#### **DETAILED DESCRIPTION OF CLAIM:** В.

This claim stems from the conduct exhibited by an elected city official.

On November 13, 2006, I applied for the Class B – Tavern license. I completed the application in it's entirely. The location that I was seeking the liquor license for is 5950 N. 76<sup>th</sup> Street. This location is the former Jimbo's Pizza, which had a Class B - liquor license for 32 years. Renewal was not sought because the business closed July 2006. There had been no major concerns that would have caused a denial for the license.

I was seeking to open the business as a casual sit down restaurant, as it had previously been. I would continue to use the bar that had been in the location for years. My only change was in the acquisition of the other side of the building. My hopes were to have a small banquet room and possible gainer poor for

At the time of application, I was forthright with this information. It was all placed on the application. I inquired as to when would be the next Licensing Meeting. on the application. I inquired as to when would be none in December. But hopefully for January Isubstituted could be on the schedule.

In mid December, I contacted Alderman Davis. We finally connected in January. A meeting was scheduled for Wednesday January 17, 2007. I met with Alderman Davis. At the meeting, we briefly discussed the plan of operation. I brought with me as requested a 1-page sheet that showcased our plan of operation, menu

and possible activities. The alderman stated that based on my menu, my clientele would be different from the former. Alderman Davis did not voice any serious objections to the application.

I was told by the Alderman that I needed to contact various individuals — Tyrone Dumas & Dawn Baker (from the Grantosa Heights Block Club), the owner of the shopping center, the daycare nearby. I did all of this and contacted the Alderman's office to follow-up about a week later.

I had the opportunity to speak to the Alderman; I advised him that I have completed his requested tasks. I told him that I had the opportunity to speak to Mr. Dumas and that he was fine with our plan. I stated to him that I spoke to the shopping center owner and he advised me that he had no problems with our patrons parking in the lot. It had been assumed that they would park there.

Alderman Davis asked me if I was able to secure a written agreement. I told him that the shopping center owner stated that he did not have a written agreement with Jimbo's and did not feel like this situation warranted one. I also advised him that the shopping center had no problems with patrons parking in the lot.

Alderman Davis stated that he wanted someone responsible when parking problems arose. I stated that if I needed I would make an agreement with him (the Alderman) personally that if my patrons caused problems or damage. I would be responsible. The Alderman stated that he would not move forward on this issue.

During the weeks of January 29 and February 4, I attempted to follow up with the Alderman. I sent the Alderman an e-mail on February 4<sup>th</sup>, 2007. I received no response.

On February 7, I spoke to Sherman Morton, Ald. Davis Legislative Aide, he scheduled an appointment for Monday February 12, 2007 at 1pm. Around 12pm, I received a call from Mr. Morton stating that he had to cancel my appointment because there was a conflict on the Alderman's schedule. I attempted to reschedule the appointment but was told that I would need to contact the Alderman. I attempted to contact the Alderman for the next 2 weeks. I left messages but received no return phone calls. I sent the Alderman an e-mail but again received no response.

On February 24, 2007, I attended the Grantosa Heights Block Club. Alderman Davis was also in attendance. I presented our plan. I advised the group that we would keep the charm that Jimbo's had - keeping it as a neighborhood restaurant. But planned to modernize it by trying to keep the restaurant on one level, adding security cameras, and catering more to the diversity of the

neighborhood. They appeared to like the idea. We talked about the game room and the additional bathroom that would be added by having the new side. I clarified the fact we would not be a tavern, nightclub, or just a bar. I also clarified that we were not seeking a Cabaret license but the same license that Jimbo held for the last 32 years. Previously, I was advised by Mrs. Baker that they were told that I was seeking a Cabaret license.

At the meeting, Alderman Davis discussed his objections. He was concerned that there would be parking issues because I had not secured a written agreement with the shopping center owner. He stated that he had a problem drug activity - "We have a problem with drug activity in this neighborhood. I have a problem with drug activity on 65<sup>th</sup> and Carmen. I don't want this to become a source of drug activity. Soon after that statement, the Alderman left. One of the block club residents later stated "Just to clarify... "Tamara, you not selling drugs on 65<sup>th</sup> and Carmen?"

After the meeting, I again attempted to contact the Alderman to follow up and discuss the possibility of getting scheduled. I called Mr. Morton and was advised me that I would need to contact the Alderman because his scheduled was closed until the end of March. It was not until March 7<sup>th</sup>, that I was able to talk to the Alderman.

I started by inviting the Alderman to my location to see what we planned to do. In that phone conversation, the Alderman stated "You were going to have some problems." I asked him why. He said that I have been talking to the block clubs in the area and they have problems with your plan. I asked what problems. He did not tell me what the problems were. I also asked him which block club did attend so that I could contact them and possibly come and talk to their block club. He refused and became very defensive. He stated that he would not give me that information because he did not want to subject them to my phone calls. At that point, I stated to the Alderman that it would only be fair to advise me of the block meeting when you are talking about us. So that we have the opportunity to speak on our behalf. The Alderman told me "Since you feel so slighted don't call my cell phone. All your calls need to go through my office". I stated to the Alderman that I have been calling your office phone for weeks. I have not received any response. You have given me your cell phone number to contact you. I have no problem with calling your office phone. At that our conversation ended. I reminded the Alderman that I was also one of his constituents also.

After this conversation, I contempt contacting the Common Council President, but was advised against. I was told by a resident that when you make the Alderman mad, he'll find away to get back at you.

On March 8<sup>th</sup>, I submitted a request to remove the Tavern Dance and Billiard Hall from our original application. I included this in the original application as the Billiard Hall and Tavern Dance. We originally planned for 3 pool tables, but eventually we were told by the amusement dealer that we would only be able to place 2 in the location. We were seeking the Tavern Dance for the possible banquet hall. It was our belief it would allow those who rented the banquet hall to be able to dance. It was never for the restaurant space itself. We removed this because I found myself not at a point in which to have a banquet hall. I contacted the Alderman's office and confirmed with Mr. Morton receipt via fax. I also sent a copy to the Alderman specifically via e-mail. I never received any communication back from him in regards to it.

And I waited and waited. It was not until March 27<sup>th</sup>, when I received a phone call from Mr. Morton, Alderman Davis's legislative aide, when I received an invite to a meeting held at Christ Tabernacle Church on March 29<sup>th</sup>.

I attended the meeting thinking that this would be an opportunity for me discuss our plan with another group of neighbors. What I attended was a lynching. The first resident that stood up stated "I went around the neighborhood and talked to residents and they don't want a tavern in this neighborhood. " Various residents stood up and again stated we don't want any taverns in our neighborhood.

I stated to them that I planned a casual sit down restaurant. I even stated that we would have signature meals, and have a full restaurant menu. I mentioned some of the items on our menu. I explained to the residents that I was seeking the same Class B Tavern license that Jimbo's had for 32 years. I was told that my patrons would bring problems. I was told that they would start cruising. I was told that having pool tables would cause gambling. I likened our concept to a Dave and Buster's establishment, which has an upscale billiard hall and game room. One resident stated that he would not have a problem with us seeking liquor license if we were going to be a restaurant. I clarified again to him that we would be a restaurant.

The Alderman made a number of statements including saying that our restaurant would bring in problems. He also stated that we would bring down property values. The whole meeting seemed as though it had been prepared for the resident to be adamant against whatever plan I had. He again mentioned the fact that drug activity would be present and insinuated that we would be culprits. I left out the meeting feeling ambushed. I felt that this was payback for me questioning the Alderman.

Before leaving I asked the Alderman to stop by my house. He did, we discussed the speeders in my neighborhood. I also advised that I would let him know what

I would do in regards to the liquor license. That was the last conversation and last time I spoke to the Alderman on March 29, 2007.

I am seeking an appeal because I feel that a miscarriage of justice has occurred. I know that misleading statements were presented to committee to be considered as fact when it was known to be false. Statements were also made that were discriminatory in nature and caused an adverse effect.

The Alderman states that I attended 3 community meetings. I attended only two block club meetings. The first on February 24, 2007 which was for Grantosa Heights. The second was an emergency meeting on March 29, 2007, initiated by Alderman Davis. I never attended a meeting held by Havenwoods Economic Development Corporation. The Alderman states at the Committee Meeting (1:42:38) - that Ms. Norwood was given the opportunity to discuss her plan at three different community meetings (lists the community meetings) and at all three she was told that the community was not in support of her operation. This was a misleading statement.

One of the issues that I had a problem with when in discussion with the Alderman was the fact that he was going to these block club meeting and discussing the restaurant and calling it a bar or tavern. He did not give me a courtesy call to inform me of the meeting. In talking to one of the block club captains, it was disclosed to me that he was calling it a tavern and bar. I attempted to clarify this at each meeting I attended.

To clarify, the plan of operation that was presented to both block clubs by me was that of a restaurant with a bar. It included a game room, which would have pool tables and other amusement games. Also it was indicated I had plans to have a small banquet room. The items that were officially removed from the license (Tavern Dance and Billiard Hall) on March 8<sup>th</sup>, 2007 were never discussed. The same plan of operation was presented to the Licensing Committee. This was neither a last minute change nor something that was not presented to the block clubs. I reference Juliette Morse testimony (1:55:52) "... Ms. Norwood, she specifically told us that it would be a restaurant, bar, and two pool tables."

I would also reference the Alderman's March 29<sup>th</sup>, 2007 meeting announcement in which it states "...is applying for a Class B Tavern license with cigarette sells, 2 pool tables and amusement games on premises. There is a banquet facility being proposed."

At no point by me, were the block clubs told that I was opening up a tavern or bar. What was presented to the block clubs was what was presented to Alderman Davis and the Licensing Committee.

When asked by Alderman Wade if during his (Ald. Davis's) correspondence with the applicant – (1:45:58) did the question about the bar and dance and all of

those issues came up... And you expressed to her your feelings? Yes, Alderman Davis states. When you expressed your feelings was amenable to that? No, actually what she... you will hear from neighbors and community, she indicated that in fact she would move forward without community support.

At no point did Alderman Davis state to me what use he would be supportive of. He was presented with a casual restaurant with a bar. This was similar to the previous use. Again he makes an untrue statement in saying that I stated would move forward without community support. I never once indicated that I would move forward to the community nor to Alderman Davis. I attempted to work with the Alderman as much as possible. I attempted to contact him regularly to discuss the project but would receive no response.

The Alderman acknowledges that he did receive my request to remove the Tavern Dance and Billiard Hall on March 8<sup>th</sup>. He also states that he received this information after I attended all the community meetings. This was untrue. I attended the second meeting on March 29, which is in contrary to his statement at the Committee Meeting.

Alderman Davis brings into question issues of trust because I used two last names. I have used my maiden and married name interchangeably. When I filled for the formation of LLC, I completed it in my married name of Owens. I completed the licensing and subsequent paperwork for the restaurant in Norwood-Thomas because this is what my ID states. I have never had problems when I do this. The Alderman states that how can a person be trusted if they use two names.

I conclude that this is a personal issue that the Alderman had. As a married woman, I have two names. That's the truth of the matter. He met me as Ms. Norwood-Thomas. I responded to him as Ms. Norwood-Thomas. If he had a question, as to what would be my name — it would have been simple for him to contact me and ask me before we came to the Committee Meeting. But he chose not to. This has been his conduct through out of my dealings with him.

The Alderman states that he never received a menu, which is not completely true. It is true that he never received a complete menu because we had not completed it in January when we met. But he was well aware that the location would have a complete menu because it was discussed with him about the signature sandwiches, and complete menu including appetizers and salads. He received a sneak peek of what would be on the menu. I also discussed the fact that we would be seeking to provide a lunchtime menu for businesses in the neighborhood. I also discussed the menu at each block club meetings. Menu items were specifically mentioned and detailed. I am including the Plan of Operation that was provided to the Alderman with this document. Again if the

Alderman had a question in regards to my menu, I was merely a phone call or email response away. He never contacted me and requested a completed menu.

The Alderman states that that I revealed that the locations use would be a bar. This is a falsehood. At no point did I tell the Alderman it would be a bar. From the beginning, I told the Alderman that we would be a restaurant with a bar and game room. He received our plan of operation, which clearly states that we would be a restaurant, a place of eating. One of the residents, Juliette Morse, was clear in her statement (1:55:52)"... she specifically told us that it would be a restaurant, bar and 2 pool tables". Our marketing material also states that our goal is to provide "great food, great fun, great place". Under no circumstatance was the goal to provide only drinks.

It is my belief that the Alderman's misunderstanding and statements were detrimental in my dealings with neighborhood residents. It is very hard to discount the statements of elected official. We, as constituents, tend to believe and accept their word as truth. This is what happened in my case. The Alderman said it was a bar. It was accepted and believed.

Alderman Davis makes light of my criminal conviction to indicate that I would be criminal in dealings with the restaurant. "I know that Sgt. Ulicki brought up a past conviction and that conviction was the distribution of cocaine. And I am very much concerned that with that particular conviction and the questionable application, I believe that this is an applicant that truly will not represent the community's best interest. So I hope that the Committee would take the position and not grant this license." (2:25:39).

First of all, my conviction is **NOT** for the distribution of cocaine. It is "Possession with Intent to Deliver" which is significantly different from the distribution. I was arrested in 1995 and convicted in 1996. This is the first and only conviction IN MY LIFE (Juvenile and Adult). When Sgt. Ulicki, discusses my conviction (1:38:19), he states "nothing in the previous 5 years — she does have a conviction from 1995." At no point does he detail the conviction. He was very general in nature. My conviction is nearly eleven years old. I have maintained a life consistent with the rest of society. I was honest in my application and detailed it there. I think that it is unfair for the Alderman to attribute an incident that happened over eleven years with the person that I am today. It is my understanding that MPD had no objections otherwise it would have been detailed.

The fact that the Alderman chose to detail my criminal background as an indication of how I would run my business is discriminatory to say the least. The inference he made as to drug activity being part of the business was improper. At no point prior, did the Alderman address the criminal conviction before

Committee Meeting. To bring it to the Committee Meeting showcases the type of behavior that is retaliatory in nature that I speak of. It is the "I'm going to get you by whatever means necessary."

It is my understanding that my criminal background was released to neighbors. It was circulated by the block clubs to the residents to keep me from opening up the business and to ensure attendance at the Committee Meeting.

On June 1<sup>st</sup>, I received a letter in the mail dated on May 30<sup>th</sup>, 2007 from Ronald Leonhardt stating that my application had been completely denied by the full Common Council. I viewed this to be the end to my request for a liquor license at the Former Jimbo's location.

#### C. CLAIMS FOR DAMAGES

**Discrimination** – (RACIAL) Alderman Davis made statements to the claimant in regards to the type of clientele she would have at her location. He made inference that since the menu would be different the clientele would also be different. He stated to the claimant that "I love my Black People but you know that they don't know how to act."

This type of mentality was detrimental in the securing a liquor license for the claimant. If this was one of the factors that caused Alderman Davis to go against the application it is was illegal and discriminatory.

Ross v. Douglas County, 234 F.3d 391, 393 & 395-97 (8th Cir. 2000)

**Discrimination** – (CRIMINAL CONVICTION) Alderman Davis when at the Licensing Committee Meeting details the issue that Ms. Norwood-Thomas has a criminal background. He induces that her having a liquor license at the Former Jimbo's location will make a criminal hotspot.

Ms. Norwood-Thomas's criminal conviction is over 11 years old. She has had NO other criminal convictions. She has maintained employment consistently throughout her lifetime including her time of incarceration. She has been off of supervision for over 7 years. She has maintained a professional career and has been an exemplary employee.

The fact that Alderman Davis would attempt to paint Ms. Norwood-Thomas as a treat to the neighborhood amounts to discrimination and a violation of WI Stat. 111.321.

**Defamation of Character** – Alderman Davis made defamatory statements to various people involving the character of Ms. Norwood-Thomas and the intentions of her restaurant.

Statements were made to attorneys, block club residents, and council members when at the Licensing Meeting.

942.01 Defamation. (1) (2)

Misleading Statements - On numerous occasions, Alderman Davis made misleading statements, which became detrimental in Ms. Norwood-Thomas's attempts to secure a liquor license. These statements were initially made to the Grantosa Block Club where Alderman Davis stated that the business was going to be a bar. He made numerous statements when at the Licensing Committee Meeting. He continued to make the same statements when in fact he had in his possession a plan of operation in which we detail our business operation. The business was always intended to be a restaurant with a bar. Never just a bar.

#### D. AMOUNT OF CLAIM

The claimant seeks general damages for the discriminatory actions that have occurred. The claimant seeks general damages for the defamation that occurred. The claimant seeks special damages with respect to the loss of potential income her business could have obtained. Finally, the claimant requests exemplary damages for the sake of example and by way of punishing the responsible public employees/agents for their actions.

Claimant is informed and believed that the public employees/agents possessed a state of mind arising from the ill will toward the claimant. Accordingly, the acts of public employees were made with actual malice, and were fraudulent and justify the imposition of punitive damages.

Claimant's damages are currently unknown, but are anticipated to be well in excess of \$2,000,000, but regardless are in excess of the minimal jurisdictional limits of a civil case.

# Plan of Operation for Frank's Place

Frank's Place is located at 5950 N. 76<sup>th</sup> St in Milwaukee, Wisconsin. It will occupy space formally used by Jimbo's Pizza. Frank's Place is an entity under the Wisconsin LLC of Woodland Entertainment Group, LLC (WEG, LLC).

Frank's Place will create a friendly atmosphere for customers where they will feel at home. We look to provide the best possible value to our customers who desire great tasting food and drinks. Our customers will have the satisfaction of receiving a great value, both tangibly and intangibly.

Frank's Place will occupy about 8000 sq feet of space at the location, which is the entire building. In this location it will be able to provide the neighborhood with a comfortable place to be for entertainment. Our goal is to create a "Cheers"—like atmosphere. It will be a restaurant with a bar. It will also have hall and party room rentals, pool tables and dart machines and other coin operated entertainment devices.

We will also have TV's through out the location, which will play various sports or news programs. Occasionally, we will use satellite radio through our TV system. A few nights a month will may have a DJ or Karaoke.

Frank's Place will be open 7 days a week. Sunday through Wednesday it will be open from 11am to 11pm. On Thursday, Friday and Saturday, Frank's Place will be open from 11am to 1:30am. Our kitchen will close 30 minutes before the restaurant closes (e.g. on Mondays- the kitchen will close for 10:30pm).

We expect to have a menu for lunch and dinner – which will include items such as mozzarella cheese sticks, sandwiches/subs. We will also have meal specials such as Soul Food Dinners, Fish Dinners, BBQ specials.

At full staff, we expect to have 8 employees -2 part-time kitchen assistants, 2 part-time wait staff/bartenders, 2 part-time lead kitchen workers, and 2 part-time management staff. Our wages will range from \$6.50 per week to \$10 per week.

To ensure that our location is safe and secure for all, we will have security system installed. We will also have a CCTV system installed through the exterior and interior of the location.

Our immediate customers are the local businesses and residents of our neighborhood area. Advertising in local newspapers such as Express News, the Milwaukee Courier, and the Milwaukee Times. We will advertise our specials more than coupons. For lunch time customers, we will offer a frequent buyer cards such as Buy 5 lunches - Get 1 Free". Also for lunch time customers, we will have "Win a Lunch Contest" by putting in the your business card. As we grow as a business, we will develop additional advertising marketing strategies such as advertising in hotel guides, or entertainment guides. We would like to advertise on the radio on stations such as Jammin' 98.3 or Jazzing 93.3.

It is also our intention to get sponsor a baseball team or bowling team in the future which will help to publicize the restaurant within the community events. We also plan to use our hall for community rentals also.
