1. Description of Grant Project/Program (Include Target Locations and Populations):

This award continues to support comprehensive and coordinated services to children and their families to prevent childhood lead poisoning. Services include: screening, laboratory analysis, nursing care management, environmental inspections, community health education and program management. The goal of these efforts is to provide services that minimize the damaging effects of exposure to lead-based paint hazards. The Childhood Lead Poisoning Prevention Program (CLPPP) will target twenty-two high-risk homes in its low-income primary target area neighborhood for lead hazard control work. The \$50,000 award is expected to generate at least \$25,000 in leverage from owners.

2. Relationship to City-wide Strategic Goals and Departmental Objectives:

The City of Milwaukee's Lead Elimination Plan envisions public/private partnerships as essential to elimination of childhood lead poisoning. The City's Strategic Plan to Eliminate Lead Poisoning by 2010 will be strengthened with this third grant private sector award.

3. Need for Grant Funds and Impact on Other Departmental Operations (Applies only to Programs):

Although the prevalence rate for childhood lead poisoning in the nation has been reduced to 1.6% in 2006, the prevalence rate in Milwaukee's high-risk neighborhoods is still 13%.

4. Results Measurement/Progress Report (Applies only to Programs):

The CLPPP will make two reports to the grantor, one in January, 2008, and a final report in June, 2008. CLPPP will lead abate windows on 22 high-risk housing units in its target neighborhoods within this timeframe.
