This is to notify you that on July 17, 2007 the City's Licenses Committee voted to recommend to the City's Common Council that your renewal application for a Class "B" Tavern license for the premises at 2525 North Holton Street, Milwaukee, Wisconsin ("Montal's Lounge") be approved with a ninety (90) day suspension based upon a police report and neighborhood objections.

Honorable Members of the Common Council:

This Office has been retained to represent the licensee, Montal L. Hinton, regarding the renewal of his class "B" License for "Montal's Lounge". Pursuant to Section 90-12-5-c-2 of the Milwaukee Code of Ordinances, Montal Hinton does respectfully file these written objections to the July 19, 2007 Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law that were filed as a result of the renewal hearing on July 17, 2007. The Licensee and his representative will be present at the meeting of the Common Council on July 31, 2007 at 9:00 a.m. to present oral argument.

The Licensee appeared before the License Committee on July 17, 2007 without an Attorney, however he did have two witnesses to address specific items in the Police Report. The witnesses were two staff members of Montal's Lounge and were working on the nights that were reported by the Police Department. This was the first time that Montal Hinton was before the Committee since his initial hearing when his license was granted. The Committee decided to recommend re-issuance of the License with a 90 day suspension.

It is the position of the Licensee that the recommendation, in no way, represents progressive discipline. If forced to be closed for 90 days the Licensee will most likely not be able to endure the financial hardship and be forced to go out of business. Progressive discipline is required by the equal protection clause of the 14th Amendment to the Constitution and has been an accepted principle by the Common Council for many years.

Furthermore, the Licensee submits that the facts in the submitted Findings of Fact do not

demonstrate a need for a 90 day suspension. The Police Report contained three items that were related to the location. The first item which appears as paragraph 5. C of the Findings of Fact concerned an incident of gun fire outside the establishment well after the establishment was closed. As the establishment operates with its clocks advanced 15 minutes, and regularly closes a half hour early, the establishment was closed for nearly 30 minutes. The Police Report indicated that the gun was fired at 2:19 a.m. If the incident occurred at that time, the clock in the bar would have been on 2:34 a.m., which given a 30 minute early closing time the bar was already closed for one half hour. The Licensee was present and testified that he did hear a gun, and checked it out. That no persons were allowed into the bar because it was closed for the evening. Upon checking outside to determine what happened the Licensee and his staff found an empty street. The Licensee herein denies and denied to the Police that there was any altercation in the bar on that evening or anything else that would cause him to believe that the incident was related to Montal's Lounge. Unfortunately, gunshots in the surrounding neighborhood are not that uncommon.

The second incident in the Police Report as stated in paragraph 5. D of the Findings of Fact recount an incident on May 20, 2007 at 1:30 a.m. The Police responded to a complaint about somebody with a gun, but no such item could be found or substantiated. The Police noted that the location appeared crowded, but no actual head count was conducted, nor was any citation issued. As no gun or citation was issued, this non-incident should hardly give rise to a warning letter, much less a suspension. Therefore, this incident should not be considered at all.

The third incident in the Police Report as stated in paragraph 5. E of the Findings of Fact discusses an incident on May 24, 2007 when Police were looking for a Robbery subject. The Police alleged that Mr. Hinton was argumentative. Mr. Hinton denies that he was argumentative and only expressing that an area in which the Police wanted to search, was not open to the patrons and was not part of the listed premises in the License application. It is true that the Police came back to a locked door, however, this was done out of the concern that there was a Robbery suspect in the area, and bars and their patrons are often victimized by such individuals.

Three neighbors testified against the Licensee. Two of these witnesses were married and offered a video tape that they claimed showed extensive noise, patrons congregating after hours, and acts of public urination. None of these things were present on the video. The video only showed that Holton street is a busy street, with many cars traveling through the area that were obviously not patrons of Montal's Lounge. Concerning the patrons outside the Licensee has checked the street after he closes and does announce to people to leave quietly. In this regard the Licensee has a plan to add security, including a private security company with a car to ensure that people do not loiter.

The first neighbor to testify lived at 2543 N. Holton and testified about noise from people loitering and playing music. She submitted several discs of videos to the Committee that didn't show any incident anywhere near the magnitude of what she testified about in her oral statement. She stated that she called the Police at least 6 times since October of 2006 but could not actually produce her own written records or official Police records to prove the calls were made. When she

was questioned by Committee members about the calls she only had notes of a call in April, one in May, and one in July. She told the same story twice about the same incident involving an object thrown at her husband because the people were objecting to being filmed. She also stated that she wanted to talk to Mr. Hinton about the incident, but the Police told her not to. She stated that her husband had spoke to Mr. Hinton, however, when he testified he stated that he only talked to the previous owner, and never raised the issues with Mr. Hinton. After reviewing the video's and considering the inconsistencies in the witnesses testimony, it is clear that she has over exaggerated the nature of the incidents and the amount of the incidents. Mr. Hinton believes that there have been times that people have been talking, and maybe someone has urinated, but he submits to the Council that these incidents are isolated and preventable with some diligence on his part. Unfortunately these issues were not brought to his attention so that he could be made aware that his checking the area after closing was not enough of a presence on the street.

Mr. Hinton is aware of his responsibilities and is making sure that he closes early and has added additional personnel to keep people moving from the establishment to their cars, and leaving immediately and quietly. There are certain houses on the block where people do sit outside and do make some noise. Generally it could be seen in the video submitted, that cars associated with the bar were already gone, as there were empty places on the street. There were three or four individuals in the street that were engaged in a conversation in front of the house that they were visiting.

Attached hereto and incorporated by reference is a written plan for Montal's Lounge. It is short because satisfying the neighborhood concerns is the issue. Generally, the business is operated pursuant to ordinance and law. There have been no citations issued for underage drinking, noise, or any other violation of Ch. 90 of the Milwaukee Ordinances. There have been no incidents of violence, guns, knives, or fights, inside the establishment. However, Mr. Hinton will work to satisfy the neighborhood concerns by making sure he closes 30 minutes before legal closing time, increases security to escort people to their cars and make sure they are quiet, and add additional signs inside to put patrons on notice to leave and be quiet.

Montal Hinton understands that his neighbors are entitled to enjoy a peaceful and quiet neighborhood. He will take the necessary steps to aid in this endeavor, and will remain available for any one to speak to him on a daily basis. As Mr. Hinton understands his duties and that he has to take steps to meet these obligations, he is very fearful of a 90 day suspension. Because he has never been before the Committee before he respectfully requests that the 90 days be amended to something far less, and he does not object to having the matter sent back to the Committee for reconsideration.

Report on the renewal application of the Class "B" Tavern license of Montal L. Hinton for the license premises at 2525 North Holton Street in the City and County of Milwaukee, Wisconsin ("Montal's Lounge").

FINDINGS OF FACT

- 1. Montal L. Hinton (hereinafter the "Licensee") is the holder of a Class "B" Tavern license for the premises at 2525 North Holton Street in the City and County of Milwaukee, Wisconsin ("Montal's Lounge"). Said license expires at midnight, September 25, 2007.
- 2. An application to renew said license was filed with the Office of the City Clerk on May 29, 2007.
- 3. Pursuant to Chapter 90 of the Milwaukee Code of Ordinances and Chapter 125 of the Wisconsin Statutes, the matter was referred to the Milwaukee Police Department for investigation. On May 30, 2007, the Milwaukee Police Department responded with a police report that could form a basis for non-renewal or suspension of said license. There were also neighborhood objections to loitering, littering, loud music and noise, shootings, drug and criminal activity and conduct which is detrimental to the health, safety, and welfare of the neighborhood.
- 4. On July 6, 2007 the City Clerk's Office provided timely notice to the Licensee pursuant to Chapter 90 of the Milwaukee Code of Ordinances and Chapter 125 of the Wisconsin Statutes of the neighborhood objections and of the report of the Milwaukee Police Department and included therewith a copy of the Milwaukee Police Department report. The matter was scheduled for a hearing on the Police Department report and neighborhood objections on July 17, 2007, commencing at 11:00 a.m. in Room 301B of City Hall, 200 East Wells Street, Milwaukee, Wisconsin 53202. At said date, time and place, the licensee appeared and

- admitted receipt of the notice and police report. He was not represented by counsel.
- 5. Based upon the sworn testimony heard and the evidence received at the hearing, the Committee finds the following:
 - A. On August 16, 2002 the applicant was cited by the City of Milwaukee for a building and zoning violation-exterior wood surface protection. The licensee was charged with this offense and found guilty on July 31, 2003 and fined \$100.00.
 - B. On July 29, 2006, the applicant was charged with violate/harassment restraining order in Milwaukee County. On December 12, 2006 the licensee was found guilty of this charge and fined.
 - C. On March 18, 2007 at 3:04 a.m. officers of the Milwaukee Police Department were dispatched to the licensed premises at 2525 North Holton Street, Milwaukee, Wisconsin ("Montal's Lounge") to check for a shooting scene. Officers spoke to Montal Hinton, the licensee who stated he heard shots fired from outside of his tavern and his tavern was closed. The licensee, Hinton, stated he had his security check outside to make sure no one was hurt. Security found no one outside. The investigation revealed that a shooting did occur with the victim stating to police that it occurred at 2:19 a.m. and that the tavern was open at the time. The victim stated he was standing with security, which would not let him in the bar, when a vehicle stopped in the middle of the street with the passenger getting out of the car shooting a gun towards the bar. When police questioned Mr. Hinton as to why he did not call police when he heard shots being fired, Mr. Hinton stated his bar was already closed for 10 minutes and he had no altercations inside the bar. When officers asked Mr. Hinton for his licenses, Mr. Hinton became irritated and rude. Officers observed cameras in the interior and exterior of the business and advised Mr. Hinton that they would need the tapes and Mr. Hinton stated he could not get them now, but would give the tapes to officers the following day. Officers located two casings in front of 2520 North Holton Street. At the hearing in this matter Mr. Hinton continued to insist that the bar was closed at the time of the shooting and that the police come fifteen to twenty minutes for a call on a subject with a gun.
 - D. On May 20, 2007 at 1:30 a.m. officers of the Milwaukee Police
 Department were dispatched to a subject with a gun at 2525 North
 Holton Street. The investigation revealed that officers found the tavern
 to be crowded with people to the point it appeared there was no room to
 move. A rough head count was done and officers estimated

approximately 100 to 110 patrons in the bar. The capacity of the licensed premises is 80. The gun call was found to be baseless. Mr. Hinton, at hearing, complained that the officers entered with shotguns drawn. However, the police department explained that is normal procedure. No citations were issued to Mr. Hinton.

E. On May 24, 2007 at 11:50 p.m., officers of the Milwaukee Police Department responded to the area of 2500 block of North Holton Street, to check the area for possible suspects for a robbery. The officer entered Montal's Loung e at 2525 North Holton Street and spoke to the bartender, Montal Hinton. He told the officer the suspect had not entered the premises. The officer told the subject that he needed to check the premises in order to ensure that the suspect was not present. As he checked for the suspect in an unlocked door to a storage area, which was accessible to the patrons, Mr. Hinton became argumentative and told him that the officer could not search the tavern and needed to respect him.

At the hearing in this matter, Mr. Hinton insisted that the officers were about to enter an area for tenants of the building and that the door in question is normally locked.

The officer continued the search for the suspect outside of the tavern, but returned to 2525 North Holton Street at approximately 12:00 a.m., to obtain Mr. Hinton's na me, when officers found the entrance door locked, with patrons inside of the open tavern and business was still being conducted. When Mr. Hinton was informed that he had to keep the door to the tavern unlocked, he said something to the effect then next time close the door. Mr. Hinton was issued a citation for license premises accessible which is pending. Mr. Hinton, at hearing, told the Committee his customers prefer that the door be locked.

- F. There were also neighbors who appeared and testified to the noise and disturbances and who also produced video tapes of the premises after closing.
- G. The neighbors complain that patrons of this establishment regularly leave at bar closing time and continue to party and make disturbing noise until 2:30 or 2:45 a.m.
- H. Neighbors complain of illegal drug use by patrons, outside, after bar closing.

I. Neighbors complain of numerous acts of public urination and sexual activity by patrons after closing. They also complain of prostitutes plying their trade on and after closing.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

- 1. The Committee has jurisdiction to hold hearings and provide Findings of Fact, Conclusions of Law and a Recommendation to the full Common Council pursuant to Chapter 125 of the Wisconsin Statutes and Chapter 90 of the Milwaukee Code of Ordinances.
- 2. Based upon the above facts found, the Committee finds that the licensee, Montal L. Hinton, has not met the criteria of Chapter 125, Wis. Stats. or Chapter 90 of the Milwaukee Code of Ordinances to allow renewal of the Class "B" Tavern license held by the licensee without undergoing a ninety (90) day suspension. The Committee finds the police report and neighborhood objections as stated above to be true.
- 3. The Committee recommends that the full Common Council of the City of Milwaukee exercise its judgment to renew the Class "B" Tavern license for the licensed premises at 2525 North Holton Street in the City and County of Milwaukee, Wisconsin ("Montal's Lounge") held by Montal L. Hinton with a ninety (90) day suspension based upon the danger that his conduct represents to the health, safety and welfare of the citizens of the City of Milwaukee.

RECOMMENDATION

Based upon the Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law stated above, the Committee, by a vote of three (3) ayes and two (2) noes recommends that the Class "B" Tavern license held by Montal L. Hinton for the premises at 2525 North Holton Street in the City and County of Milwaukee, Wisconsin ("Montal's Lounge") be renewed with a ninety (90) day suspension.

The suspension is to be in effect between 12:01 a.m. September 26, 2007 and midnight, December 24, 2007.

Investigation revealed that a shooting did occur with the victim stating to police that it occurred at 2:19 am and that the tavern was open at the time. The Milwaukee 10 Police Department, as part of this revocation 11 proceeding, filed a police report regarding the 12 incident of - -13 First of all, there was, in fact, a 14 15 5,000 dollar fine for over-capacity, which was entered on April 16th, 2007. There was an 16 incident on October 21st, 2006 where the police 17 department determined that a shooting did occur. 18 There were 12 casings found in the parking lot to 19 the entrance of the tavern, and basically the 20 department determined that a fight broke out 21 inside the bar, and then some of the patrons went 22 23 to the parking lot, and there were three to four shots that were fired, although they found more 24

casings.

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And then on June 24th, 2007 it is true that the police department was called for a complaint of a shooting, and apparently a patron was escorted outside of the bar. He had a firearm. He went into the parking lot and therewere some shots that were fired.

Among the people that testified at the hearing were a number of people from an institution known as Teen Challenge, which is in some proximity to this particular location. And they testified to the fact that, in part because of the shootings that have occurred at this place, they move residents of this facility around in order to help protect them to make sure that shots are not fired into the - - into the facility.

As always, whether or not you revoke this license is reposed to your sound discretion. Whether or not you suspend this license or the tavern entertainment license is, again, reposed to your sound discretion and the length of any such suspension, naturally, is reposed to your sound discretion. The time limits are minimum of ten days, maximum of 90 days, should you decide to suspend. The committee obviously recommended

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1	a suspension of the Class "B" Tavern license for
2	a period of 90 days, and revocation of the Tavern
3	Entertainment license. If there's any questions,
4	I'll be happy to try to answer them.
5	PRESIDENT HINES: Thank you. The Chair

I believe everyone on the Council is familiar with the idea of progressive discipline. It is something that hopefully everybody strives to. A 90 day suspension, of course, is the maximum by State law. And a 90 suspension has great ramifications for Mr. Hinton. He will lose employees. 90 days is three months, a quarter of the year. He will lose a customer base, and he

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00022 will lose the ability to have any income for 90 1 days, which is quite a burden for anybody to 2 3 expect. The issue, as it seemed to me at the hearing, involved testimony of three citizens, 5 two of whom were married, two of them recently 6 bought a home in the area. They've put the home 7 up for sale. They were concerned about their 8 property value, which is appropriate. And they .9. 10 were concerned about certain activities that they perceive taking place, and they perceive those 11 activities to be caused by Montal's Lounge. As 12 you all know, I'm not one ever to sit here and 13 deny that certain things don't take place outside 14 of a tavern after closing hours. But I feel in 15 16 this case, as in many cases, this is a big over-17 exaggeration. This - - The partic - - The particular witness, a lady, she talked about how 18 19 numerous time she called the police. When she 20 was pinned down and asked by a member of the 21 committee, she had notes of three incidents. She 22 talked about the same incident over and over. 23 And that incident, of course, is regrettable. 24 And it is taken very seriously by my client. My client is now - - He was then, and 25

The objecting neighbor - - Or one of 16 . 17 the objecting neighbors presented some DVDs to the committee. There's - - I suppose one could 18 argue about the quality of those particular DVDs. 19 20 The neighbors testified and had evidence of 21 significant noise that disturbs them at all hours 22 of the day and night emanating from this 23 location. The DVDs do, in fact, tend to show 24 that there is noise outside of this location, and 25 whether or not you believe the - - the witnesses,
