Dear Council Members:

We return the enclosed document which has been filed with the City Clerk and ask that it be introduced and referred to the Committee on Judiciary & Legislation with the following recommendation.

Claimant, Socrates Coats, 1974 West Fairmount Avenue, Milwaukee, WI 53209, alleges that on January 23, 2002 a leak in the City water service lateral at 1973 West Fairmount Avenue caused water to back-up in his home and crack the basement walls. He claims damages in the amount of \$8,000.00.

Our investigation reveals that the Milwaukee Water Works responded in a timely manner to a service leak at this address on January 23, 2002. The repair crew completed a shut-off of the water main after they arrived. At this point they were made aware of the flooding in the claimant's basement and hired a private contractor at City expense to pump out approximately one foot of water, service the furnace and replace the sump pump. The Milwaukee Water Works believes that the amount of water and length of time it was in the basement was not substantial enough to cause foundation damage.

They were not negligent regarding their response time, manner of repairs or taking corrective action. As such, the City would not be liable. Accordingly, we recommend that this claim be denied.
