To the Citizen Advisory Committee:

In October, 1999, I had the privilege of getting to know Colonel Robert J. Modrzejewski, a 1968 recipient of the Medal of Honor for his heroic action in Vietnam. The occasion was Colonel Modrzejewski's return to his alma mater, Pulaski High School, where I was a teacher. He spoke to Pulaski's student body, inspiring them with his message of commitment to family, community, and country.

Colonel Modrzejewski grew up in a working-class family on Milwaukee's south side, just a block away from Cleveland Playground. He excelled in athletics in high school, playing on the football, basketball, and baseball teams at Pulaski. His skills in those sports, however, were developed and nurtured in his childhood neighborhood—at Cleveland Playground.

In his senior year, Colonel Modrzejewski told a writer for the school's newspaper, the Pulaski Cavalier, that his goal in life was to get a nice clean job, one where he could dress up and earn three dollars an hour. Before pursuing that dream, though, he entered the military, went to war, and earned the nation's highest award for bravery. When President Lyndon Johnson presented the Medal of Honor, he said that in Colonel Modrzejewski's face he could see "the certainty of freedom," and in his presence he could feel "the hope and the promise of peace."

Renaming Cleveland Playground in honor of Colonel Modrzejewski would be an appropriate tribute to a genuine American hero who grew up in the neighborhood and played in the park. I wish to lend my encouragement and support to those suggesting the renaming of the playground.
