# Smart Growth A New Philosophy of Planning



## Impetus for Wisconsin's Smart Growth Law

- Prior to 1999, only 29% of WI communities had any kind of land-use plan in place
- Existing plans varied in quality and content
- Plans were rarely implemented
- State offered no guidance to improve situation



## New WI Planning Requirements

- Consistency with 14 Planning Goals in Statute
- Nine Elements Adopted at Once by Ordinance
- Zoning Code Consistency
- Public Participation Procedure
- Evaluation and Update Procedure
- TND Ordinance
