Re: An Ordinance Relating to Establishing Fees for Annual Temporary Food Dealer's Licenses for Temporary Restaurants Operating at Farmers' Markets

The Common Council approved new fees and the current licensing structure for temporary restaurants during the spring of 2003. This proposal, if passed, would undo the current fee for temporary restaurants operating at farm markets only. The Health Department is concerned that this change lowers the fee for temporary restaurants at farm markets to a flat fee of \$100 while all other temporary restaurants at festivals and other venues will pay per each temporary event \$50 for the first day of operation and \$25 per day for any additional days of operation. This creates inequity in licensing by differentiating the license fee based on whether the temporary restaurant operates at a farm market or a festival. If only temporary restaurants at farm markets are affected there would be a reduction in revenue of \$1,375 based on year 2003 experience. However, if these changes were to be extended to all temporary restaurants there would be a \$76,139 reduction in revenue from licensure of this activity. If the number of vendors were to increase over the 2003 experience these numbers would obviously be higher.
