The Milwaukee Police Department's investigation regarding this application revealed the following:

- 1. On 06/06/2014 Milwaukee police received a complaint from Alderman Jose Perez's office regarding loud music and trouble with the patrons at 1663 South 11st Street (Club 69). On 08/02/201, officers contacted the applicant to discuss these issues and explain that if the complaints continue additional police action could be taken.
- 2. On 12/05/2014 Milwaukee police conducted a licensed premise check at 1663 South 11th Street (Club 69). No violations were observed.
- 3. On 03/21/2015 at 3:01am officers were dispatched to 1663 S. 11th St, Club 69 Bar, for an afterhours complaint. Upon arrival officers observed two people crouching down inside the bar. The door was locked and no one opened the door when the officers knocked. The officers could hear voices inside but it took several minutes before the applicant opened the door. Upon entry the officers observed about 15 people inside. When asked why the people were in the bar after closing the applicant stated he was planning a party with his friends. No other violations were found.

On Saturday, 3-21-15 at approximately 3:01am Squad 2341 (PO Erik ANDRADE and PO Christapher GREER) was dispatched to 1663 S 11th St (Club 69 Bar) for an after hours complaint. Upon arriving on scene, PO ANDRADE used his squad vehicle spot light to illuminate the establishment because all the lights were turned off. Upon shining the light toward the establishment, PO ANDRADE observed two individuals concealing themselves from the light by lowering themselves to the ground.

After observing the two individuals, PO ANDRADE and PO GREER approached the front entrance door of the establishment. PO ANDRADE and PO GREER pulled on the front door to gain entry but were not able to because the door was locked. PO ANDRADE and PO GREER then knocked on the door and announced the police were at the door. PO ANDRADE stated while waiting for someone to open the door, he heard individuals talking inside. PO ANDRADE stated that no one aknowledge or complied with his lawful orders to open the door.

After waiting a few minutes, PO ANDRADE stated someone came to the door and unlocked it. The individual who unlocked and opened the door was later identified as the licensee/owner, Manuel ESCOBAR (W/M 5-7-69). Upon entering the establishment, PO ANDRADE and PO GREER observed approximately 15 males and females inside the establishment.

PO ANDRADE asked ESCOBAR why all these people were still inside the establishment after closing hours and ESCOBAR stated he and his friends were planning a party. PO ANDRADE informed ESCOBAR that he could not have individuals inside the establishment after closing hours or refuse entry to police who were attempting to conduct an investigation.

While conducting the license premise check, PO ANDRADE did not observe any other visible violations and ESCOBAR was cooperative. PO ANDRADE informed ESCOBAR that he would be receiving citations for the violations he did observe.

This report is written by P.O. Guadalupe VELASQUEZ, assigned to District 2, Early Shift, Community Prosecution Unit.

On June 6th, 2014, the District 2, Community Prosecution Unit, received an aldermanic complaint from the Office of Alderman Jose PEREZ. The complaint stated that Club 69, located at 1663 S. 11th St. has loud music and the patrons who come out to smoke are also very loud and obnoxious. The complaint also stated that the same patrons urinate and break bottles outside of the bar.

After several attempts, Squad 2268 (P.O. VELASQUEZ/ P.O. VODICKA), made contact with the licensee on August 2nd, 2014. The licensee, Manuel Escobar, stated he was not aware of these problems because the police had only come to his bar on one occasion. Escobar also stated that he has security on the weekends and that they have never had problems with the patrons. I did advise Escobar that there had been several calls for service, mostly complaining about loud music and loud patrons and I explained if the complaints continued and were verified he could become a nuisance property.

I advised Escobar to monitor his sound levels and suggested he cross the street to check if the music was too loud. I also told him to check on his patrons when they were outside of the bar. Escobar stated he would address the problem but also stated that the previous licensee told him he had problems with one of the tenants of the apartment building and he believed that was the same person calling about him.

Dear Alderman Pérez,

I'm writing to you at 1:30am, unable to sleep once again because of a bar across the street from my apartment building. I live at

) and the bar is called Club 69 (1663 S. 11th

St). I call the MPD non-emergency line several times per week and have done so for weeks if not months. Nothing has improved and I have seen no results.

Every night, the bar plays extremely load masic. Even with their door closed, and with my apartment being close to seven stories up (I'm on the 4th floor but we have 20 ft. ceilings), the masic is clearly audible in my bedroom, which I share with my wife and infant son. When the door opens, which is frequently, a huge burst of volume reaches us. Smokers constantly enter and exit the lan. They are load, drank, and obnoxious when out on the sidewalk.

On top of that, people have been assaulted in front of the bar. Men frequently exit the bar to prinate in the alley. Glass bottles are broken. When bar time arrives, it's chaos on 11th Street for a good 20-30 minutes. Every night.

Alderman Pérez, I have no problem with people having a good time. I have no problem with bars. That said, 11th Street between Mitchell and Lapham is a residential block. Apart from Lopez Bakery on the corner of 11th and Mitchell, and Reyna's Salon on 11th and Lapham, there is no other commercial property apart from Club 69. There is simply no reason for this particular bar to exist in our neighborhood.

When looking for your email address, I saw your citizen complaint log. I wish I had looked months ago. Either way, I will being dutifully filling it out. Thanks very much for your time and please help me and my neighbors. I look forward to hearing from you and discussing the issue in further detail.

Important details for those wishing to provide information for the Licenses Committee to consider when making its recommendation:

- 1. The license application is scheduled to be heard at the above time. Due to other hearings running longer than scheduled, you may have to wait some time to provide your testimony.
- 2. You must appear in person and testify as to matters that you have personally experienced or seen. (You cannot provide testimony for your neighbor, parent or anyone else; this is considered hearsay and cannot be considered by the committee.)
- 3. No letters or petitions can be accepted by the committee (unless the person who wrote the letter or the persons who signed the petition are present at the committee hearing and willing to testify).
- 4. Persons opposed to the license application are given the opportunity to testify first; supporters may testify after the opponents have finished.
- 5. When you are called to testify, you will be sworn in and asked to give your name, and address. (If your first and/or last names are uncommon please spell them.)

- 6. You may then provide testimony.
- a. Include only information relating to the above license application.
- b. Include only information you have personally witnessed or seen.
- c. Provide concise and relevant information detailing how this business has affected or may affect the peaceful enjoyment of your neighborhood.
- d. If by the time you have the opportunity to testify, the information you wish to share has already been provided to the committee, you may state that you agree with the previous testimony. Redundant or repetitive testimony will not assist the committee in making its recommendation.
- 7. After giving your testimony, the members of the Licenses Committee and the licensee may ask questions regarding the testimony you have given or other factors relating to the license application.
- 8. Business Competition is not a valid basis for denial or non-renewal of a license.

Please Note: If you have submitted an objection to the above application your objection cannot be considered by the committee unless you personally testify at the hearing.

This report is written by PO Timothy J. Zielinski, assigned to Sqd 2440, District Two, late power shift. On Sunday, 04/20/14, at 1:32am, my partner, PO Francisco CARTAGENA, and I, were dispatched to a Noise Nuisance complaint at 200 E. Washington St, which is the location of the Studio 200 tavern.

Upon arrival, at 1:36am, we overhead loud music emanating from the rear of the Studio 200 tavern, which is located on the northeast corner of S. Barclay and E. Washington St. The loud music was accompanied by a live male DJ, whose voice could be heard at various intervals. It also sounded as if all the sound actually came from outside, from the rear courtyard of the business located at the north end of the building.

Prior to making contact in the tavern, we parked the squad car in the east-west alley connecting S. Barclay St to S. 1st St. I then proceeded to conduct an assessment of the total distance from which the music/DJ could be heard from. By walking and estimating the pace of my footsteps, I began at the west wall of the tavern property and walked westbound through an alley, toward S. 1st St, which was a full block west of S. Barclay St. I then proceeded to cross 1St St and walk though the parking lot at the BP Gas Station/Subway Restaurant located at 1009 S. 1st St, still hearing the music play.

I stopped directly in front of the east door of the building, which was the entrance for the Subway Restaurant, and could still hear the sound of the bass of the music and the DJ at Studio 200. At this time, I documented the distance that I had estimated, and found it to be about 620 ft. Upon returning back to the squad car, I debriefed by partner, PO Cartagena, about the results. During this whole entire process, the loud music was still emanating from the Studio 200 Tavern. At about 1:52am, the music came to a sudden halt.

At this time, we made contact with the tavern manager, Sharon A. DIXON, w/f 01/26/51, who lives directly above the tavern at 200 E. Washington St, #1. DIXON stated that she had hired a DJ from Chicago named HARVARD BASS for the evening performance. I informed DIXON that the music had been way too loud, causing a disturbance, and that there would most likely be a citation issued in the future. The citation was pended until it was issued at a future date.

This report is written by P.O. Kevin VODICKA, assigned to District Two Early Shift Community Prosecution Unit. On Wednesday, December 31, 2014, at or about 2:30 PM, Squad 2268 (P.O. Guadalupe VELASQUEZ and I) was conducting follow-up/surveillance at the address of 1100 S. Barclay St. regarding an "underground dance party", Pandemonium 2 - NYE Party, which was set to be held at the location. The premises did not hold an "assembly hall" occupancy nor was it licensed as a tavern or a P.E.P. Intelligence gather by the department indicated a tavern across the street from the location, Studio 200, would act as a licensed bar in conjunction with the event.

Officers spoke with a Joseph CARROL (M/W 9/14/73), who had been identified as one of the promoters of the event. CARROL stated that due to the police awareness of the event, it was being moved to a licensed venue outside of the City and County of Milwaukee, WI. CARROL also stated that the twenty-one and over portion of the event would still be held at Studio 200.

Officers were then approached by a known female subject, Sharon DIXON (F/W 01/26/51), who identified herself as the manager for Studio 200. DIXON freely volunteered that she had been aware of the Pandemonium2 party, had been inside of the building at 1100 S. Barclay St, had been in control of access to 1100 S. Barclay St. by promoters by acting as a key holder, stated Studio 200 was not profiting from the event, but stated that prior to the change of venue, attendees of Pandemonium2 who were over the age of twenty-one would be issued a wristband that would allow them entrance to Studio 200 to view performances.

District Two officers conducted two tavern checks on the night of December 31, 2014 and the early morning of January 1, 2015, in which no license violations were observed.

I oppose any operation by the currant owner & licensee due to their total disregard for the laws of noise restrictions. I live in a neighborhood full of various entertainment venues. It is alive with people and events. Harley parades go past our home. Summer Fest traffic comes to a standstill some nights. But NOTHING approaches the decibels and bass coming from this address. The police, neighborhood services, and our alderman have been involved in trying to control how far their noise carries. 

5. On 05/26/07 at 9:55 am, Milwaukee police were dispatched to 2689 S 13th Street for a Fight Complaint. Investigation found two patrons were involved in a physical altercation. One patron was thrown out of the tavern before police arrived. The 2nd suspect in the fight was cited for Disorderly Conduct. The licensee was not on the scene.

- 6. On 06/28/07 at 7:21 pm, Milwaukee police were dispatched to 2689 S 13th Street for a Fight Complaint. Officers spoke to the victim who stated he was punched and that the battery was unprovoked by another patron. The victim stated the suspect then fled the tavern. Officers spoke to the bartender, Terrie Randall, who stated that the victim was verbally abusing customers including herself and that the victim was asked to leave several times. The victim refused and continued to use profanity until another patron escorted him out of the tavern. Randall states that there was a struggle between the two as they were exiting the tavern. A wanted check was conduct on the victim and he was found to have warrants for his arrest. The subject then became combative and he issued two citations for Disorderly Conduct and Resisting An Officer.
- 7. On 10/14/2008 at 12:36am Milwaukee Police were dispatched to a shots fired complaint at 2689 S. 13th Street (Great Escape tavern). Investigation revealed that three subjects were arguing inside the bar and were asked to leave. Shortly after the three left the bar, witness's report hearing a knock outside of a window on the south side of the bar. 13. On 05/17/2014 at 1:53am conducted a tavern check at The Great Escape, 2689 S 13th St. When the officers entered the tavern they smelled cigarette smoke and observed an empty soda can with ashes. They asked the bartender Andrea MORRIS if she was allowing smoking in the tavern. She stated she was busy serving drinks and did not see anyone smoking. The officers did not observe who had been smoking.

- 14. On 09/27/2014 at 1:30am officers heard gun shots in the area of S. 13th St and W. Cleveland Av. The investigation revealed a b/m, was standing in the parking lot of Dan and Nancy's Great Escape at 2689 S 13th St when he pulled a gun from his waistband and began shooting at a silver car which was traveling on S 13th St. The male then got into a car with two females that had just been inside the bar. Casings were located on the parking lot. Officer spoke with Donna BURKE who was bartending at the time. She stated she did not see what happened outside and did not see what had transpired inside prior to that. The cameras system was not functioning.

On 12/28/2014 at 10:57pm officers conducted a license premises check at Dan and Nancy's Great Escape, 2689 S 13th St. The officers were checking for compliance on improvements the owner stated she was making. They found the exterior lighting improved, the back door locked from the outside, no loitering signs and no weapons signs. Inside they found a security guard and a functioning camera system with a monitor for the staff to observe the outside. There were no violations observed.
- 16. On 02/13/2015 at 11:00am a meeting was held at District 2 regarding Dan & Nancy's Great Escape. Present was the manager, Donna BURKE and the building owner Dale TROSTOFF. BURKE stated that she is applying for a new license to take over the business and rename it Donna's Tappers. BURKE stated that she has been the manager for 3 years. She stated the owner, Nancy HOLMES, does not ever come to the bar and does not let BURKE make any decisions related to the business. BURKE only comes to the bar herself at closing time because she does not trust the bartenders to close properly. The bartenders call BURKE when there are problems before calling the Police because BURKE would rather handle the problem. BURKE stated the tavern is located in a gang neighborhood and often has gang members at the bar. She went on to state that the gang members have never caused a problem. BURKE was advised that selling single cigarettes was illegal. BURKE stated that if she received a new license she would employ the same bartenders but change the whole bar.

NARRATIVE SECTION: This report is written by P.O. Ruben CORDOVA assigned to District 2/late power shift. On Sunday April 20, 2014 at 2:27 am, I along with my partner P.O. Lisa PURCELLI (sqd 2451) responded as a back-up unit for Sq 2411, Sgt Bradley SCHLEI and Sq 2441, P.O. Keith MILLER and P.O. Eligio CAVAZOS, on a "subject with gun" complaint at 2689 S 13th St "The Great Escape" class B tavern. Officers received numerous calls regarding a large group of people physically fighting and damaging property inside the business. Another caller also mentioned that an unknown male was armed with a gun.

I spoke to Andrea MORRIS (b/f 9/13/83), who was working as the bartender. MORRIS stated that two different groups of individuals, who were in the bar at the time and which apparently belong to separate street gangs, began to argue. The argument quickly escalated to a physical fight between the two groups. MORRIS stated that fight continued outside the premise, and individuals outside, began to break out the southeast window to the establishment.

The Great Escape has had numerous calls for service and continues to operate as a Disorderly premise in the area, with a number of 911 abandoned calls, fights as well as subjects with weapons complaints.

Based on their current history and ongoing dilemmas, the current listed licensee, Nancy J HOLMES (w/f 8/10/65) was issued a citation for Disorderly Premise Prohibited.

Notification of this incident as well as of the citation was made via voicemail message.

The citation mentioned was mailed to HOLMES current and listed D.O.T address.

I then checked the tavern's licenses, which appeared to be current and expire on June 18th, 2014. Other then the possible action of smoking within the tavern, I did not observed any other tavern violations at this time. The licensee, Donna S. BURKE (BMGR-0196534), was not on scene when the tavern check was conducted.

This report is written by P.O Francisco J CARTAGENA, assigned to district 2, on the late power shift.

On SAT, 9-27-14, at 1:30am, while on squad 2440 with P.O Timothy ZIELINSKI, Squad 2450 (WARD/MARTINEZ) heard a series of gunshots coming from the area of S 13th St and W Cleveland Av, Squad 2450 broadcasted over Milwaukee Police Radio about the gunshots. Squad 2450 approached the area and once again broadcasted over Police radio a silver Kia traveling northbound at a high rate of speed possibly involved in the incident. Squad 2450 suddenly came over Police radio in pursuit of a black male subject who was also possibly involved in the incident. Squad 2450 was able to locate apprehend the subject after a brief foot pursuit. The Silver Kia was never located.

Squad 2450 P.O WARD was able to locate and speak to one of the patrons who was at Dan's and Nancy's Great Escape, Bennie F TYUS, B/M, 12-11-55. TYUS stated to P.O WARD he was standing outside Dan's and Nancy's Great Escape in the parking lot when he observed a B/M, 20-25yo, 5'8"- 5'-10", 150-170lbs, dark skin, wearing a dark hooded sweatshirt with the hood up. TYUS stated to P.O WARD he observed the B/M subject pulled a handgun from his waistband and began shooting at a silver vehicle, while standing on the parking lot of Dan's and Nancy's Great Escape, which was traveling northbound on 13th St. TYUS stated to P.O WARD he observed two females and the B/M subject get into a black Chrysler vehicle then headed westbound on W Cleveland Av after the shots were fired. TYUS stated to P.O WARD he had observed the females in the tavern prior to the incident.

Squad 2479 (P.O JUSTUS) also responded to the call, and proceeded to the intersection of S 13th St and W Cleveland, to locate a scene. P.O JUSTUS located 3 .40 cal spent casings in the parking lot of 2689 S 13th St (Dan's and Nancy's Great Escape). Further investigation also revealed one of the fired rounds had hit the front wall, just below the front glass window, of the tavern (2890 S 18th St called 13th St Saloon) located directly across the street from Dan's and Nancy's Great Escape. The round penetrated the through the wall and into a recently purchased Coca Cola cooler used to keep alcoholic beverages cold. Forensic Investigator Squad 1922 Michael J WINKER, who took photographs of the scene and the damages done. The incident is under CAD # 14-270-0209.

I spoke to the manager/bartender of Dan's and Nancy's Great Escape, Donna S BURKE, W/F, 1-31-63, who stated to me she was bartending at the time of the incident but did not see what transpired before the shots were fired. BURKE stated she did not know who was involved in the incident. BURKE stated she told everyone who was inside the tavern not to go outside when the shots were the shots were fired. Upon asking for permits and licenses BURKE was cooperative. I did observed surveillance cameras in and outside the tavern but BURKE indicated the cameras were not working. I ask BURKE if anyone came into the tavern after the shots were fired and she stated no one came into the tavern after the shots were fired.

I also spoke to the owner of the 13th St Saloon Terrie M RANDALL, W/F, 5-17-61, who indicated at the time of the incident she was attending to her patrons at her tavern when she observed a group of people standing across the street in what she thought was an argument. RANDALL stated then heard a series of gunshots and she along with her patrons laid on the floor to take cover. RANDALL stated she did not see anyone actively shooting. RANDALL indicated there are often problems emanating from the tavern across the street (Dan's and Nancy's Great Escape).

On Sunday, December 28, 2014, at approximately 10:57PM, Squad 2479 (P.O. MARTINEZ/P.O. CARTAGENA/P.O. WARD) conducted a License Premise Check at 2689 S 13th St, Milwaukee, WI, 53215 (Dan & Nancy's Great Escape). The primary focus of this check was to see if the proposed improvements stated by Nancy Holmes in a meeting with P.O. VODICKA on September 28th, 2014 were implemented or not.

Upon arrival, I (P.O. MARTINEZ) did observed the exterior of the establishment to have improved illumination near the front door and parking lot as in comparison to pervious checks. I also observed several posted signs for no loitering and no weapons on the property. There were also visible surveillance cameras on the exterior monitoring several areas of the property (ie: front door, sidewalk, parking lot, etc.) I then checked the rear exit door of the tavern, located beneath the overhang patio area, and confirmed that the door was locked from the exterior and can only be used as an exit.

Upon entering the tavern, I spoke with the bartender, Carol D BROUGHTON (B/F 12-10-82) and informed her that we were conducting a license check and had her provide us with the tavern's licenses for inspection, which were all up to date and current. There were only 4 patrons within the bar and the hired security guard, Randall BROUGHTON. I asked if the bartender, Carol, if they had any ID check system in place, which she stated no that they did not have it yet. I did observed a live feed television linked to the surveillance cameras which allowed the employees to monitor activity outside the tavern and parking lot area. I did not view any prominent signs stating a limit on age upon entering the tavern.

During the remainder of the tavern check, Officers did not observed any violations and the staff was cooperative with police.

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This report is written by PO Matthew DIENER, assigned to District 2, early shift, Community Prosecution Unit, squad 2266.

On Friday, February 13, 2015, at 11:00am, a meeting was conducted at District 2, located at 245 W Lincoln Av, with the manager and building owner of "Dan & Nancy's Great Escape" tavern, located at 2689 S 13th St. The manager, Donna S BURKE (w/f, 1-31-63), was present with the building owner, Dale T TROSTOFF (w/m, 4-28-53). Ms. BURKE stated that she is applying for a new liquor license to be the owner/operator of Dan & Nancy's Great Escape, which will re-named "Donna's Tappers" if she is granted the license. Ms. BURKE currently has both a Class B Manager's License and Class D Operator's License, which are both valid. Also present during the meeting was Assistant City Attorney Nick DESIATO, Assistant District Attorney Ann LOPEZ, Lt John KALTENBRUN, Sgt Marissa GUTMANN, 12th District Alderman Jose PEREZ, and PO Efrain CORNEJO.

Ms. BURKE stated that she has been working at the tavern as the manger for approximately 3+ years. Ms. BURKE stated that the current owner, Nancy J HOLMES (w/f, 8-10-65), is basically an absentee owner/operator and barely comes to the tavern to check on it, but doesn't allow Ms. BURKE to run the bar her way and that Ms. HOLMES refuses to let Ms. BURKE make any decisions on managing the tavern. Ms. BURKE then stated that even though she is the manager, she only comes to the bar at closing because she doesn't trust her bartenders to close the bar properly. Ms. BURKE then also stated that whenever incidents would occur at the tavern, her bartender present would call Ms. BURKE instead of notifying police, and Ms. BURKE would rather handle the problem than resort to calling the police.

Mr. TROSTROFF stated that he would be helping Ms. BURKE with the tavern; however, he also stated that he would be moving back home to the "Cayman's". Ms. BURKE also stated that her tavern is located in a gang neighborhood, and that, "A lot of these gang members hang out at her bar like the Latin Kings, MP-13's, and Crips. I have a lot of respect for these gang members; they never give me any problems. No one is going to come off the street into the bar because they know these gang members are there, and when there ever was a problem it didn't involve the gang members". ACA DESIATO questioned Ms. BURKE about previous complaints of the bartenders selling single cigarettes from the tavern. Ms. BURKE stated that, "Oh yeah, I'm sure they do, I do too! Is that a problem? Is that illegal or something!?" DESIATO then informed Ms. BURKE that selling single loose cigarettes in fact a crime. Ms. BURKE stated that if she were the owner she would still employ the same bartenders, but that she would, "Change the whole bar so it's much better."

PLAN OF OPERATION

SECURITY AND CAMERA'S

1 Security at front door nightly from 8pm-close. Security will also police the parking lot throughout the night. There will be 5 or 6 exterior day/night camera's placed and existing in parking lot entrance and front door. Also inside of the bar will have at least 6 camera's both placed and existing. Both bartender and security will have visual access to all camera's inside and out. Security will also have access to a metal detection wand, along with a hand held ID scanner, which is also computer friendly.

All customers between the hours of open to close will be scanned with no exceptions, and all customer information will be saved on computer daily. Dress code will be strongly enforced, which includes no baggy pants, no wife beaters, no tilted or backwards hats, no pants that hang down their butt.

OUTSIDE LIGHTING

Approximately 10 flood light around outside of parking lot canopy will be illuminated from dust to dawn. Further more two high intensity exterior security lights will be mounted to the top wall of the second floor apt.

OUTSIDE SIGNAGE AND TRASH

Signs will be placed around the parking lot. The signs will state: NO OVER NIGHT PARKING, CUSTOMER PARKING ONLY, ALSO YOU ARE UNDER SUVEILLANCE.

A garbage container will be placed by side door. All trash will be picked up through out the night and at the end of the night.

INSIDE SIGNAGE

SMOKING

Smoking will be allowed outside the side door under canopy, Any person going outside for a cigarette will have to reenter through the front door and be searched again. (no exceptions).


MUSIC

1 Security at front door nightly from 8pm-close. Security will also police the parking lot throughout the night. There will be 5 or 6 exterior day/night camera's placed and existing in parking lot entrance and front door. Also inside of the bar will have at least 6 camera's both placed and existing. Both bartender and security will have visual access to all camera's inside and out. Smoking will be allowed outside the side door under canopy, Any person going outside for a cigarette will have to reenter through the front door and be searched again. (no exceptions).

I am planning to have a internet juke box in with all and any offensive music blocked. I plan to only play country, blues, rock est (no hip hop, no rap, no offensive music)

NOTE: In the event of unruly customers, we would close down the bar to avoid any problems that might a cure. If we are not able to calm the situation, police would be called and showed the ID scanner, which holds all the information.






AGREEMENT RELATING TO STORAGE OF FOOD IN A PRIVATE RESIDENCE

Food storage by a vending machine owner or distributor in a private residence is limited as follows.

NOTE: No other food dealers may store food in a private residence.

- 1. Prior to issuance of a license, the storage area must be inspected and in compliance with the following:
 - A. Food storage in the home must be limited to commercially packaged, non-potentially hazardous snack foods such as gums candies, and chips.
 - B. All food must be stored in its original container. There can be no storage of unwrapped bulk food products or removal of product from its original package for repackaging of any kind.
 - C. No food can be stored in any room used as living or sleeping quarters. Food storage must be in a separate room, used exclusively for food storage. No other non-food items can be stored in this room. The room must also be equipped with a tight-fitting, self-closing door. No pets are to be kept or allowed in the food storage area.
 - D. No food can be stored in a garage or other buildings outside the dwelling unit.
 - E. Foods must be stored off the floor and away from the wall in rodent/insect proof containers (i.e., plastic or metal containers with tight-fitting lids).
 - F. There shall be no sales made in or around the dwelling unit.
 - G. This approval is only applicable to vending machine owners, peddlers, and distributors without retail operations or warehouses, and storage is limited to what can be sold in a week's time.
 - H. Operator must agree to unannounced annual inspection of the storage area by the Milwaukee Health Department as a condition of licensing. Violation of any of the above requirements is grounds for denial or revocation of a license.
 - I. Operator must have a Statement of Home Occupation on file with the Department of Building Inspection.
 - J. Vehicles used in transporting foods are also subject to inspection and approval by the Health Department.
 - K. No food can be stored in an attic unless the attic is properly finished and ventilated.
