Dear Mr. Leonhardt:

This claim is being submitted under §895.35(2), STATS., which provides that:

Notwithstanding sub (1), the City . . . shall reimburse a protective services officer for reasonable attorney fees incurred by the officer in connection with a criminal proceeding arising from the officer's conduct in the performance of official duties, unless, in relation to that conduct, any of the following applies:

- a. The officer is convicted of a crime;
- b. The officer's employment is terminated for cause;
- c. The officer resigned for reasons other than retirement before the attorneys fees are incurred;
- d. The officer is demoted or reduced in rank
- e. The officer is suspended without pay for 10 of more working days. §895.35(2), STATS.

Officer Chu is considered a "protective services officer" under the statute. He has incurred the fees compiled in this claim as a direct result of his being investigated for actions taken within his official capacity, and in the performance of his duties, in connection with the use of deadly force.

None of the "exceptions" apply.

The incident resulted in the District Attorney's Office conducting a criminal investigation into the shooting of Mr. Valcos Bliss, under Chapter 979, STATS. The DA found my client's actions to be in self-defense and, as a result, did not issue any charges. A copy of Deputy District Attorney Patrick Kenney's letter confirming the same is attached. That investigation qualifies as a "proceeding" which mandates payment under 895.35(2), STATS.



I have reviewed a Milwankee Police Department investigation and an investigation conducted independently by our office into the August 14, 2006 non-fatal shooting of Valcos Bliss. This shooting occurred in an alley located in the 4200 block of North 19th Street in the City of Milwaukee. During this incident, Sgt. Kimberlee Foster and Officer Christopher Chu each fired at Valcos Bliss, resulting in non-fatal gunshot wounds. After reviewing this matter, I am satisfied that the actions of Sgt. Foster and Officer Chu were privileged under the law of self-defense, and defense of others. Having reached that conclusion, no criminal charges will be brought against either officer for their involvement in this incident.
