The following is in response to your request for certain information related to the Milwaukee Police Department (MPD).

1. Vacancies:

As of December 31 in each of the following years (except as noted), the actual number of filled positions / authorized strength in the police officer rank is as follows:

- 2000 1,376/1,528, 152/9% vacancy
- 2001 1,347/1,529, 182/11% vacancy
- 2002 1,387/1,530, 143/9% vacancy
- 2003 1,358/1,531, 173/10% vacancy
- 2004 1,402/1,531, 129/12% vacancy
- 2005 1,362/1,536, 174/11% vacancy
- 2006 1,342/1,536, 194/12% vacancy as of May 22, 2006 with filled positions including the current recruit class

2. MPD Recruit Classes:

- * From MPD payroll and may be less than the actual Fire and Police Commission appointments because of "no-show" or attrition.
- ** Although budgeted for 2 classes, only one class was held because of budgetary constraints.

*** Although budgeted for 2 classes in 2006, the Fire and Police Commission and the Police Department decided to add a September class to assure that the budgeted number of recruits, 132, for 2006 is attained. The process for starting a recruit class, especially the background checks as well as a higher number of candidates disqualified after the psychological testing, have contributed to a smaller-than-expected number for the May 22, 2006 class. 66 recruits is the usual number of recruits to start a police class. This third class is planned for September 25th with a projected number of 40 recruits.

The second class, originally planned for November 6th, has been moved to November 20th with a projected number of 40 recruits.

3. Factors contributing to MPD vacancies:

- Because of budget constraints, the number of police classes for each year has varied
- The ideal number of 66 recruits has not always been achieved, either upon the start of class or due to attrition
- Recruitment to MPD has not always kept pace with separations from service
