2	CHAIRMAN WITKOWIAK: Jim Milner, Home
3	Improvement Contractor application at New View
4	Vinyl Windows at 3915 West Layton Avenue in
5	Greenfield. Good afternoon.
6	THE APPLICANT: Good afternoon.
7	CHAIRMAN WITKOWIAK: Would you raise
8	your right hand? We'll swear you in, please?
9	(Whereupon the applicant was sworn.)
10	THE APPLICANT: I do.
11	CHAIRMAN WITKOWIAK: Name and address
12	for the record, please.
13	THE APPLICANT: Jim Milner, 3915 West
14	Layton Avenue, Greenfield, Wisconsin 53221.
15	CHAIRMAN WITKOWIAK: And, Mr. Milner,
16	do you admit to receiving notice in the mail
17	there's a possibility your application could be
18	denied because of items contained on the police
19	report and neighborhood objections to possible
20	violation of required and prohibited practices as
21	set forth in Chapter 95-14 of the Milwaukee Code
22	of Ordinances and $95-14-7(c)(1)(f)$ which states,
23	"Whether the application has been issued a
24	warning letter or had imposition of
25	administrative sanctions by the Wisconsin

00003 1 Department of Agriculture, Trade and Consumer Protection." Do you recall ceiving - - receiving a notice? 4 THE APPLICANT: Yes, I do. 5 CHAIRMAN WITKOWIAK: Which was - -6 Okay. Sergeant Ulicky? 7 SERGEANT ULICKY: On 3/22 of '05 the 8 application for a new home improvement contractor 9 for Grandview Windows was amended to remove 10 Joseph Milner from the application. However, 11 Joseph Milner is still doing commercials for 12 Grandview Windows. The following reflects the 13 record for both Joseph Milner and pending charges 14 related to Grandview Windows doing business in 15 Milwaukee without a license. The most recent of 16 which is on 3/22 of '05 at 10:45 a.m. a consumer 17 specialist from Wisconsin Department of 18 Agricultural Trade and Consumer Protection - -19 Division of Trade and Consumer Protection 20 contacted the license investigation unit 21 regarding two complaints from City of Milwaukee 22 residents regarding unlicensed work by Joseph 23 Milner, agent for Grandview Windows. 2.4 As a result of that call two citations 25 were issued to Joseph Milner. The first was for

00004 work done on or about 10/7 of '04 at a City of 1 Milwaukee home at 6532 West Euclid, and the second was for work done on or about 11/19 of '04 4 at a City of Milwaukee home at 6741 South 19th. 5 Both of those charges are pending at this time. 6 CHAIRMAN WITKOWIAK: Thank you, 7 Sergeant. That is for the record of Joseph 8 Milner. Is that correct? 9 SERGEANT ULICKY: That is correct. 10 And, as I stated previous to this, Mr. James 11 Milner - - or correction. He was removed. Mr. 12 James Milner was removed from that application. 13 CHAIRMAN WITKOWIAK: Right. Okay. Mr. 14 Milner, do you wish to say something? 15 THE APPLICANT: The record of Joseph 16 Milner has nothing to do with me. That's my son. 17 CHAIRMAN WITKOWIAK: Yes. 18 THE APPLICANT: I'm Jim Milner. I've 19 been doing business here in Milwaukee area for 15 20 years under New View Installations. My business 21 - - I'm not even sure if I need a license. Mr. 22 Whitcomb, my attorney, I talked to him and he 23 read it, and he says I guess it could be 24 interpreted yes or no. But I've done work in Milwaukee for different contractors. I can show 25

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         you some of it. For at least seven years here.
         And I don't know if they're licensed. I'm - -
         They never asked me. I've never asked them.
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         I've never had any tickets. I've got it broken
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         down how many jobs I've sold on my own, how many

         jobs I've done in Milwaukee area, how many jobs
 7
          I've done total for New View Installations.

         That's my company's sole proprietorship. I have -
9
          - Right now I have five crews working for me.
10
         Two-man crews, sometimes three.
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                   CHAIRMAN WITKOWIAK: How long has New
12
         View been in existence?
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                    THE APPLICANT: Fifteen years.
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                    CHAIRMAN WITKOWIAK: Fifteen years.
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                    THE APPLICANT: I have, if you'd like
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         to see, I didn't type up a copy for everybody,
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         but I kind of printed out - - I've only been

         computerized for the last seven years. So I
19
         printed out the different companies I've worked
20
         for, the jobs, how many jobs I've done for them.

         And you can look and tell where it says,
22
          "Invoice," how many jobs I've done for them.
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                    CHAIRMAN WITKOWIAK: Okay. So you've
2.4
         been a subcontractor.
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                   THE APPLICANT: Yes.
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00006 1 CHAIRMAN WITKOWIAK: For siding 2 companies. 3 THE APPLICANT: Yes. But I don't know 4 if they're licensed. My experience from my son 5 now, he got hit with two fines. They're 600 6 bucks apiece. I can't afford 600 dollars apiece 7 for, you know, they come on the job and I'm working, 180 dollars, it's worth it for me to get 8 9 a license rather than come in to court or here or 10 wherever you go and pay 600 bucks. I don't make 11 that kind of money. 12 CHAIRMAN WITKOWIAK: Were - - Were you 13 a subcontractor for your son's company? 14 THE APPLICANT: I've - - I've got it 15 here. In the last seven years I think I've done 16 17 jobs for him. In the last seven years, total 17 of 17. When he gets backed up, he's called me, 18 and I've personally went in. Most of those jobs 19 were remodeling his stores that I went in and 20 helped him do. But he paid me, so I collected 21 under that. There's a few of them that were done 22 in Milwaukee. When he'd get backed up, didn't 23 have nobody at the time, I did it. But that's 24 like three percent of all the business I do.

CHAIRMAN WITKOWIAK: But did - - Did

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1	you not work for Grandview?
2	THE APPLICANT: I was president until
3	we went through the ordeal we went through here.
4	I resigned as president. So And Joseph never
5	had nothing to do with New View Installations,
6	nothing, whatsoever. Never did. And And
7	you're going to ask me why. I'll tell you why.
8	Because it's father and son. I'm stubborn. He's
9	stubborn. There can only be one boss.
10	CHAIRMAN WITKOWIAK: Then Then why
11	did you work Why were you
12	THE APPLICANT: I helped my son set up
13	his corporation. I went in as president, so that
14	he could do business.
15	CHAIRMAN WITKOWIAK: Okay.
16	THE APPLICANT: He's still my son, and
17	I still own ten percent of it. He owns the rest.
18	CHAIRMAN WITKOWIAK: Okay. Questions
19	by members of the committee? Someone?
20	THE APPLICANT: I have documentation
21	for how long I've been Well, not for the
22	whole 15 years, but for seven years.
23	ALDERMAN BOHL: Mr. Chairman, I'd like
24	to see that.
25	THE APPLICANT: I did the best I can to

00008 1 print it out. This is two - - This is two packets. So if you wanted - - I only printed out two. I'm cheap on paper. But there, you can 4 pass them around and look. And I thought the 5 question might come up on how much I'd done in 6 Milwaukee areas, so I did the best I can to count 7 them out, break it down for you. I don't know 8 what you call - - I guess, a synopsis, is the front total jobs, and et cetera. 9 10 CHAIRMAN WITKOWIAK: I have a question 11 for our city attorney now. As a subcontractor 12 for a window and siding contractor, does - - does 13 the sub doing the work have - - have to be 14 licensed? 15 MR. SCHRIMPF: It's my understanding 16 the sub does have to be. I - - No? 17 MS. BARRON: Well, the definition of 18 that contractor says, "Contractor means any 19 person engaged in the business of installing, 20 repairing." 21 MR. SCHRIMPF: Okay. 22 MS. BARRON: So any person who is doing 23 that needs a license. 2.4 THE APPLICANT: Mr. Whitcomb - - I'm 25 sorry. Mr. Whitcomb said the city said the same

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1	thing, wasn't sure like the attorney said, that					
2	he said it's opened up. Maybe the contractor					
3	worked for it and needs it. But I don't know if					
4	they have licenses. I never asked them, and they					
5	never asked me.					
6	CHAIRMAN WITKOWIAK: So So now					
7	So now you're saying you're you're thinking					
8	you you probably need a license to do what					
9	you're doing.					
10	THE APPLICANT: Yes. Yes.					
11	CHAIRMAN WITKOWIAK: Subcontracting,					
12	regardless of whether those other guys have a					
13	license or not.					
14	THE APPLICANT: Right.					
15	CHAIRMAN WITKOWIAK: And that's why					
16	you're here.					
17	THE APPLICANT: And I do sell a couple					
18	of mine. Not very many, but, you know, like if					
19	one of you gentleman said, "Jim, could you give					
20	me a bid?" I would. And I'd definitely need a					
21	license for that.					
22	CHAIRMAN WITKOWIAK: Right. Okay.					
23	ALDERMAN BOHL: Mr. Chairman.					
24	CHAIRMAN WITKOWIAK: Alderman Bohl.					
25	ALDERMAN BOHL: Mr. Milner, I assume					

00010 1 that - - that knowing that you're coming forward 2 and applying for a license here, as well, too, you've apprised yourself on what you need to pull 4 permits for and what you may not need to pull 5 permits for, as well, too, here in the City of 6 Milwaukee. 7 THE APPLICANT: For me personally, yes. 8 But a lot of the contractors pull the permits. 9 don't pull the permits. I just do the work for 10 the subcontracting. Of course, for jobs that I 11 would sell if I did yours, I'd have to pull 12 permits, of course. 13 MR. SCHRIMPF: Mr. Chairman? 14 CHAIRMAN WITKOWIAK: Mr. Schrimpf. 15 MR. SCHRIMPF: Thank you. Mr. Milner, 16 it just seems to me that it would be a relatively 17 easy thing if you're on a job site, to check to 18 see if there's a permit, because there'd be a 19 permit on the job site, wouldn't there? 20 THE APPLICANT: Some of the jobs I do, 21 22

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there are permits. Some of them, depends on what I'm doing. We just don't look. I'm sorry. 15 years, I've never had a problem. You know, maybe now I should start looking, but I never have.

MR. SCHRIMPF: I don't mean to be

00011 1 facetious, but perhaps you weren't caught in 15 2 years. THE APPLICANT: Most of them are 4 subcontracted from somebody else. So the 5 permits - -6 MR. SCHRIMPF: Well, that's not - -7 That's not the question. The question is the job 8 site would have a permit. 9 THE APPLICANT: Yeah. 10 MR. SCHRIMPF: So why don't you just 11 look for the permit, and if you don't see one, 12 inquire? 13 THE APPLICANT: Well, to be honest with 14 you I'd be out of work, somebody else would do 15 the job, and I need the money. 16 MR. SCHRIMPF: Not - -17 THE APPLICANT: That's not the answer 18 you want, I know. But, you know, it's a choice. 19 I say I could say no, and they'll go get somebody 20 else. You don't have a permit. I just never 21 asked. And I got bills to pay, too, just like 22 everybody. And a lot of the companies I do get 23 permits, because some of the companies that - -24 that I have in there are - - are room additions.

And we haven't done that - - If you look at the

00012 1 top, let me see - - Most of the jobs are - - Out of 611, I did 123 in the - - in the City of Milwaukee. That's 20 percent out of 611 jobs in 4 the last seven years. I sold 52 in the last 5 seven years. I did 12 in the City of Milwaukee. 6 That's 23 percent. 7 And if you want to know the truth, when it comes - - I come from Grays Lake, Illinois, 8 9 and in Grays Lake, Illinois I don't need a permit 10 to do siding or window replacement. Milwaukee, 11 you do. A lot of areas around here you don't 12 need them, unless I'm changing it. Putting 13 siding on somebody's house or trimming windows, 14 just like a painter painting, I'm not changing 15 anything. I'm just beautifying it. 16 CHAIRMAN WITKOWIAK: Motion by Alderman 17 is to make the - - the summary of the work that 18 was presented to us by Mr. Milner as part of the 19 record in this hearing. And hearing no 20 objections, so ordered. Did I describe that 21 adequately? 22 THE APPLICANT: Oh, yeah. 23 CHAIRMAN WITKOWIAK: Adequate 2.4 description of the booklet. All right.

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ALDERMAN BOHL: Mr. Chairman?

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1	CHAIRMAN WITKOWIAK: Alderman Bohl.
2	ALDERMAN BOHL: Mr. Milner, you you
3	indicate that you were president of of
4	Grandview
5	THE APPLICANT: Windows and Siding.
6	ALDERMAN BOHL: Which you describe as
7	primarily your son's company.
8	THE APPLICANT: Yes.
9	ALDERMAN BOHL: You I mean,
10	obviously, I I think you understand that
11	given that there were concerns that were even
12	brought before this body by the State of
13	Wisconsin, your name was affiliated with those
14	issues.
15	THE APPLICANT: Yes, I am. But as
16	I don't know. Maybe I I'm confused. The
17	owner of the corporation or the president of the
18	corporation, is the president of all the
19	corporations. Are they held responsible for what
20	their employees do? And are they the ones that
21	have the contracts in the city? They should all
22	lose them then, right?
23	ALDERMAN BOHL: Sir, your name was on
24	that company as president.
25	THE APPLICANT: Yes.

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1	ALDERMAN BOHL: And at the same point
2	you came forward as the applicant for that
3	company, as well, too.
4	THE APPLICANT: Yes. Yes. And I
5	resigned as president. Now it's his ball of wax.
6	CHAIRMAN WITKOWIAK: I'll ask you a
7	question. You know, you realize you're under
8	oath.
9	THE APPLICANT: Yes.
10	CHAIRMAN WITKOWIAK: Are Are you
11	Are you going to attempt to get some of the
12	business that Grandview Windows Are you
13	fronting for your son to get
14	THE APPLICANT: No.
15	CHAIRMAN WITKOWIAK: work within
16	the City of Milwaukee for Grandview Windows?
17	THE APPLICANT: No. No.
18	CHAIRMAN WITKOWIAK: You're telling us
19	that under oath.
20	THE APPLICANT: I'm under oath, and I
21	brought this in. I've got enough contractors
22	that I work for. Otherwise, I'd be involved in
23	it completely. But I'm not.
24	CHAIRMAN WITKOWIAK: Okay.
25	ALDERMAN BOHL: Mr. Chairman.

00015 1 CHAIRMAN WITKOWIAK: Alderman Bohl. ALDERMAN BOHL: I've got a question and - - and - - for either the License Division, DNS, 4 or the City Attorney's office here. Knowing that 5 his son's company still is operating, is still 6 doing advertising, would Grandview be able to 7 sign a contract with a resident of the City of 8 Milwaukee for work and then legally subcontract 9 that work out provided they don't - - they don't 10 do the work itself, or would they need the - -11 There's an associated seller's license. They - -12 Would they need the salesperson's license here 13 approved before they could even subcontract that 14 work out? 15 MS. BARRON: It depends where the 16 contract's being signed. If it's outside of the 17 place of business, you need a salesperson's 18

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license. And we don't issue salesperson's license unless the company is licensed. So they wouldn't be able to do the contracts at people's homes and things like that.

ALDERMAN BOHL: So only if someone were to go to Greenfield where Grandview is located and sign a contract there, could they potentially sub it out. Is that what you're saying?

00016 1 MS. BARRON: Yes. ALDERMAN BOHL: Could Grandview sub it out? Legally to perhaps New View if - - if New 4 View were licensed with the city. 5 MS. BARRON: Not for the City of 6 Milwaukee. I'm saying they could do the contract 7 there, but it wouldn't be legal for them to do 8 any work. 9 ALDERMAN BOHL: It wouldn't be legal 10 for any affiliation through Grandview to do work 11 in the City of Milwaukee, including some work 12 that's subcontracted out. 13 MR. SCHRIMPF: I think - - I think the 14 subcontracting issue, Mr. Chairman, is sort of a 15 red herring. 16 CHAIRMAN WITKOWIAK: There's still a 17 contractor. 18 MR. SCHRIMPF: Right. There's still a 19 contractor. The - - The functioning as a 20 contractor under the ordinance as read they would 21 be required to have a home improvement 22 contractor's license. But I guess where there 23 would be a potential problem with this, is that 24 it is still possible for the owner of a home to 25 pull a permit and then hire anybody they want

00017 1 really to do the work. Now, if they would hire 2 one of these organizations, under the ordinance they should be licensed as a home improvement 4 contractor. 5 We've kind of got two things going 6 here. One is the failure to pull the permits, 7 and the other one is operating without the 8 license, and they're two really sort of separate 9 things. 10 ALDERMAN BOHL: Mr. Chairman, I - -11 CHAIRMAN WITKOWIAK: Alderman Bohl. 12 ALDERMAN BOHL: Thank you. I raised 13 that issue because ultimately I don't want to see 14 two respective companies where there has been 15 some intermingling of ownership and involvement 16 among family members to circumvent the fact that 17 the city has sought to deny the license of one 18 and see it as a means for the continuance of one 19 business who won't functionally do the work but 20 may subcontract the work out for another one who 21 could ultimately be licensed with the city. 22 That's - - That's the question that I'm raising.

CHAIRMAN WITKOWIAK: Well, from what I

understand, Grandview would have to have a - -

either a seller's license - -

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00018 MR. SCHRIMPF: Only - - Only if the - -1 2 Only if it's within the City of - - if the sale took place within the City of Milwaukee. 4 CHAIRMAN WITKOWIAK: Well, then back to 5 Alderman Bohl's question. Can somebody come out 6 to their office in Greenfield from Milwaukee, 7 sign a contract, and then they can come do the 8 work? No. 9 ALDERMAN BOHL: Then - - Then they 10 could - - I'm asking if they could then 11 subcontract out to a company that is licensed 12 with the City of Milwaukee. 13 MR. SCHRIMPF: It would be a way around 14 the seller's requirement. That might work. ALDERMAN BOHL: Well, if somebody wants 15 16 to go out to Greenfield. 17 THE APPLICANT: Can I ask the alderman 18 one thing? I see in the paperwork here you keep 19 bringing up advertisement, that my son is still 20 advertising on the radio for Grandview. And as 21 far as I know, the radio stations, I don't think 22 they can - - there's a way of telling the people 23 - - Because he can work all over Milwaukee, 24 Racine, everything. It's just right here in

Milwaukee he can't. But I don't think there's a

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1	way of telling the people, the residents of					
2	Milwaukee, that, hey, don't listen to this					
3	advertisement. We'll shut them off. If we					
4	could, we would. Or he wouldn't, sir. You know,					
5	I mean, so I don't know the advertisements					
6	ALDERMAN BOHL: I understand.					
7	THE APPLICANT: what that's got to					
8	do with anything.					
9	ALDERMAN BOHL: I understand. No, I					
10	just I don't I don't know how much					
11	advertising you do.					
12	THE APPLICANT: I don't do any.					
13	ALDERMAN BOHL: And your son does a					
14	tremendous amount of advertising, even					
15	THE APPLICANT: For Grandview Windows,					
16	yes.					
17	ALDERMAN BOHL: Yeah, even to the point					
18	where one of the companies here indicated in a					
19	letter that there was hundreds of thousands of					
20	dollars a year					
21	THE APPLICANT: Yes.					
22	ALDERMAN BOHL: of advertising that					
23	he's doing.					
24	THE APPLICANT: Yes.					
25	ALDERMAN BOHL: I have to imagine,					

00020 1 because Milwaukee being the largest city in the 2 metropolitan Milwaukee area, that you get - that he's going to get quite a few people - - I 4 don't know that he's going to do advertising 5 saying I'm - - I'm doing work everywhere but the 6 City of Milwaukee. So I'm certain that there are 7 residents who are going to pick up the phone in 8 the City of Milwaukee, call up and say, yeah, I'd 9 like you to come by and give me an estimate or 10 whatever the circumstances maybe. And I think 11 you get where I'm going at at that point. 12 THE APPLICANT: Yes. And I - - And if 13 you looked at - - I can only go by what I know, 14 on the percentages that I've had. Well, you got 15 it - - You had it there if I need to show you. 16 ALDERMAN BOHL: We got it right here. 17 THE APPLICANT: It will fall out, but 18 it can't. But, you know, so just total jobs just 19 what I'm doing we're talking 20 percent. Most of 20 his advertising is for the suburbs. And our - -His - - I keep saying "our," because I just 21 22 resigned, is in Oak Creek and Waukesha. We have 23 - - He has no offices, whatsoever, in Milwaukee. 2.4 But, yes, I'm sure - - I don't know why our

attorney the first time said two or three jobs.

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1	That's That was an error on his part.				
2	There's been jobs, let me tell you.				
3	CHAIRMAN WITKOWIAK: Okay. Any more				
4	questions by members of the committee? Anything				
5	further to say before we make our				
6	recommendations.				
7	THE APPLICANT: I think you gave me an				
8	opportunity to say as much as I could. Thank				
9	you.				
10	MR. SCHRIMPF: Mr. Chairman, this isn't				
11	a recommendation. This is				
12	CHAIRMAN WITKOWIAK: That's correct.				
13	Okay. This is a decision.				
14	MR. SCHRIMPF: Correct.				
15	CHAIRMAN WITKOWIAK: Okay. This matter				
16	is in committee.				
17	ALDERMAN BOHL: Mr. Chairman, I'll				
18	I'll do I'll make a motion.				
19	CHAIRMAN WITKOWIAK: Oh, okay. Mr.				
20	Bohl.				
21	ALDERMAN BOHL: Mr. Chairman, I'll move				
22	approval. I I think that certainly there was				
23	a larger concern, because his son had an				
24	extensive police record. I for one, and you know				
25	it, because I think it was very blunt last time,				

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1 I didn't appreciate what I viewed was lying before this committee and - - and the council. You're a little - - I appreciate what I believe 4 is rare candor this time. Even to the point 5 where you may not be in full compliance here in 6 the past with city ordinances. We don't have 7 complaints coming forward from residents to the 8 work. I don't know that we have anything on 9 record. And I'd have some real concerns if there 10 would be a very easy way to circumvent the 11 process and continue to operate Grandview, which 12 in my estimation has had a blemished track record 13 before the City of Milwaukee with individuals. 14 Mind you, I understand if you're doing hundreds 15 of jobs you're not going to find 100 percent 16 satisfaction. The records did not look good from 17 those residents in terms of the timeliness. I 18 don't - - Other than his affiliation with the 19 son, which may - - may provide valid reason, if 20 Mr. Milner has adequately held onto his own 21 company on the side here for many years, they 22 always say don't penalize the son for father's 23 errors. And I think maybe that ought to be 2.4 reciprocated, too. I will reluctantly vote 25 approval.

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CHAIRMAN WITKOWIAK: Thank you, Alderman Bohl. I just want to ask, because this was noticed for neighborhood objections. Is there anybody here in the audience that wishes to speak on this matter? No. Let the record show that no one acknowledges. And I will support that motion. I think the - - You've demonstrated to us or proven to us that you, in fact, have your own company that you've been operating for many years. And I don't think if you would have just come in here today and said I decided to go off on my own now and - - I would - - I would have thought that this was more of a front than anything. Some small percentage of me still suspects that, but I have to do that. That's part of my job.

But I think at this - - I think at this point you've - - you've proven to me that - - that you, in fact, are independent from Grandview and have been. I understand the relationship with your son and the relationship of being involved in the corporation and even the ownership part. I even understand when you still say "we," because you said - - You told us that you still own ten percent. So it still is "we."

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1	But I don't see a There is not enough				
2	compelling reasons that that stand out in my				
3	mind to deny this application. So I'm going to				
4	support Alderman Bohl's motion. Anyone else on				
5	the motion?				
6	Motion by Alderman Bohl is to recommend				
7	approval of this license despite items contained				
8	in the police report and other items listed in				
9	the notice. Are there any objections to that				
10	motion?
