Following your instructions, I am writing to advise after a painful injury and months of treatments, I have been released by my orthopedic physician.

You indicated I should write a letter to indicate a settlement offer. I am a bit confused by the amount since I have been advised Medicare will require repayment of all the bills they have paid from my injury.

The medical bills total \$18,796, that have been paid. If I have to pay the medical bills back out of any settlement, that would raise the number of any settlement to me. If the City is going to make reimbursement to Medicare directly the number to settle would be less.

Doctor reports indicate I have a permanent disability of 10% of the whole person following the breaks in my arm. I suffered extensively during the surgery and the months of physical therapy and treatments. Assuming your settlement would indicate I am NOT required to make any payments to Medicare from my proceeds, I would settle for \$28,087.

If you have any questions in this matter, I would again request you contact my son-inlaw, Dick Johnson. I know you have spoken with him a number of times and you have his number and address.
