Dear Mr. Leonhardt:

This claim is being submitted under §895.35(2), STATS., which provides that:

Notwithstanding sub (1), the City . . . shall reimburse a protective services officer for reasonable attorney fees incurred by the officer in connection with a criminal proceeding arising from the officers conduct in the performance of official duties, unless, in relation that conduct, any of the following applies:

- a. The officer is convicted of a crime;
- b. The officer's employment is terminated for cause;
- c. The officer resigned for reasons other than retirement before the attorneys fees are incurred;
- d. The officer is demoted or reduced in rank
- e. The officer is suspended without pay for 10 of more working days. §895.35(2), STATS.

Officer Colker is considered a "protective services officer" under the statute. He has incurred the fees compiled in this claim as a direct result of his being investigated for actions taken within his official capacity, and in the performance of his duties, in connection with the use of deadly force.

None of the "exceptions" apply1.

The incident resulted in the District Attorney's Office conducting a criminal investigation into the shooting of Steven Bucholtz, under Chapter 979, STATS. That investigation qualifies as a "proceeding" which mandates payment under 895.35(2), STATS.

Attached is a copy of DA Chisholm's letter dated June 1, 2007 confirming that Officer Colkers's actions were privileged and in self-defense.

Dear Chief Hegerty:

On May 22, 2007, Milwaukee Police Officer Gregory Colker shot and killed citizen Steven Bucholtz after responding to what was reported as an attempted armed robbery and shooting in the area of S. Kinnickinnic Ave, and E. Ward St., Milwaukee.

Officer Colker was informed that a man had attempted to rob a citizen walking in the area had fired two gunshots toward the intended victim, though not striking the victim, then immediately fled. Shortly after arriving at the scene, Officer Colker quickly identified Steven Bucholtz as an individual matching the description of the suspect. Bucholtz refused to drop a leather coat despite numerous commands from Officer Colker and other responding officers to drop the coat and get on the ground. Bucholtz deliberately withdrew a semi-automatic pistol from the coat and was in the process of lowering the weapons muzzle towards Officer Colker, at which time Officer Colker fired his service weapon, fatally wounding Bucholtz. Mr. Bucholtz repeatedly asked the officers to shoot him during the encounter.

I have spoken to the family of Mr. Bucholtz and they related a series of tragedies that had recently befallen Mr. Bucholtz prior to this encounter, and felt he was suicidal. They are deeply sorry for the circumstances Officer Colker encountered and want to express that they do not believe Mr. Bucholtz wanted to harm anyone but himself, but also understand that the officer had to use deadly force in this situation.

Based upon my personal review and information gathered through investigation of this incident, I am satisfied that Officer Gregory Colker committed no crime and his actions were privileged by selfdefense under 939.48, Stats.
