#### AN ORDINANCE

To create Sections 6-38 and 6-39 of the Milwaukee Code, relating to sidewalk photographers.

The Mayor and Common Council of the City of Milwaukee do ordain as follows:

Part 1. There are hereby created two new sections of the Milwaukee Code to read:

Section 6-38. It shall be unlawful for any person on any street or thoroughfare in the City of Milwaukee to take any picture, photograph or snap shot, by any process whatsoever, for the purpose of offering for sale to any person selected by him a copy of the picture so taken, for a consideration in any form. The passing out of written, printed, typewritten or mimeographed matter or the giving of any information orally concerning the means by which a copy of the picture so taken may be obtained, is hereby defined to be an offer to furnish a copy of the picture taken, for a consideration. The provisions of this section shall not be deemed to include the taking of a picture solely for personal use or for the purpose of reproducing it in a book, newspaper, magazine or periodical, and the sale of any book, newspaper, magazine or periodical containing any such picture likewise shall not be a violation of this section.

Section 6-39. Penalty. Any person found guilty of violating the provisions of the foregoing section of this chapter shall upon conviction thereof be fined not less than \$25.00 nor more than \$100.00 or be

punished by imprisonment in the House of Correction for not les than 10 days nor more than 30 days.
