The Crain / Claffin House is significant both for its architecture and its owners.

The house belongs to the golden age of Cambridge Avenue when the street was populated with prominent business people, policy makers and socialites. The house was built in 1880, per the tax rolls, and was most likely Italianate or Victorian Gothic in style. The basic footprint of the house dates to this time period and the north and south wings are typical of this period. The 1894 Sanborn map shows that the covered entry was located in the north wing, where a large window is situated today. A prominent bay window extended from the front. Under the second owner, the house was remodeled into its current appearance. The architect of this remodeling, H. A. Betts was well known for his work in the Arts and Crafts style but in this instance, created a very hybrid design. He changed the entrance to the front of the house and built a large porch across the facade, supported by pairs of lonic columns. This along with the oculus or circular window in the south gable are elements of the Colonial Revival style. The plain shingles in the south gable, the half-timbering in the north gable, the six-over-one sash are all elements of the Arts and Crafts. The house had been maintained in this form with some modifications to the present day. The house is a good example of 19th and early 20th century practices that preferred remodeling and updating to demolition and building over. The house is a very well designed example of the type of hybrid that could be produced by a talented

The house is also prominent for its early owners. It was built in 1880 by Charles E. Crain, who was prominent in the insurance industry and was the head of a free Lecture Society that brought notables into town. A letter written to Crain by Frederick Douglass is at the University of Chicago. The letter indicates that Douglass was unable to lecture in Milwaukee (at least at the time requested). Crain was also active as a school commissioner and in veterans societies.

The next owner of the house was Thomas Claflin the president-treasurer of the Model Laundry Company. This business located in the neighborhood after being downtown, and constructed a 2-story building at 1719 North Warren Avenue. A later addition in 1908 was built at 1716 North Arlington. The prominent Huebsch Laundry Company acquired the Model Laundry in 1914.
