Tradition of environmental and natural resources protection





- · Chronic fiscal disorder and no planning








### **Our Basic Policy Choice**








- · Your ideas?





### The Race Gap


- Wisconsin has the 5<sup>th</sup> best white child poverty rate in the nation. It's black child poverty rate is the 2<sup>nd</sup> worst.
- Wisconsin has the 2<sup>nd</sup> best high school graduation rate for whites in the country. It has the <u>worst</u> graduation rate for blacks.
- Wisconsin blacks are 23 times more likely than whites to be sent to prison for the same crime, the 2<sup>nd</sup> worst racial gap in sentencing in the United States. Blacks are also 52 times more likely to be imprisoned for drug crimes.
- Milwaukee is the 2<sup>nd</sup> most segregated city in America.


### Trouble in the Air and Water


- In 1999, there was more summer smog in Door County than Milwaukee County.







