Firms affiliated with the Allied Construction Employers Association or Eastern Wisconsin Erectors Association remit .35 cents per hour to Apprentice & Skill Improvement and .10 cents per hour to the Industry Advancement Program/Contract Administration Fund. IAP/CA remitted on all hours worked.
