Returned herewith is a document filed by Attorney Laurie Eggert for attorney's fees for representing Police Officers Christopher Shorts and Malcom McNeal. The claim is in the amount of \$809.68 including \$6.68 in disbursements for 7.30 hours of service billed at the rate of \$110.00 per hour. We ask that this matter be introduced and referred to the Committee on Judiciary & Legislation.

We have reviewed this claim and advise that in our opinion, the time spent was reasonable. Legal representation was occasioned by a criminal investigation. No criminal charges were brought against the Police Officers on whose behalf this claim was filed.

stated that BEAMON would have to be arrested. Officer SHORTS stated that BEAMON began resisting arrest and was decentralized to the ground then handcuffed. Officer SHORTS stated that BEAMON was conveyed to District Four where he was booked without physical incident. Officer SHORTS stated that BEAMON was not punched or kicked by officers and that no one slammed BEAMON'S face down onto the hood of a squad car.

Officer Adrian HARRIS was interviewed by Detective SYKES and advised that he observed no physical fight between officers and a prisoner during his tour of duty as booking officer on 02-19-00.

Officer John KLABECHEK was not interviewed during this investigation. He resigned from service with the Milwaukee Police Department on September 22, 2000.

## **CONCLUSION:**

Upon concluding this investigation, there is no evidence which supports the allegation of battery made by Jermaine BEAMON. No physical injuries were observed on BEAMON'S torso at the time of his interview with Detective SYKES and he admitted that he was intoxicated at the time of his police contact. There is no evidence which would establish probable cause against the officers involved subsequently, this investigation will be cleared as baseless/unfounded.
