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File # 070822 is a resolution relating to the application, acceptance and funding of the Plain Talk Initiative Grant from the United Way.

Background

- 1. This resolution authorizes the Milwaukee Health Department to apply for, accept and fund the Plain Talk Initiative Grant from the United Way.
- 2. The Plain Talk Initiative (MPT), formerly referred to as "Plaintalk," is a continuing program funded from several non-public sources including the Greater Milwaukee Foundation, the Faye McBeath Foundation, and also supported with training and evaluation by the Annie E. Casey Foundation.

Discussion

- 1. The Plain Talk Initiative is a community-based initiative designed to assist parents in developing the skills and tools they need to communicate effectively with their children about abstinence, healthy relationships, and sexuality.
- 2. The Plain Talk Initiative is a nationally recognized, evidence-based teen-pregnancy-reducing program with three components:
 - Community Mapping (surveying the community)
 - Walkers & Talkers (community residents mobilizing their community)
 - Home Health Parties (for educating parents).
- 3. Milwaukee was selected to be the 12th city in the U.S. for replication of the Plain Talk Initiative.
- 4. The target area for MPT is the Midtown Planning Area which has one of the highest rates of teen pregnancy and poverty in the City. In this area, 11.4% of 15-17 year-old become pregnant annually and 45% of families live in poverty. The racial/ethnic breakdown of the population in the Midtown Area is 76% African-American, 15% Hmong, 3% Hispanic and 3% Non Hispanic Caucasian.
- 5. The City of Milwaukee Health Department has partnered with New Concept Self-Development Center to implement the MPT. Two additional local partners are Manpower, Inc. and Public Allies.
- 6. This grant is for the period of October 1, 2007 through December 28, 2008.

- 7. The resolution in File #070822 authorizes the City Comptroller to commit \$50,000 grantor share funds within the Project/Grant Parent of the 2007 Special Revenue-Grant and Aid Projects Fund and to create appropriate Special Revenue Fund-Grant and Aid Project/Grant and Project /Grant levels.
- 8. The resolution further authorizes the Health Department, consistent with the terms of the grant, to: expend from these budgeted amounts; enter into subcontracts and leases; to expend 2007 budgeted grants for equipment deemed necessary to the operation of the program; and to expend funds for training and out-of-town travel of departmental staff from the grant funds in 2007.

Fiscal Impact

- 1. The total amount of this grant is \$50,000 entirely from the grantor.
- 2. The grant budget provides continued partial funding for the salary and fringe benefits of a Health Project Coordinator (pay range 4), \$5,050 for miscellaneous program supplies and materials, \$1,790 for conferences, training and meeting expenses, and \$17,160 for the extension of the current contract with the New Concepts Self Development to January 31, 2008.

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
