MANAMAN AND A SECOND

My name is Russell Lepak. I am a mechanic for the Milwaukee Fire Department in the repair garage. On September 13, 2002, I was asked by my supervisor to make repairs on Engine – 52 (E-52). Due to tight space between vehicles, as I set up my tools to work on E-52, I placed my open tool box on Ladder - 21 (L-21) which was parked directly across from E-52 in the repair shop. As I started to work on E-52, I discovered that I did not have all the parts necessary to complete the repair. I checked with my supervisor and was told to get the necessary parts from the local vendor.

While I was gone picking up parts, Dave, another mechanic at the repair shop, who had been working on L-21 drove it to another location. Although the policy of the Fire Department is to walk around a vehicle before moving it to check for items left on it, open compartments or cab doors, etc., Dave did not perform this inspection before moving L-21. As a result, he did not notice that my tools and toolbox were on the truck until he saw them fly off the truck and scatter all over the street on 1<sup>st</sup> and Florida. Seeing what had happened, he drove around the block to go back and retrieve the tools. By the time he got back around the block to pick up my tools, a man had already stopped and was picking them up for himself. The man left when Dave told him that they were his tools, and Dave proceeded to pick up all of the tools he could find. The following tools are missing, in addition to my toolbox, which is now unusable:
