consist of repairing roofing, gutters and downspouts; repairing or replacing wood trim as needed; replacing selected non-historic wood windows with windows to match originals; repair

ing original wood windows, replacing non-historic storm windows with custom wood storm windows; repairing masonry chimneys, re-pointing front porch masonry and replacing selected

deteriorated stone; restoring the front doors and re-roofing the upper entry porch with

membrane type material.













South Elevation
