Council File #061257, A substitute ordinance relating to procurement of various items: Summary of Requirements, and Differences Between Proposed Substitute E and Substitute 1

This memo summarizes the most recent version of Council File 061257, Proposed Substitute E, and discusses the principal differences between Proposed Substitute E and Substitute 1 (previously Proposed Substitute C), the version considered by the Finance and Personnel Committee on 5/2/07 and held to the call of the Chair.

Proposed Substitute E - Summary

- Explanation of Requirement for Non-apparel Purchases
 - The proposed ordinance relates to the City's contracts for purchases of non-apparel items, materials, supplies and equipment in excess of \$30,000 that are bid by the City of Milwaukee. The proposed ordinance requires a bidder to submit an affidavit verifying that the bidder is a responsible manufacturer, as defined by the ordinance, before the City and a bidder may enter into a contract. The proposed ordinance also requires contractors to obtain and submit affidavits from every subcontractor who contracts directly with the contractor during the specified time period of the contract for production of these items stating that the subcontractor is also a responsible manufacturer.
- <u>City purchases that will be affected upon passage:</u> A complete list of City contracts that will be affected if the proposed ordinance is passed is attached. Each item on this spreadsheet is purchased through the Purchasing Services Section of DOA.
- This ordinance does not apply to public works projects:
 - o Please refer to #23 on the attached spreadsheet, "VC [vendor contract] Asphalt Concrete" for an example. This contract was awarded to Payne & Dolan Inc. to supply and deliver asphalt concrete to a city storage facility. This material is stored, and used as needed by city crews for small street maintenance restoration activities. When the Purchasing Services Section made this purchase for DPW, it was not for use in a public works contract. This purchase would be subject to the proposed ordinance.
 - The ordinance will not apply to materials furnished as part of a public works

 project. When the City bids out a public works project, included in the contract but not as separate items are materials involved in the project. DPW bids these projects out to

contractors who purchase their own asphalt materials to complete their projects. The City does not pay separately for asphalt, or other materials; the prime contractor figures the cost of supplies into the price.

At this time the City does not have any contracts for supplies for public works contracts. Thus, the provision, "The requirements of this section shall not apply to items, materials, supplies and equipment to be furnished as part of a public works contract subject to s 66.0903, Wis. Stats." is a necessary technical provision to account for a rare situation which the City does not presently encounter, nor is it likely to encounter.

- The provision, "that are bid by the city of Milwaukee" provides for the exception of cooperative purchases that the City makes in cooperation with another municipal agency. For example, the City's Purchasing Services Section is a member of the VALUE consortium, which includes approximately 50 Southeastern WI agencies which strive to standardize and consolidate their volumes to achieve better pricing and avoid duplication of efforts.
- Principal Differences between Proposed Substitute E and Substitute 1
 - 1. Substitute 1 requires each contractor to complete an affidavit verifying that each subcontractor involved in the fulfillment of the contract is a responsible manufacturer, and providing the name of each firm and each firm's city of manufacture for each subcontractor.
 - Proposed Substitute E requires that contractors procure and submit affidavits from every subcontractor who contracts directly with the contractor to manufacture any part or component of an item subject to the ordinance. The affidavit shall verify that the contractor is a responsible manufacturer.
 - 2. Proposed Substitute E adds a penalty provision for firms that knowingly engage in fraud or misrepresentation, as it relates to the requirements of this section. The forfeiture is stated as not less than \$2,000 and not more than \$5,000, or upon default, imprisonment in the house of corrections for not more than 90 days. Those found by the Purchasing Services Section to be guilty of fraud or misrepresentation will be referred to the District Attorney.
 - 3. Proposed Substitute E states, in s. 6-a: "The division [Purchasing Services Section] shall investigate complaints relating to compliance with this section <u>to the greatest extent possible utilizing existing available resources</u>, and impose appropriate sanctions upon any contractor who provides false information to the division or fails to comply with the provisions of this section." The underlined portion is not included in Substitute 1, and is included in Proposed Substitute E.
