SIR:

This report was dictated by Detective Michele HARRISON, assigned to the Criminal Investigation Unit/Internal Affairs Division (CIU/IAD), early shift.

ALLEGATION:

The complainant, Roger SIEGMAN, alleges that after Officer GEBHARDT, along with unknown officers, arrested him and placed him in handcuffs that Officer GEBHARDT began kneeing the complainant in his lower and upper back, upper and lower legs and the left side of his face. An officer stepped on the left side of his face leaving a footprint and also struck the left side of his face against his grandparent's house.

INVESTIGATION:

Investigation revealed in an interview with Det. Hattie NICHOLS, SIEGMAN stated he borrowed a Chevy Blazer from his neighbor, who lives across the alley by the name of John EMMANUELE (in actuality he stole the Blazer). He stated that he took the Blazer and while in the process of taking it P.O. GEBHARDT broke a window on the driver's side of the Blazer to stop him from taking it. He stated that the officer also caused him to hit a tree. He stated that he finally drove away and went to his

grandparent's home of 3246 N. Holton Street. Mr. SIEGMAN abandoned the Blazer and left it at I 43 and Keefe Avenue off ramp. He stated that the police later arrested him and "beat the hell out of me." He stated he walked to the rear door and observed the police outside. He stated that there were about 10 to 12 officers near the fence around his grandparent's home. When he exited the house from the rear door the police said, "Freeze, lay on the ground and put your hands above your head." Mr. SIEGMAN stated that he complied and the officers then began kneeing him in the lower and upper part of his back, the lower and upper legs and left side of his face. He stated an officer also stepped on the left side of face with a boot leaving a print. He stated that four of his lower teeth on the left side of his face were knocked out. Mr. SIEGMAN states that he can identify at least one of the officers and he knows one of the officers, namely P.O. Andrew GEBHARDT. He states Officer GEBHARDT struck the left side of his face against the side of his grandparent's home and he was then placed in the rear of a squad.

The officers took him to Mount Sinai where he was treated for his injuries. He stated that he suffered from retina damage and now has blurred vision in the left eye. He stated that four lower teeth on the left side were knocked out. Mr. SIEGMAN was arrested for Operating Auto without Owners Consent and Recklessly Endangering Safety.

P.O. GEBHARDT stated that he was working alone on the night of this incident and was sent to a theft or trouble with subject. He stated he had contact with Roger SIEGMAN a couple of days prior to this incident. He stated he was sent to the 600 block of S. 64th Street. Officer GEBHARDT stated that he never left the scene of the 600 block of S. 64th Street. He never did respond to 3246 N. Holton Street where Mr. SIEGMAN was arrested at his grandparent's home. P.O. GEBHARDT stated that he remained at the scene with Det. Mark CISKE because he was the victim in this incident. He stated upon his arrival at the scene he heard breaking glass and ran through the yards to the S. 63rd

Street address and observed SIEGMAN climbing through the passenger front window of a Blazer and started the car. He stated he ran to the car and SIEGMAN put the vehicle in drive and attempted to run him over. He stated that he ended of going through a couple of yards and he backed off and he hit a tree. He states that he ended up on Main Street and drove to Hawley Road where he did get on the freeway. He stated the caller who was SIEGMAN'S girlfriend or her mother called SIEGMAN'S grandmother and asked if SIEGMAN was there. The squads then responded over to the grandmother's house at 3246 N. Holton Street. P.O. GEBHARDT stated that he did not see SIEGMAN again until he was arrested and downtown.

CONCLUSION:

On Wednesday, October 4, 2000, this case was ordered in to the District Attorney's office where it was reviewed by Deputy District Attorney Jon REDDIN. In reviewing this case Deputy District Attorney REDDIN pended this case. The case was brought back into the District Attorney's office on Friday, March 2, 2001, where again it was reviewed by Deputy District Attorney Jon REDDIN. In reviewing this case, Deputy District Attorney REDDIN stated Milwaukee police officers arrested Roger SIEGMAN for Operating Auto without Owners Consent and Recklessly Endangering Safety. This offense occurred when the City of Milwaukee P.O. Andrew GEBHARDT heard and saw SIEGMAN breaking into a Chevy Blazer. P.O. GEBHARDT tried to stop him and nearly got ran over before SIEGMAN drove off in the stolen vehicle. After reviewing all the facts and circumstances involving this incident, Deputy District Attorney REDDIN stated that there was insufficient evidence to bring any charges against any police officers. SIEGMAN abandoned the stolen Blazer and sought refuge at the home of his grandparents who apparently threw him out when they discovered that the police were looking for him. He then fled the police on foot and had to be taken to the ground where he fought with police trying to kick them and generally resisting their efforts to place

handcuffs on him. During this encounter he apparently received some facial injuries for which he was treated. After examining the reports, in Deputy District Attorney REDDIN'S opinion excessive force was not used in view of SIEGMAN'S resistance to the officers. No other civilian witnessed the arrest. Mr. SIEGMAN'S credibility is lessened by the fact that he lied to the investigators about how he came into the possession of the car claiming to Det. Hattie NICHOLS that he had borrowed it. In fact he had stolen it and later abandoned it. He pled guilty to having done that and he is a convicted felon and is serving three years in prison. No charges will be brought against P.O. GEBHARDT for his roll in that arrest because he was not there and played no role in that arrest. It appears to Deputy District Attorney REDDIN that the amount of force use by officers in effecting SIEGMAN'S arrest was not excessive and no charges will be brought against them. This complaint is cleared as warrant refused.

Dear Chief Jones:

On February 19, 2000, City of Milwaukee Police officers arrested Roger Siegman for Operating Auto Without Owner's Consent and Recklessly Endangering Safety. The offenses occurred when City of Milwaukee Police Officer Andrew Gebhardt heard and saw Siegman breaking into a Chevy Blazer, tried to stop him and nearly got run over before Siegman drove off in the stolen vehicle.

You have presented officer Gebhardt to me for issuance of Battery charges, despite the fact that your investigation showed conclusively that he was nowhere near the scene of the arrest at which the battery allegedly occurred. Officer Gebhardt remained at the scene of the RES until interviewed by detectives. By that time the arrest had already taken place some distance away.

As to potential battery charges against any other officers, I find that there is insufficient evidence to bring them. Siegman abandoned the stolen Blazer and sought refuge at the home of his grandparents, who apparently threw him out when they discovered that the police were looking for him. He then fled the police on foot and had to be taken to the ground, where he fought with police, trying to kick them and generally resisting their efforts to place handcuffs on him. During this encounter he apparently received some facial injuries, for which he was treated. After examining the reports, it is my opinion that excessive force was not used in view of Siegman's resistance to the officers.

The officers describe a resisting Siegman. No other civilian witnessed the arrest. Siegman describes a severe beating, which I do not believe occurred. His credibility is lessened by the fact that he lied to investigators about how he came into possession of the car, claiming to Detective Hattie Nichols that he had "borrowed" it. In fact, he broke the window to gain entry, stole it, and later abandoned it. He pled guilty to having done that, he is a convicted felon and he is serving 3 years in prison. The Recklessly Endangering Safety charge, for having tried to run down officer Gebhardt, was read in for purposes of sentencing.

In short, it appears to me that the amount of force used by officers in effecting Siegman's arrest was not excessive, and no charges will be brought against them. No charges will be brought against Gebhardt for his role in that arrest, because he wasn't there and played no role in that arrest.
