This report is written by Police Officer Donald Krenzien, assigned District One, Late Power Shift.

On the evening of Thursday, February 26, 2015 through the morning of Friday, February 27, 2015 District One personnel performed an underage tavern enforcement initiative. The officer's who participated in the operation were Police Officer Christopher Martin, assigned to District One, Police Officer Dorian Andress assigned to District 3, and myself. For the underage persons in this initiative we used one MPD police aide who works in the Police Administration Building. Police Aid Teresa Westfahl assigned to the Police Academy. Westfahl was confirmed to be underage by her Wisconsin identification card (2/17/1996)

Prior to attempting any checks of licensed class B tavern establishments the police aide and plain clothed police officer were given instructions. Westfahl and Andress were told that they were not allowed to consume any intoxicating beverages. They could not lie if asked if they were underage, or show any form of documentation, which could be construed as identification. It was explained that they had to order an alcoholic beverage, directly from a bartender behind a bar, then meet the plainclothes officer observing them with the alcoholic beverage for a photo in the tavern and then leave together. It was explained that at all times the plainclothes officer shadowing them would be in visual sight and observe the financial transaction for alcoholic beverages.

After this briefing Martin and I escorted P.O. Andress who was in plainclothes and P.A. Westfahl to multiple taverns located throughout the District One boundaries.

Westfahl and Andress attempted to gained entry to the class "B" licensed tavern, Buck Heads located at 1044 N. Old World Third St. Westfahl and Andress was challenged at the point of entry and turned away when she couldn't prove she was of age.

I spoke with Jacob Dehne and informed them that they passed.

I received a phone call from Milwaukee Police around 1:00am on Sunday, May 10th asking me to meet at Mt. Sinai because Bell Ambulance was transporting him. The Policeman said had been involved in an incident at Buckheads Saloon and that he would need stitches to his head.

I immediately headed there and got to the emergency room and was astonished to see how bad of shape was in. In the emergency room was a friend of his, and two Milwaukee Police, Officer Martin and Officer Graikowski along with a Marquette University Police Officer was holding gaze pads on top of his nose and was in obvious distress and crying with emotion. I had him remove the gaze and almost collapsed once I saw the damage. There were numerous lacerations with two gapping ones on his nose and one under his left eye. It was a miracle his eyes were not injured other than some lacerations above and below each eye.

went on to tell me that he was hit by a bottle or glass across the face. That is when his friend said that was stepping in to protect one of their friends who had been swung at while on the dance floor. said he was blind-sided by the hit and had no idea it was coming. s other friend; was beside him and was also struck in the back of the head and knocked to the floor. He did not need medical attention.

I am told then made his way to the restroom followed by his friends and others. Not sure when the police arrived but they meant on the restroom and advised him that he needed to get to the hospital.

The Milwaukee Police took pictures of face as they said it was a case of battery. In ad a cat scan to make sure there were no facial fractures or concussion. It was negative. I then consulted the Emergency room doctors on the severity of his lacerations and it was decided that in needed a plastic surgeon to suture his lacerations. However, Mt. Sinai did not have a plastic surgeon on duty so I had to transport him out to the Aurora Health Care Hospital in Summit.

Once at Summit Facility, I meant with the plastic surgeon. After some clean up on face he began to work on the lacerations. After an hour and half, and

over 100 sutures, he was finished. The one laceration under his left eye, was so deep, it was to the cheekbone. One of the lacerations on the top of his nose was so deep it penetrated through the cartilage and to his nasal passage.

said that it was good thing I had him do this since this one was so deep, a regular ER Doctor would not of been able to suture it correctly. He did say that since there was some nasal damage, he might need to have surgery down the road if there were problems.

I have had some communication with Officer Martin on the investigation. was issued tickets for under age and a false ID. I would like to point out that along with his friend said they WERE NOT carded when they entered the bar. From what the police have told me, the bouncer is the person who does the carding and the bar does not have an electronic scanner.

Officer Martin also told me that the Bouncer had thrown out the combatant before the police arrived and had also cleaned up the broken bottle that was used to strike I guess it was thrown in the trash and so the police had no evidence as to what was used on

The police also told me that the video is not clear and that they may not be able to get identification on the combatant.

I have witnessed a lot of pain and suffering by individuals but to see my sor, go through this is very disheartening. It just does not seem that Buckheads took measures to make sure the safety of their patrons is a priority. The staff did not take measures to make sure the combatant was identified and the information given to the police. The bar also cleaned up the evidence prior to police arriving and investigating. This is a severe battery case and the bar needs to be held responsible or at least assist the police in the investigation.

Friday, May 15, 2015

Saturday May 9th, 2015: The date is a day that I won't ever forget. It was a night that I was able to go out and celebrate a birthday with one of my friends in downtown Milwaukee, but didn't end in much of a celebration. A little after midnight, going into early Sunday morning, my group of 10 friends (Male and Female), went to Buckheads bar on Water Street to get a few drinks. While we had been previously drinking that night, no one in the group had been over served or publically intoxicated. Noted that I was not asked for an ID when walking into Buckheads. Approaching 1:00 am one of my friends on the dance floor was swung at by another individual. This is when my friend rand I walked over to break up the fight and make sure it didn't go another further. Out of nowhere I was smashed by glass bottle across the face. without throwing one punch or saying a word. I was dazed, confused, and well bloody. I remember putting my hand across my face and seeing all the blood dripping off, onto the floor and on my clothes. I turned around to see my friend and she insisted me going into the bathroom and getting help. At this point it was a crisis, while my friend was also hit across the back of his head, but this bottle didn't break.

After evaluation of my cuts, I had no choice but to go to the hospital via an ambulance. My friend stayed with me the entire way. Meanwhile, Buckheads let the guy that smashed me with the bottle go, because they didn't know how seriously injured I was at the time, so they say. After deciding to go to a plastic surgeon on call, my drove me out to Aurora medical in Oconomowoc, now approaching 4 A.M Sunday morning. I went into operation immediately, my face was completely numbed, because putting me under was out of the question with alcohol in my system. The pain was excruciating, but the operation went well and I was able to walk out and go home that morning.

The following day was Mother's Day, what a wonderful day for a Mother to look after her stitched up son. I was happy to be home with my family, but the pain didn't end there. I was the most uncomfortable being I could be, with my eyes feeling like weights and not having the ability to breathe through my nose due to a stint they had to put in. The stint was put in my left nostril because the glass tore all the way through my cartilage in my nose. The following days consisted of painkillers, antibiotics, and overall rest. Yesterday, Thursday May 14th, was the last day I had my stitches and stint in. The plastic surgeon was happy with the care I showed toward my injuries and said my progress had been ahead of schedule. I was less than 1/8th of in inch from losing an eye he told me, perhaps because of an angel looking over me. Unfortunately, I'm not counting on justice to be served in this case, the only justice Milwaukee was able to do is serve me with an underage drinking ticket and a citation for using a fake ID. So on top of an ambulance run, surgery, and permanent damage to my face, I face close to \$600 in tickets. Overall I'm just happy to be here, able to see, able to breathe, the rest will work itself out on its own. Now all I can do is learn, and stay away from those environments.

Once the Licenses Committee makes its recommendation, this recommendation is forwarded to the full Common Council for approval at its next regularly scheduled hearing. Important details for those wishing to provide information for the Licenses Committee to consider when making its recommendation:

- 1. The license application is scheduled to be heard at the above time. Due to other hearings running longer than scheduled, you may have to wait some time to provide your testimony.
- 2. You must appear in person and testify as to matters that you have personally experienced or seen. (You cannot provide testimony for your neighbor, parent or anyone else; this is considered hearsay and cannot be considered by the committee.)
- 3. No letters or petitions can be accepted by the committee (unless the person who wrote the letter or the persons who signed the petition are present at the committee hearing and willing to testify).
- 4. Persons opposed to the license application are given the opportunity to testify first; supporters may testify after the opponents have finished.
- 5. When you are called to testify, you will be sworn in and asked to give your name, and address. (If your first and/or last names are uncommon please spell them.)

- 6. You may then provide testimony.
- a. Include only information relating to the above license application.
- b. Include only information you have personally witnessed or seen.
- c. Provide concise and relevant information detailing how this business has affected or may affect the peaceful enjoyment of your neighborhood.
- d. If by the time you have the opportunity to testify, the information you wish to share has already been provided to the committee, you may state that you agree with the previous testimony. Redundant or repetitive testimony will not assist the committee in making its recommendation.
- 7. After giving your testimony, the members of the Licenses Committee and the licensee may ask questions regarding the testimony you have given or other factors relating to the license application.
- 8. Business Competition is not a valid basis for denial or non-renewal of a license.

Please Note: If you have submitted an objection to the above application your objection cannot be considered by the committee unless you personally testify at the hearing.

The Milwaukee Police Department's investigation regarding this application revealed the following:

- 1. On 12/15/2013 at 1:37am a Milwaukee police officer was notified by citizens that "a guy was bleeding in front of Dick's and needed help". The officer responded to Dick's Pizza (730 North Milwaukee Street) and discovered a subject seated on the ground with an injury to his fore head. Investigation revealed the injured subject had been involved in an altercation while inside the business and was escorted out by security. As he was being escorted out, the injured subject slipped on the floor and struck his head on the windowsill in the foyer of the business. The injured subject was conveyed to St. Mary's hospital where he received 12 stitches to close a laceration on his forehead. Milwaukee police incident # 133490009 filed.
- 2. On 01/10/2014 at 1:41am a subject, who identified himself as the manager at Dick's Pizza (730 North Milwaukee Street) exited the business and requested assistance from a police officer assigned to Code RED in the 700 Block of North Milwaukee Street. The officer entered the business and discovered a subject (James Haarsma) on the floor with an injury to his head, being assisted by a bouncer (Theophilus Brooks). Investigation revealed Haarsma had become loud and boisterous while inside the business and was asked to leave by Brooks. Haarsma's refused and his actions caused Brooks to fear for his safety. Brooks took Haarsma to the floor. Haarsma began to thrash around striking his head on a VIP rope stanchion. Police arrived shortly after Brooks began to administer first aid. Haarsma was cited for, and later convicted of, disorderly conduct.

- 3. On 04/12/14 at 11:40 pm, Milwaukee police investigated a sexual assault complaint that occurred at Dick's Pizza Pleasure. The victim, who is 20 years old, entered the establishment and consumed alcoholic beverages in the tavern to a level of intoxication. 5. On 04/13/14 at 2:00 am, Milwaukee police investigated an assault complaint that occurred at 730 N Milwaukee. Police spoke with the victim who stated she was in the VIP area of the tavern with a friend when she noticed that she misplaced her cell phone. The victim stated she talked with a bouncer at the club about her phone and that the bouncer told her to leave the club. According to the victim, this bouncer, as well as another bouncer physically assaulted her. The victim stated these bouncers physically carried her down a flight of stairs in a chokehold, dropped her on purpose, picked her back up by her hair, and dropped her a second time. She further stated she was kicked in her ribs and then was pushed out of the back door which caused her to fall to her knees and sprain her ankle. The victim was shown a photo array of possible suspects and the victim identified Husamuddeen Samara and Jaleel Shawar as the two bouncers who assaulted her. On 04/18/14 at 1:15 am, police conducted follow-up at Dick's Pizza and were told by management that both subjects had been terminated. The case is pending.

- 6. On 05/03/2014 a 20 year old Milwaukee police aide, working in conjunction with Milwaukee police, attempted to gain entry to Dicks Pizza (730 North Water Street) but was turned away when she could not produce proof she had attained the legal drinking age of 21.

On the evening of Saturday May 3rd, 2014 through the morning of Sunday May 4th, 2014 District One personnel performed an underage tavern enforcement initiative. The officers who participated in the operation were officers Robert FERRELL, District One, Power Shift, Jennifer RAMOS, District One, Late Shift, Anthony KRUEGER, District One, Early Shift, and myself. For the underage persons in this initiative we used two MPD police aides who work in the Police Administration Building. They were P.A. Paige CARLONI, W/F 12-15-93, Sensitive Crimes Day Shift, and P.A. Kourtney HARTL, W/F 06-18-94, Central Booking Day Shift.

Prior to attempting any checks of licensed class B tavern establishments the police aides were given instructions. CARLONI and HARTL were told that they were not allowed to consume any intoxicating beverages. They could not lie if asked if they were underage, or show any form of documentation, which could be construed as identification. It was explained that they had to order a Miller Lite Beer, directly from a bartender behind a bar, then meet the plainclothes officer observing them with the alcoholic beverage for a photo in the tavern and then leave together. It was explained that at all times the plainclothes officer shadowing them would be in visual sight and observe the financial transaction for alcoholic beverages.

After this briefing I escorted P.O. Anthony Krueger who was in plainclothes and P.A. HARTL. While P.O. FERRELL escorted P.O. RAMOS in plainclothes, and P.A. CARLONI to multiple taverns located throughout the District One boundaries.

P.A. CARLONI attempted to gained entry to the class "B" licensed tavern Dicks Pizza, 730 N. Milwaukee St. P.A. CARLONI was challenged at the point of entry and turned away when she couldn't prove she was of age.

Since there was no violation this tavern was not notified that this PA-33 was filed.

Upon arrival, I spoke with the caller, later identified as BOYD, Nicholas J (W/M, 08/20/83) who appeared to be very intoxicated outside the location. I observed BOYD to have a minor scratch on his forehead and was being looked at by Bell Ambulance 414. BOYD was shouting and being very uncooperative outside the location so we escorted him to the ambulance. I started to ask what happened and BOYD shouted, "Do you see my face?" I asked BOYD for a description and he stated, "4 white males between the ages of 28-32." BOYD would not give me any additional information and only stated the subject's were wearing, "nigger clothing." BOYD then continued to become very argumentative with me and refused to speak with me. I gave BOYD my contact information and advised to contact me if he had any additional information.

I spoke with bar manager, EDLER, Michael J (W/M, 01/03/79) who stated he was on the third floor of the tavern when his security staff advised him that there was an altercation on the second floor. EDLER stated security stated they had one subject on the first floor near the bathroom (BOYD). EDLER stated he did not see what happened and only observed BOYD to have a minor cut to his forehead. BOYD stated to ELDER he was fine and was leaving, and wanted to put "20% tip on my card." EDLER then left the location and arrived minutes later and then called the police regarding the incident.

At this time a sick/injured report was filed regarding BOYD'S injuries. Due to BOYD'S intoxication level and being very uncooperative at the time of the incident, I was unable to get any information regarding the battery complaint. EDLER stated there are no cameras on the second floor and no staff observed the actual incident. I could not locate any witness regarding this incident.

Sgt. Scott RANDOW spoke with the part owner of Dick's Tavern to see if there were any cameras outside the location. The part owner stated no and that all their money was invested into purchasing the property. I did not view any cameras from Dick's Tavern and other locations have pending camera footage.

Detective Elizabeth STEWART spoke with FRONTCZAK who stated he does not know the suspect who committed this act but recognizes him prior to this incident inside Dick's Tavern. Please see Detective STEWART'S supplement report for further information.

On Saturday, December 27th, 2014 at approximately 12:09 a.m. while on Squad 1448 (P.O. RYDZEWSKI and I) were flagged down by security for a battery which occurred inside Dick's nightclub. Upon arrival, we were met with BAJRAMI and observed that he was bleeding from his left eye. There was skin flapping over an open wound above his left eye. He stated his head, chest, side, eye, and wrist hurt and that he was knocked out/unconscious, during this event. While on scene, he pointed out one suspect and stated that the subject was one of the people who had assaulted him. P.O. RYDZEWSKI yelled "Hey man, come over here," and he complied. The subject was identified as Arnold NAQELLARI M/W 08/30/93. He remained on scene and we were able to speak with him.

P.O. RYDZEWSKI interviewed BAJRAMI who stated he knows Arnold. He stated Arnold worked for him about a year ago. BAJRAMI stated that he hired NAQELLARI as a dishwasher in one of his restaurants where he worked for three days. BAJRAMI stated one day Arnold showed up high, or under the influence of drugs, so he fired him. BAJRAMI stated he contacted his accountant and he paid Arnold for his time. BAJRAMI stated Arnold was not satisfied with the result and believes he was holding a grudge. BAJRAMI stated he is of Albanian descent, and so is Arnold, and stated he (BAJRAMI) believes that Albanians have been known to hold grudges like that.

On 12/28/2014 after midnight, BAJRAMI stated he went to Dicks to see Mike the manager. BAJRAMI stated he supplies the pizzas at Dicks. He stated he cooks the pizza at his restaurant Slice of NY and then brings them over to Dicks where they reheat them on site. He stated he set up his ovens, but has Dicks serve the pizzas because there's too much drama there. BAJRAMI stated he wanted to ask Mike how many pizzas he thought they would need for New Year's Eve.

BAJRAMI stated he walked in the door and that's when he ran into Arnold. BAJRAMI stated Arnold punched him with a closed fist in the upper chest, lower neck area causing pain. He stated he was then beat up by a total of four individuals, whom he has seen before and could identify. He stated they were Albanians too. BAJRAMI stated that after Arnold punched him he was immediately put into a headlock from behind by another person, (Suspect#2) later identified as Kico NASI. BAJRAMI stated another person (Suspect #3), later identified as Marsel FETO, began punching him numerous times on the left side of his face, while a different person (Suspect #4), later identified as Rokeldo JANKO, was then punching him on his left side or abdomen. He stated he thinks he was thrown against the side of a granite table or he could have possibly hit his head on a chair, but wasn't sure. He stated he blacked out after that and stated that was probably why the top of his head was hurting.

BAJRAMI was conveyed by ambulance to St Mary's Hospital at 12:20am on 12/28/2014. He was seen by Dr. Nathaniel BROWN at 2:28am. BAJRAMI was treated for a fractured right wrist, 8 stitches to his left eye, and 4 staples on the top of his head.

On Friday 01/02/15 at 1:30PM P.O. RYDZEWSKI took this case to the DA's office, room 110 for review. The victim, Besart BAJRAMI was present at the DA's office.

ADA Sarah McNUTT reviewed the case and decided to pend it until Monday 01/05/15 at 1:30PM. She ordered the victim to return to the DA's office on that date.

On Tuesday 01/06/2015 at 2PM P.O. RYDZEWSKI took this case back to the DA's office to meet with ADA Sarah McNUTT. P.O. RYDZEWSKI received a call from the victim, just prior to arrival, informing him that he would not be attending the meeting due to a death in the family.

P.O. RYDZEWSKI spoke to ADA McNUTT in the MCCH room 635. She stated she wished to pend this case until her next charging schedule on 02/09/2015. She stated she would get in contact with him in the meantime to set up a meeting with the victim.

On March 12, 2015 ADA Sarah McNUTT reviewed the case, and due to the victims non-appearance the case was no processed.

Thomas ACKLEY) performed a tavern check of the Dick's Pizza nightclub located at 730 North Milwaukee Street. This tavern check was part of an underage tavern enforcement initiative to ensure the tavern was operating in accordance with municipal ordinances.

Sgt. ACKLEY and I were acting in a uniformed capacity and remained outside and away from the tavern for the duration of this tavern check. P.O. Mariolys FLORES (District One) and P.A. Taylor SCHMITZ (Police Academy) performed the tavern check and acted in a plainclothes, undercover capacity. P.O. FLORES and P.A. SCHMITZ used an unmarked vehicle as transportation to each tavern check. P.A. SCHMITZ is nineteen years of age and unable to legally purchase or consume alcoholic beverages.

Prior to attempting any checks of licensed class B tavern establishments, both P.O. FLORES and P.A. SCHMITZ were given instructions by Sgt. ACKLEY. P.O. FLORES and P.A. SCHMITZ were told that they were not allowed to consume any intoxicating beverages, they could not lie if asked if they were underage nor could they show any form of identification. P.O. FLORES and P.A. SCHMITZ were instructed to attempt to enter each tavern and attempt to purchase alcohol. P.A. SCHMITZ was instructed to attempt to make the alcohol purchase from a tavern bartender. If a sale was made, P.O. FLORES and P.A. SCHMITZ were instructed to note the description of the bartender who sold them the alcoholic beverage, the location inside the tavern where the sale was made as well as the purchase price. While inside, both P.O. FLORES and P.A. SCHMITZ were instructed to use a small recording device to capture the sale of the beverage. If successful in the purchase of alcohol, P.A. SCHMITZ was also instructed to be photographed inside the tavern holding the alcoholic beverage with either her or P.O. FLORES' cellular phone. Both P.O. FLORES and P.A. SCHMITZ were instructed to keep me updated with the results of their tavern checks while still inside of the tavern. I then documented those results accordingly.

Upon attempting to gain entry to Dick's (a class B tavern), P.O. FLORES and P.A. SCHMITZ were challenged at the point of entry and turned away when they were unable to provide identification.

On Friday, 03-13-15 at 12:04AM, Squad 1442 (P.O. Mariolys FLORES and myself) responded to the Dick's tavern and notified 730 N. Milwaukee St. (W/M, 01-03-79) that there were no violations.

On the evening of Saturday May 3rd, 2014 through the morning of Sunday May 4th, 2014 District One personnel performed an underage tavern enforcement initiative. The officers who participated in the operation were officers Robert FERRELL, District One, Power Shift, Jennifer RAMOS, District One, Late Shift, Anthony KRUEGER, District One, Early Shift, and myself. For the underage persons in this initiative we used two MPD police aides who work in the Police Administration Building. They were P.A. Paige CARLONI, W/F 12-15-93, Sensitive Crimes Day Shift, and P.A. Kourtney HARTL, W/F 06-18-94, Central Booking Day Shift.

Prior to attempting any checks of licensed class B tavern establishments the police aides were given instructions. CARLONI and HARTL were told that they were not allowed to consume any intoxicating beverages. They could not lie if asked if they were underage, or show any form of documentation, which could be construed as identification. It was explained that they had to order a Miller Lite Beer, directly from a bartender behind a bar, then meet the plainclothes officer observing them with the alcoholic beverage for a photo in the tavern and then leave together. It was explained that at all times the plainclothes officer shadowing them would be in visual sight and observe the financial transaction for alcoholic beverages.

After this briefing I escorted P.O. Anthony Krueger who was in plainclothes and P.A. HARTL. While P.O. FERRELL escorted P.O. RAMOS in plainclothes, and P.A. CARLONI to multiple taverns located throughout the District One boundaries.

P.A. CARLONI attempted to gained entry to the class "B" licensed tavern The Harp Irish Pub, 113 E Juneau Av. P.A. CARLONI was challenged at the point of entry and turned away when she couldn't prove she was of age.

Since there was no violation this tavern was not notified that this PA-33 was filed.

This report is written by P.O. LATAWIEC 024285, assigned to District 1 Late Power.

On 07-26-14 at 3:13 am, my partner, P.O. Corstan D. COURT, and I were on foot patrol in the 100 block of E. Juneau Avenue when we observed a fight in front of the Harp tavern (113 E. Juneau Avenue).

After extinguishing the fight I interviewed one of the four victims, a security guard at TRINITY tavern (125 E Juneau), who also helps at the Harp tavern which is right across the street. WHITEHEAD, John R, W/M, 07-24-1988, stated he received a signal (a flashing flash light) from the security guard at the Harp. WHITEHEAD went across the street to see what the problem was. WHITEHEAD observed four black males harassing some females that were in line to enter the Harp. WHITEHEAD told the four individuals that they had to keep moving on and they could not be there harassing patrons. WHITEHEAD was then struck from behind in the head, by what he thought to be a closed fist from one of the black males. This individual was later identified as HARRIS, Randall E. B/M 02-27-1991.

I then spoke to ANDERSON, Aaron R, W/M, 07-31-1984, head of security at Trinity. ANDERSON, stated he observed WHITEHEAD being hit by the four suspects at the Harp, so ANDERSON ran across the street in an attempt to stop the fight. ANDERSON was then hit by two of the suspects, later identified as Michael T. OLIVER, B/M, 11-05-1986, and Curtis J. THOMAS, B/M, 06-29-1989. THOMAS delivered punches with a closed fist to the front and right side of ANDERSON's head. These punches were delivered intentionally and without the consent of the victims.

Also interviewed was KIMMITT, Sean T, W/M, 09-07-1991, employed as security at the Harp. KIMMITT, stated as he stepped in to stop the assault of WHITEHEAD and ANDERSON three of the black males grabbed KIMMITT and pulled him into the intersection of E. Juneau Avenue and N. Edison Street. HARRIS, THOMAS, and MICHAEL then continued to strike KIMMITT intentionally in the face with a closed fist—causing minor pain and injury.

The investigation led to the following individuals being arrested and cited for violations listed below.

HARRIS was given a citation for Battery.

THOMAS was given a citation for Battery.

OLIVER was given a citation for Battery.

WILLIAMS was given a citation for Disorderly Conduct.

A check of Harp revealed no video surveillance cameras.

During this investigation we could not locate any outside witnesses except the victims.

PA-33E Narrative

This report is written by Police Officer Donald Krenzien, assigned District One, Late Power Shift.

On the evening of Thursday, Febuary 26, 2015 through the morning of Friday, February 27, 2015 District One personnel performed an underage tavern enforcement initiative. The officers who participated in the operation were Police Officer Christopher Martin, assigned to District One, Police Officer Dorian Andress assigned to District 3, and myself. For the underage persons in this initiative we used one MPD police aide who work in the Police Administration Building. Police Aid Teresa Westfahl assigned to the Police Academy. Westfahl was confirmed to be underage by her Wisconsin identification card (2/17/1996)

Prior to attempting any checks of licensed class B tavern establishments the police aide and plainclothesed police officer were given instructions. Westphal and Andress were told that they were not allowed to consume any intoxicating beverages. They could not lie if asked if they were underage, or show any form of documentation, which could be construed as identification. It was explained that they had to order an alcoholic beverage, directly from a bartender behind a bar, then meet the plainclothes officer observing them with the alcoholic beverage for a photo in the tavern and then leave together. It was explained that at all times the plainclothes officer shadowing them would be in visual sight and observe the financial transaction for alcoholic beverages.

After this briefing Martin and I escorted P.O. Andress who was in plainclothes and P.A. Westfahl to multiple taverns located throughout the District One boundaries.

Westfahl and Andress attempted to gained entry to the class "B" licensed tavern, The Harp located at 113 E Juneau Street. Andress and Westfahl walked into the tavern and were not challenged because there was not a bouncer at the front door. Once in side of the tavern Westfahl purchased a Miller light glass at the bar for \$3.00. The bartender who served Westfahl was a W/F 22 to 25 years old, 5'6 to 5'7, approximately 140 to 150 lbs with long brown hair. The bartender was wearing a teal and white zip up jacket with blue jeans.
