File #020082 is a resolution relative to application, acceptance and funding for a State Historical Society of Wisconsin Certified Local Government Grant (East Village Neighborhood).

Background

- 1. The United States Department of the Interior created a grant program entitled "Certified Local Government (CLG) Grant", for the purpose of funding efforts for preparing neighborhoods to qualify for National Register Nomination for Designation.
- 2. Grant funds are distributed through the State Historical Society of Wisconsin to 40 CLG communities in the State of Wisconsin. The City of Milwaukee is CLG certified.
- 3. As a CLG, Milwaukee's Department of City Development is authorized to co-sponsor organizations wanting to apply for this grant on a "pass through" basis. As co-sponsor, the City of Milwaukee does not provide any up front project costs for this project, but reimburses the neighborhoods for billable, qualified expenditures.
- 4. In 2001, the City previously approved similar grants for restoration feasibility studies...

Discussion

- The Milwaukee's East Village Association, 1874 North Warren Avenue, is obligated to raise the money, screen and hire a consultant to prepare a National Register Nomination for Designation for the District.
- 2. Within the local East Village neighborhood, 286 structures appear eligible for National Register Nomination within the boundaries of Warren Avenue, Brady Street, Humboldt Avenue and the Milwaukee River.
- 3. If this file is adopted, the grant monies from the State Historical Society will be used to reimburse the District, up to \$8,075, consulting costs related to preparing a National Register Nomination for the East Village neighborhood.
- 4. Eligible reimbursables include research, photography, document preparation and printing costs associated with the nomination process.
- 5. The grant program operates from February 1, 2002 to July 31, 2003.
- 6. There will be no cost to the City since 100% of the grant (\$8,075) is provided by the grantor.
