 - **–** \$6,725,000 Request



Fleet

• Maintains fleet age of 12 year average

Projects 38 vehicles, includes3 automated packers





Tree Planting & Production

- \$1,895,000 Request
- Replaces 6,179 trees
 - 4,763 street trees lost to mortality
 - 610 trees impacted by paving/sidewalk projects
 - 806 replacement trees not funded in 2015
 - Maintains 98% stocking goal





Emerald Ash Borer Readiness and Response

- \$1,000,000 Request
- Treats 13,500 8" diameter and larger ash street trees annually
- Treats additional 1,200
 -1,400 untreated trees
 <= 8" dia.



• Provides excellent control for 2 years

Concealed Irrigation & General Landscaping for Boulevards

- \$250,000 Request
- Maintains Boulevard
 Irrigation Infrastructure









Hazardous Tree Removal

- \$75,000 Request
- Payments can now be spread over 6 years on tax roll
- This pays for contractors in current year



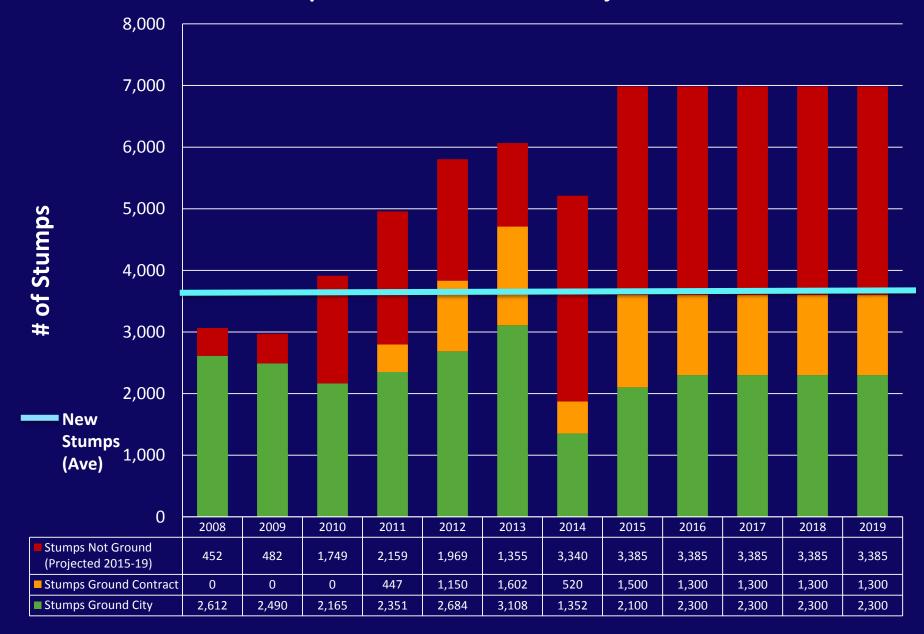
Contract Stump Removal

• \$360,000 Request

- Addresses <u>annual</u> gap of 1,300 stumps
- 2015 Projected year—end backlog of 3,385 stumps
- On-going request

Vacant Lot Beautification

• \$200,000 Request

Improves 40-80 city vacant lots

Average cost \$2,500-\$5,000

ROI – Potential Salt Savings

- 2015 salt price is \$62/ton
- Average salting operation uses 1,200 tons
- 10% savings 120 tons (\$7,440)
- Savings for 40 salting events (\$ 297,600)
