleman was ineligible for service allowance until July 8, 1996, Mr. Coleman's record should be corrected. This correction would reduce Mr. Coleman's monthly allowance from \$1,401.75 per month to \$400 per month.
- 4. The ERS and Mr. Coleman were unaware that service on the MMSD Board prevented him from retiring.

## **Discussion**

The substitute ordinance permits Mr. Coleman to retire on a deferred retirement allowance, provided the right to receive credit for serving on the MMSD Board is waived. This allows Mr. Coleman to receive his monthly allowance allows without any reduction.

## Fiscal Impact

There is no fiscal impact on the City tax levy.
