File # 020108 is a resolution authorizing payment of the damages judgment entered, fees and costs awarded and appropriate interest in the lawsuit entitled *Marshal v. Teske, et. al.*, Case No. 98-C-306. This payment represents a court judgment.

Background

The plaintiff, Jeffrey O'Neal Marshall, was stopped and taken into custody by Milwaukee police officers on September 11, 1997 for drug-related charges. Mr. Marshall subsequently brought suit against the city alleging unlawful arrest, unlawful imprisonment and the use of excessive force.

Discussion

- 1. This case went to trial in January 2001. The unlawful imprisonment claim was dismissed prior to the case going to the jury. The jury returned a verdict in favor of the officers regarding the excessive force claim. The jury returned a verdict in favor of Mr. Marshall in regard to his claim of probable-cause-to arrest.
- 2. The jury awarded \$130,000 in damages including \$100,000 in punitive damages.
- 3. The court awarded Mr. Marshall \$86,375 in attorney's fees.
- 4. On March 27, 2002, the United States Court of Appeals for the Seventh Circuit affirmed the lower court ruling. The plaintiff is entitled to an additional \$30,000 in additional costs and attorney's fees.
- 5. The total claim amount in this resolution represents damages, court costs, attorney's fees and the appropriate amount of interest.

Fiscal Impact

- 1. The fiscal impact of this resolution is \$258,978.78, to be expended from the Damages and Claims Special Purpose Account.
- 2. As of May 3, 2002, the 2002 Damages and Claims Special Purpose Account had a balance of \$1,140,818.20.
- 3. Upon approval of this resolution and File # 020028 previously considered and approved, the 2002 Damages and Claims Special Purpose Account will have a balance of \$879,339.42.

Further Information

In January 2002, \$600,000 was expended from the 2002 Damages and Claims Special Purpose Account in partial settlement of the case regarding discrimination in the selection of firefighters.
