Attached please find a copy of the July 2, 2004 letter from Lyle Balistreri of the Milwaukee Building and Construction Trades Council regarding changes in the hourly wage and fringe benefit rates for Bricklayers, Marble Masons, Operating Engineers and Plasterers which will be used to update the City's Prevailing Wage Schedule. Those classifications or pages which have been lined out should not be adopted as these classifications either are not recognized by the State of Wisconsin, are not comparable to classifications received from the State of Wisconsin, have rates which are lower than those furnished by the State of Wisconsin, or are not applicable to municipal contracts.

It is recommended, therefore, that your Committee approve the applicable changes to the wage and fringe benefit rates as reflected in the attached letters, insofar as they pertain to the Prevailing Wage Resolution.



NOTE (B): Tower crane boom lengths shall be measured from the ground to the point of intersection with the boom and from the point of intersection to the tip of the boom to compute the total length. In the case of crawler or mobile cranes, where the tower crane attachment is mounted, the long boom provisions of this Agreement shall be computed from boom pins on the rotation base to point sheaves.
