Attached please find copies of the June 16, June 17 and the June 21, 2004 letters from Lyle Balistreri of the Milwaukee Building and Construction Trades Council regarding changes in the hourly wage and fringe benefit rates for Carpenters/Floor Coverers, Piledrivers, Electricians, Painters and Truck Drivers which will be used to update the City's Prevailing Wage Schedule. Those classifications which have been lined out should not be adopted as these classifications either are not recognized by the State of Wisconsin, are not comparable to classifications received from the State of Wisconsin, have rates which are lower than those furnished by the State of Wisconsin, or are not applicable to municipal contracts.

It is recommended, therefore, that your Committee approve the applicable changes to the wage and fringe benefit rates as reflected in the attached letters, insofar as they pertain to the Prevailing Wage Resolution.


