




INJURY CLAIMS OVERALL

Slight 2.5% increase from 2012 to 2013

OSHA RECORDABLE CLAIMS


13% reduction in 2013



DWD INJURY CLAIM GUIDELINES

- Injury claims separated into three categories:
 - Indemnity Four or more LWD's w/medical treatment
 - Medical Up to three LWD's w/medical treatment
 - No Doctor No lost time or medical treatment
- Indemnity and medical claims account for 60% yearly claims
- Since 2010:
 - Indemnity claims decreased 21%
 - Medical claims increased 11%
 - No Doctor claims increased 6%




LOST WORK DAYS

43% reduction from 2012 to 2013

Fewer serious injuries in 2013 requiring significant time away from work

Decrease may be due to enhanced training: Equipment use, DAAT, Firearms Training, EVOC, wellness, ergonomics, etc.




TYPE OF DUTY

Most common duty – Field Duty – Patrol

Injuries caused during patrol duties make up 75% of all injury claims

18% increase in patrol injuries from 2012 to 2013



CALLS FOR SERVICE


Number of calls has fluctuated 2010-2013

Calls for service decreased by 5% (13,633 calls) from 2012 to 2013

ACTIVITY WHEN INJURED


Injuries occur most while controlling/ arresting subject


Increases in injuries caused during foot pursuits and field investigations



ARRESTS

The number of arrests from 2010 to 2013 has decreased





PRIMARY TITLE/RANK OF INJURED MEMBER

Most commonly injured rank is Police Officer

Law enforcement personnel make up 75% of MPD

3% increase in Police Officer injuries from 2012 to 2013


REPORTED VEHICLE ACCIDENTS


169 vehicle accidents in 2013

39 of the 2013 accidents resulted in 54 injury claims

- Places members with restrictions in administrative and support areas of the Department
- Assignments are distributed throughout various areas of the Department
- Main area of assignment is the Differential Police Response Unit

Limited duty personnel account for less than 7% of total personnel on any given day.





Indefinite program – no limit to the number of days a member may remain assigned to the program

GOALS AND OUTCOMES FOR 2013

SAFETY GOAL	OUTCOME
Provide specialized training for new supervisors on the injury reporting process.	New supervisors were instructed on the process to follow if a member is injured, and how to classify injuries.
Monitor and address vehicle accidents and injuries.	Accidents found to be a result of negligence resulted in counseling, remedial training, policy review and internal investigations.

2014 SAFETY GOALS

- Implement the use of the iVOS Program to capture and reconcile data between DER and MPD
- Provide training for all members on vehicle operations, firearms safety, ergonomics, and communicable diseases
- Provide training for new supervisors on the injury reporting process
- Develop and Implement Safety & Hazards Review Committee to review and analyze data
 - -Identify patterns and trends in claims
 - Identify and correct workplace hazards
 - Use data to develop training and implement procedures
