## Demographic Information

- There are 3,511 students enrolled in city-chartered schools.
- The majority (70%) of the schools are 90/90 schools (at least 90% of students are African American; 90% are low income).

## **Academic Performance**

- Six of the 10 schools had a promising/good (5) or high performing/exemplary (1) status on the City of Milwaukee Scorecard.
- Half (50%) of the city-chartered schools met expectations or significantly exceeded expectations on the Department of Public Instruction (DPI) Report Card compared to 19% of Milwaukee Public Schools (MPS).
- Elementary schools
  - » All city-chartered schools had higher math growth scores than MPS.<sup>1</sup>
  - » Four of six city-chartered schools had higher reading growth scores than MPS.
  - More than half (60%) of city-chartered schools with economically disadvantaged/African American populations met expectations on DPI's Report Card compared to 8% of MPS.
- High schools
  - » Graduation rates for the two city-chartered high schools with graduates:
    - After four years, 68% and 84%; MPS was 61%.
    - After five years, 94% and 97%; MPS was 69%.
    - After six years, 97% and 95%; MPS was 73%.
  - » The two city-chartered high schools with graduates had post-secondary enrollment rates of 45% and 83%, compared to 38% of MPS graduates.
