Please be advised that the Roofers and their Contractors have reached an agreement providing for the following rates of wages and fringe benefits effective June 1. 2004 and fringe benefits as designated:

Roofer Foreman\$26.00 Roofer Journeyman
APPRENTICES The State of Wisconsin requires Apprentices to be paid during class time. Our Contractors have chosen the option of paying apprentices a 5% of journeyman wage add-on to their hourly wage instead. (This year it is \$1.22/hr.)
