IN MEMORIAM



DR. JAMES WHITE

James G. White, WestCare Wisconsin founder, executive director of the Harambee Ombudsman Project and a former Milwaukee County supervisor, passed away on August 28, 2013, the 50th anniversary of the historic March on Washington. His lifelong works include activism in the areas of fair housing, social justice, economic

development and equal opportunity for the financially and socially disadvantaged.

He served on the Milwaukee County Board from 1996 to 2008. He served as chairman of the board's transportation committee and was first vice chairman of the board. He survived a recall election in 2003 that was launched in the aftermath of the county pension scandal.

He lost his County Board re-election bid in 2008. Later in 2008, White began a stint in Washington, D.C., as associate director of an addiction research program at George Washington University.

White then returned to Milwaukee, where he was instrumental in reviving the Harambee Community's mission and vision. He assembled a talented and dedicated team to revive and uplift the grassroots Harambee before joining WestCare Wisconsin as its Regional Vice President. With the support of the City of Milwaukee, WestCare Wisconsin launched the Harambee Community Center (HCC). Through this unique partnership, WestCare Wisconsin serves as the lead Neighborhood Strategic Planning organization for the Historic Harambee Community and they currently administer housing rehabilitation and community organizing programs in the Harambee Community.

The Reverend Doctor James G. White, was quiet and gentle, respected, dignified, inspirational and revered by many.

Wisconsin Congresswoman Gwen Moore remembers the Reverend Doctor White as a tireless advocate for civil rights, youth and the poor. Milwaukee has lost a great man who consistently supported our underserved communities. A powerful voice for the voiceless, he provided support to those suffering from health related issues.

Milwaukee Alderman Milele Coggs noted that White was a hip hop recording artist in the 90's and performed at a recent Juneteenth celebration. She further remarks that Dr. James White has done some extraordinary things with community based organization with very little fanfare for himself.

In addition to his work in Milwaukee, Dr. James White served and his team continues to serve as the consultant agency providing leadership in the coordination of business activities for the St. Paul Community and Economic Development Corporation / Faith Builds Community Board of Directors for the 61 Riverside Drive Project, which is new construction of a single-family home in Racine, WI. SPCEDC Faith Builds Community is a faith based

organization that consists of a network of churches that have formed a partnership to provide leadership and guidance on Faith-Builds Community development projects in Racine County. The goal of SPCEDC-Faith Builds Community collaborative effort is to provide affordable housing and homeownership opportunities to low and moderate income families in their congregations and surrounding neighborhoods, as well as provide wrap around services. Dr. White's help was specifically requested to work on this housing project for his proven ability to deliver on his word. Mr. Brian O'Connell, Director of the Department of City Development for the City of Racine, stated at the May 16, 2013 meeting of the Faith Builds Community Board of Directors that the Riverside Drive house is indeed one of the best houses built under the City's program that he has ever seen.
