H) COMPUTATIONS USED IN ARRIVING AT FISCAL ESTIMATE:

It is unknown how many unregistered vehicles are parked on City streets; however, it is believed to be in the thousands. The implications on the workload of parking enforcement and the tow lot are unknown, but the volume will be closely monitored. At this time no additional staff or resources will be requested. It is DPW's intent to prioritize enforcement of this ordinance with the highest priority given to those vehicles that have no license plates. Secondary priority will be given to those vehicles with license plates that have expired for more than 6 months (and with open citations). Lower priority will be given to those vehicles with license plates that have expired within the last 6 months. It is believed that an estimated 20% of the vehicles towed under this ordinance will not be retrieved. Prior to enforcement of this ordinance, it is DPW's intent to issue communications informing the public of the new ordinance. Further DPW intends to issue communications informing the public on how to properly register vehicles.
