In each issue area our materials build from the basic facts to talk formatively about the critical choices and challenges facing our state.

Sustaining Wisconsin is a project of COWS, the Center on Wisconsin Strategy, at UW-Madison. A classic example of the Wisconsin Idea, Sustaining Wisconsin is a meaningful University contribution to public life in Wisconsin.

The Issues

The five major issue areas are:

- **Jobs and the Economy**
- **Families and Communities**
- **The Future (kids, education and the state budget)**
- **Democracy and Civic Participation**
- **The Environment**

Within each we have identified several crucial issues around which to frame initial discussion about the future of Wisconsin. Policy interconnections are the focal point throughout.

The Goals

Sustaining Wisconsin will *initiate discussion* about issues given short shrift in the media, *inform voters* about our findings and offer common-sense solutions for their consideration, *recruit and train local leaders* around a common message and packaged materials, and *develop broad state-wide support* for a program that underscores our shared values and visions for the future of Wisconsin.

The Elements

Sustaining Wisconsin facilitates participation at whatever level of interest, time and ability citizens have to offer with materials that build from basic facts to suggested policy changes. Among the key features:

- **Slide Presentation:** We present the state of our state and show how seemingly unrelated issues connect to impact our daily lives.
- **Briefing Papers:** One-page summaries and 8-10 background papers lay out the choices and challenges we face and offer just some of the potential solutions.
- **Web Site:** www.sustainingwisconsin.org functions as a virtual headquarters, chock full of information and ideas, including searchable county and regional databases.
- **Databases:** Key social, demographic, political and economic indicators; State of our State bite-sized policy oriented facts; media; elected officials; all available on-line and through our regional reports.

Constant Updates. We'll profile local leaders, present stories from the road and provide a weekly commentary on who is taking the high road on public policy issues and who is traveling the low road.

Our **Organizer's toolbox** provides a set of essential tools for active citizens. Suggestions for effective letters to the editor, press releases, house parties and more are provided to help local leaders be more effective in talking about these issues.

State of the State database. In this searchable database we've catalogued more than 1000 bite-sized policy-oriented facts about Wisconsin and are adding more daily. Every page in the web site automatically presents a new fact in our "Did you know..." pop-up on the left side.

"**Your County, By the Numbers**" is a one-stop-shop for a wealth of county-level data. At the click of a mouse, citizens can access a political, economic and demographic snapshot of each of Wisconsin's 72 counties.

The "Media Database" page provides folks with a list of all the media in their area, including vital contact information for each, simply by clicking on their county. Another simple search returns contact information for more than 400 newspapers, radio and television outlets across Wisconsin.

Quick studies on everything from recycling to education funding to the state of working Wisconsin to the role of money in politics. Broken into five broad categories, staffers can access more than three dozen papers that describe the choices and challenges we face.

But it is also much more than an information resource. It serves to link people within their communities and Wisconsin statewide working for a sustainable future.

The Sustaining Wisconsin web site is our virtual campaign headquarters. It is filled with issue-based resources, county-specific demographic, economic and political data, and searchable databases linking people to the media, their elected officials and bite-sized facts about the state of our State.
