There is a possibility that your application may be denied for one or more of the following reasons: The recommendation of the committee regarding the application shall be based on evidence presented at the hearing. Per MCO 85-2.7-4, probative evidence concerning whether or not a new license should be granted may be presented on the following subjects: whether or not the applicant meets the municipal requirements, the appropriateness of the location and premises where the licensed premises is to be located and whether use of the premises for the purposes or activities permitted by the license would tend to facilitate a public or private nuisance or create undesirable neighborhood problems such as disorderly patrons, unreasonably loud noise, litter, and excessive traffic and parking congestion. Probative evidence relating to these matters may be taken from the plan of operation submitted with the license application, if any, but shall not include the content of any music. Evidence regarding the fitness of the location of the premises to be maintained as the principal place of business, including but not limited to whether there is an overconcentration of businesses of the type for which the license is sought; whether the proposal is consistent with any pertinent neighborhood business or development plans, or the location's proximity to areas where children are typically present. The applicant's record in operating similarly licensed premises; and whether or not the applicant has been charged with or convicted of any felony, misdemeanor, municipal offense or other offense, the circumstances of which substantially relate to the activity to be permitted by the license being applied for or any other factor which reasonably relates to the public health, safety or welfare may also be considered. See attached police report or correspondence.

Notice for applicants with warrants or unpaid fines:

Proof of warrant satisfaction or payment of fines must be submitted at the hearing on the above date and time. Failure to comply with this requirement may result in a delay of the granting/denial of your application.

Failure to appear at this meeting may result in the denial of your license. Individual applicants must appear only in person or by an attorney. Corporate or Limited Liability applicants must appear only by the agent designated on the application or by an attorney. Partnership applicants must appear by a partner listed on the application or by an attorney. If you wish to do so and at your own expense, you may be accompanied by an attorney of your choosing to represent you at this hearing.

You will be given an opportunity to speak on behalf of the application and to respond and challenge any charges or reasons given for the denial. No petitions can be accepted by the committee, unless the people who signed the petition are present at the committee hearing and willing to testify. You may present witnesses under oath and you may also confront and cross-examine opposing witnesses under oath. If you have difficulty with the English language, you should bring an interpreter with you, at your expense, so that you can answer questions and participate in your hearing.

You may examine the application file at this office during regular business hours prior to the hearing date. Inquiries regarding this matter may be directed to the person whose signature appears below.

Limited parking for persons attending meetings in City Hall is available at reduced rates (5 hour limit) at the Milwaukee Center on the southwest corner of East Kilbourn and North Water Street. Parking tickets must be validated in the first floor information booth in City Hall.

This report is written by Police Officer David NOVAK, assigned to the License Investigation Unit, Days.

The Milwaukee Police Department's investigation regarding this application revealed the following:

- 1. Applicant has conviction for Operating Auto Intoxicated 1991 license suspended 6 months
- 2. On 11-4-05, Police officers, along with an underage police aide, conducted a premises check at Grady's Saloon, 3101 W Lincoln Avenue. The police aide approached the bartender and ordered three bottles of Miller Lite beer. The bartender asked the police aide for ID which he produced. It clearly stated he was under 21, until 12-05. The bartender sold the beer to the police aide. The licensee was issued the following citation.

3. On 04/18/07 at 10:35 pm, Milwaukee police were dispatched to 3101 W Lincoln for a Fight complaint. Police spoke to the bartender, Yolanda Sanchez, who stated several patrons started to argue with another when it escalated with ashtrays and glasses being thrown. The patrons who started the fight were thrown out of the tavern when one subject grabbed a pipe and broke the front windows to the tavern. That subject then fled in an auto. A report was filed regarding the property damage.

- 4. On 07/18/08 at 11:29 pm, Milwaukee police were flagged down at 3101 W Lincoln for a Trouble With Subject complaint. Officers spoke to Mario Zarate who stated a patron inside the tavern was asking customers for drugs and knocking things off the bar causing a disturbance. Zarate stated he did not want a ticket issued however wanted the patron to know that she was not welcomed in the bar. Officers spoke to the patron who stated she did have a couple of drinks and was looking for some drugs because she was told she could get drugs from inside Grady's Saloon. The patron was arrested on a probation violation.
- 5. On 07/27/08 at 12:47 am, Milwaukee police were dispatched to 3101 W Lincoln for a Fight complaint. Officers spoke to the bartender Rosalinda Zarate who stated that two patrons were intoxicated and began to argue with her and other customers in the tavern. Zarate stated she told the subjects that she would no longer serve and that they should leave. As the patrons left they began yelling that they had guns and would shoot up the tavern. Zarate stated the subjects were outside of the tavern when she locked the front door and the subjects began banging on the doors and windows causing damage to a window. The actors were gone when police arrived. A report was filed.
- 6. On 09/27/08 at 11:47 pm, Milwaukee police were conducting Sales of Alcohol To Underage Persons and had a police aide who is under the age of 21 enter 3101 W Lincoln in attempts to purchase alcohol. The bartender, identified as Jesse Zarate, sold a Jagerbomb without asking for any identification. A citation was issued to Jesse Zarate for Sale to Underage Prohibited and the licensee, Mario Zarate, was issued a citation for Presence of Minor At Licensed Premise

- 8. On 05/04/2014 at 1:11am officer were dispatched to 3102 W. Lincoln Ave to investigate a shots fired complaint, which is directly across the street from Grady's Saloon. The victim stated he had exited Grady's Saloon and was driving westbound on W. Lincoln Av when a known subject started shooting at him. He continued to drive westbound. The victim's auto was hit but the victim was uninjured. The victim stated he had no problems while inside Grady's Saloon.
- 9. On 05/11/2014 at 12:49am officer went to Grady's salon at 3101 W. Lincoln Av for a tavern check. During the check the officer was not able to observe an occupancy sign. The bartender Shannon HEREDIA called the applicant who advised her where the sign was located, which was behind a cooler. The officer also observed 5 amusement machines. The PEP for the business allowed 2 amusement machine. The applicant was given a warning on the amusement machines and issued a citation for the Occupancy must be posted.

- 10. On 10/21/2014 at 4:43pm officers were dispatched to Grady's Saloon at 3101 W. Lincoln Av for an entry complaint. The investigation revealed that someone entered through the patio door between the hours of 2:00am and 4:00pm. Taken was 10 bottles of alcohol. The applicant was cooperative during the investigation. The bar has cameras but they were not working at the time of the incident.
- 11. On 12/14/2014 at 2:07am officers were dispatched to a subject with gun complaint at Grady's Saloon, 3101 W. Lincoln Av. Upon arrival officers spoke with Vanessa ZARATE. She stated the call was placed by a patron who believed a subject that shot at him earlier in the year was outside. The patron and subject were gone when the police arrived. Follow up was conducted on 02/05/2015. Officers again spoke with Vanessa ZARATE who stated she was taking over management of the tavern from her father. She stated that a bartender has been fired and a patron named "Meni" has been banned.
- 12. On 01/31/2015 at 1:31am officers were dispatched to Grady's Saloon at 3101 W. Lincoln Av for a shots fired complaint. Upon arrival the bar was locked and appeared closed. A bullet hole was located in the lower portion of the front door. There were 7 casings located across the street. A bartender Shannon HEREDIA eventually came to the door. She stated she was the only one in the bar but she was unable to let police in because the door locked behind her when she closed the door. Vanessa ZARATE was contacted by phone and she stated her father was aware of the incident but was no coming out since he was told the tavern was not involved. Vanessa ZARATE did come out and let the officers inside to continue the investigation. They recovered the bullet that entered the building. It is not known if the business or any of the patrons were the target.
- 13. On 02/05/2015 there was a meeting at District 2 regarding Grady's Saloon, 3101 W. Lincoln Av. Mario ZARATE and his daughter Vanessa ZARATE were in attendance. ZARATE was advised that his tavern was being investigated for nuisance eligibility based on three incidents. ZARATE stated both parties involved in the May shooting have been banned from the bar. He stated that in the January shooting it was the bartender that would not cooperate and she was fired. He stated he would provide police with names of patron in the bar that night. ZARATE stated the bartenders are responsible for checking ID's if there is no doorman. He has 5

- cameras but they are not currently working. He was advised to call the police when there are problems and cooperating will not be used against him later.
- 14. On 02/11/2015 officers went along with the Department of Revenue to Grady's Saloon at 3101 W. Lincoln Ave. for a tavern check. The agent found 5 contaminated bottle of liquor and confiscated 50 bottles of liquor that were purchased at a grocery store instead of a wholesaler. The agent was cooperative but upset his liquor was confiscated.

This report is written by PO Elicl CONTRERAS assigned to District 2, Late Power Shift.

On Sunday, 5-4-14, at approximately 1:11am Squad 2490 (PO Jolene LOPEZ) was dispatched to 3102 W Lincoln Ave for a shots fired complaint (IR# 141240016), which was directly across the street from Grady's Saloon (3101 W Lincoln Ave). While investigating the incident, it was determined, that the victims, Herminio VEGA (W/M 11-4-74) and Madeline CRESPO (W/F 1-22-83) who were at Grady's saloon, left Gradys at approximately 1:08am and got into his 1970, green in color with gray stripes, 2dr Chevy Nova. As VEGA and CRESPO drove off westbound on Lincoln Ave, a known subject stood in the roadway of eastbound traffic and started shooting at him. Prior to being shot at, VEGA stated he observed the known subject standing on a church stairwell at 3102 W Lincoln Ave. After hearing the gun shots, VEGA stated he concealed himself in the vehicle by positioning his body in a low seated position. VEGA also stated he pushed CRESPO's head down towards the floor of the vehicle to protect her. VEGA then stated he drove westbound on W Lincoln Ave until he reached S 35th St and W Lincoln Ave. VEGA described the firearm used in the offense as a black in color semi-automatic .45 caliber pistol. At the time of the incident, VEGA did not want to reveal the subject's identity involved in the incident because he feared for his and his family's safety. While at Grady's Saloon, VEGA stated he did not have any altercations with anyone. VEGA's vehicle had large caliber bullet holes to the trunk and driver's side. End of report.

This report is written by PO Eliel CONTRERAS assigned to District 2, Late Power Shift. On Sunday, 5-11-14 at approximately 12:49am Squad 2441 (PO Keith MILLER and I) and Squad 2410 (Sgt. Hollis SMITH) responded to 3101 W Lincoln Ave to conduct a tavern check at this location. Upon arriving on scene, I spoke with the bartender, Shannon M HEREDIA (W/F 12-8-80), HEREDIA was very cooperative and provided all the information needed for this inspection. While on scene, I asked HEREDIA if she could show me where the occupancy sign was visibly posted and she was not able to locate it. HEREDIA then called the owner, who then told her the location of the occupancy sign. The occupancy sign was located on the southeast end of the bar barely hanging vertically from a wall and being obstructed by a large cooler (approximately 6x4 feet tall and wide).

Their Class D Tavern License permitted 1 Jukebox, 2 Amusement Machines, and 1 Pool Table. While on scene I observed five amusement machines located on the southeast end of the tavern.

The following are the amusement machines that I observed at the tavern.

- 1. Boxer knockout amusement machine
- 2. Big Buck Hunter 2 amusement machine
- 3. Video slot amusement machine
- 4. Power Player Big Daddy Games LLC amusement machine
- 5. Electronic Dart Game amusement machine

HEREDIA was informed that the owner would be cited for the violations, which were observed during our inspection. A check with the Department listed Mario J ZARATE (W/M/11-12-73) as the licensee of the establaishment. A telephone was made to ZARATE and a voice message was left. ZARATE spoke with P.O. Keith MILLER via telephone on 05-17-14. During that conversation ZARATE stated he did not know that he needed to add additional game machines to his license. ZARATE was cited for the occupancy posting and advised regarding the game machines.

This report is written by PO Kevin PANFIL, assigned to District 2, early shift. On Tuesday, October 21, 2014 at 4:43pm, I along with my partner PO Marisa JIMENEZ, squad 2221, were dispatched to an entry complaint at Grady's Saloon located at 3101 W. Lincoln Avenue.

Upon arrival, I spoke to the owner, who was identified as Mario J. ZARATE, who stated that he dropped off his wife at the location at approximately 4:00pm to open the bar and she then advised him that the back door was open, which had been closed when they last left the location on Monday, October 20,2014 at approximately 2:00am. ZARATE stated that his wife then called 911 to report the incident.

ZARATE stated that he then went to the location and observed that entry was possibly gained through the side patio doors near the beer garden which is located on the west side of the business. ZARATE stated that 10 bottles of liquor where taken from behind the bar and that nothing else was obtained.

ZARATE stated that the interior of the bar does have cameras but they are not working at this time because the computer that they are connected to does not work. ZARATE stated that he has owned the bar for 9 year, never had a burglary before at the location, and has Badger Mutual Insurance.

ZARATE and his wife were cooperative during the investigation and all licenses were properly posted and valid.

This report is written by P.O. Joseph Ratkowski assigned to District Two, Late Shift. On 12/14/14 I was assigned to squad 2340, at 2:07 am we were dispatched to a subject with gun compalint at 3101 W. Lincoln Ave Grady's Saloon. Upon arrival we spoke with the Tavern owner's daughter identified as Vanessa M. Zarate w/f, 10/20/93. Zarate related to us that the call had been placed to police because a patron believed that a subject that had fired a gun at him earlier in the year in the neighborhood was outside of the tavern. Zarate related that the patron, and the aleged subject with a gun had left prior to our arrival. At the time of out arrival, 2:15 am the tavern was in the process of closing and most of the patrons left upon our arrival to the tavern. There was no description of the suspect by the unidentified caller to police, with no call back number. Neither party was located at that time. The owner of the tavern Mario J Zarate was at the taven at that time and he and his daughter were cooperative with police. I observed no violations at that time.

We conducted follow up reguarding this incident on 2/5/15. We again spoke with Vanessa Zarate regarding the incident. Zarate admitted that several incidents have occurred at, or outside of the tavern involving patrons having a gun, or firing shots outside of the tavern. Zarate related that recently a bartender had been let go, and that she was taking over management of the tavern from her father, Mario. Zarate related that a subject known to her as "Meni" has been banned from being served at the bar, and may have been involved in some of these recent incidents. Zarate was coopertive with the police, and noted that she wishes to continue to cooperate and has a meeting scheduled with officers working with the CPU at District Two.

This report is written by P.O. Jeremy GONZALEZ, assigned to District 2, late shift. On 01-31-15 at 1:31am, I was dispatched to a shots fired complaint at 3101 W. Lincoln Av. Upon arrival the bar was closed, locked, and did not appear to have anyone inside. A bullet hole was located in the lower portion of the front door to Grady's Saloon. There were 7 casing located across the street on the northwest corner of S. 31st St. and W. Lincoln Av. I spoke to Shannon M. HEREDIA, w/f, 12-08-80, who eventually came out of the tavern. She stated she was the bartender and was the only one locked inside after there were shots fired outside of the location. HEREDIA could not let us inside the tavern since she locked the door when she came out because she does not have keys to the tavern. I spoke to Vanessa M. ZARATE, w/f 10-20-93, by phone and she stated her father, Mario J. ZARATE, w/m, 11-12-73, was the tavern owner. Vanessa stated her father knew about the incident but was not going to come to the tavern to assist police because he was told the tavern was not involved. I explained to Vanessa that the tavern was directly struck by a bullet and that we needed to get inside the tavern to continue our investigation. Vanessa stated she would contact her father again and try to get him to go to the tayern. A short while later Vanessa arrived at the tayern to let me inside to continue investigating. Once inside I was able to find the bullet that travelled through the front door. The bullet was laying on the floor inside the tayern after it went through the wall, struck a chair leg, and struck the bar. I spoke to Vanessa and she stated her father refused to come to the tavern so she came to the location to let police inside.

At this time it is not known if the suspect in this incident was inside the tavern at any point or if the tavern or any of its patrons were a direct target. This incident was filed under MPD IR# 15-031-0010.

This report is written by P.O. Guadalupe VELASQUEZ, assigned to District 2, Early Shift, Community Prosecution Unit.

On Thursday, February 5, 2015, at 2:00 p.m., Mario J. ZARATE, was ordered in to the District 2 Police Station for a meeting. I had informed ZARATE that I wanted to discuss several violent incidents associated to his tavern. The meeting was attended by Captain Alfonso MORALES, P.O. Guadalupe VELASQUEZ, P.O. Kevin VODICKA, A.D.A. Ann LOPEZ, Safe and Sound Coordinator Maritza UGARTE, Mario ZARATE and his daughter, Vanessa ZARATE.

I advised ZARATE that his tavern was being investigated for nuisance eligibility and that there were at least three incidents that may qualify for a nuisance designation. ZARATE was also informed that we are aware that several members of the Latin Kings Gang frequent his establishment and that the Milwaukee Police Department suspects that is the reason for the problems. I also explained to ZARATE that our main concern was that after the incident in January the bartender would not allow officers into the tavern and he refused to come to the location to cooperate with the officers' investigation. The incidents discussed were a shooting from May of 2014, a subject with a gun complaint from December of 2014, and a shots fired complaint from January of 2015. ZARATE was also advised that these same incidents may make him eligible for a Camera Requirement Letter under City Ordinance 105-91. ZARATE stated that the subjects involved in the shooting incident were both banned from the bar and if they come to the tavern they are not suppose to be served. ZARATE stated that the victim from the shooting was in the tavern in December for the bartender's birthday and that the suspect's family members were the ones outside with the gun waiting to retailiate. Regarding the shots fired complaint from January ZARATE stated that the bartender was the one who refused to cooperate with the police and that she has been fired. ZARATE stated he will work with the police department to help identify the suspect and that he was willing to provide the names and phone numbers for the patrons who were at the tavern that night.

I then asked ZARATE about his plan of operation. He stated the bar is open from Tuesday to Saturday 4 p.m. to bar close and on Sunday from 12 p.m. to bar close. He stated he employs 2 bartenders, his daughter Vanessa is one of them. He also stated Vanessa will eventually take over the tavern. He stated the bartender is in charge of checking identification cards unless there is a door man. The door man only works when they have scheduled a bigger event or party. He stated they have 5 surveillance cameras at the location but they currently are not working.

Alderman DONOVAN and Captain MORALES both stressed to ZARATE that having a license for his tavern is a privilege and that these kinds of incidents would not be tolerated. ZARATE was also told that he will be held accountable for his patron's actions and that as a licensee he will be held to a higher standard.

CPU advised ZARATE to repair his cameras and to use a door man to check his patrons for weapons. He was also advised to screen his employees better so they do not reflect badly on his business. ZARATE was also advised to contact the police department when there are problems at his tavern. He was reassured that his cooperation with the police department would not be used against him at a later time.

ZARATE stated that the bartender involved in the January incident has been fired and will no longer work at his tavern. He stated that the two men involved in the shooting incident from May will not be allowed into his tavern anymore and that he will call the police if the enter his tavern. ZARATE stated he will also have the cameras fixed.

ZARATE was provided with the CPU's contact information in case he had any questions.

On Wednesday, February 11, 2015 at 4:10 PM, while on squad 2266, P.O. Matthew Diener and I, along with squad 2268, P.O. Kevin Vodicka responded to 3101 W Lincoln Ave (Grady's Saloon) to assist State Agent Georgeann King with a tavern inspection.

Agent King found 5 contaminated liquor bottles and confiscated over 50 bottles of liquor that were purchased at grocery stores instead of a wholesaler. There were also liquor bottles that were being married from brand to brand. Agent King filed a field report regarding the investigation and inventory receipts regarding all the confiscated liquor.

The agent of Grady's Saloon, Mario J Zarate (W/M, 11/12/73) admitted to buying liquor from the grocery store and marrying bottles. Zarate was unhappy that the majority of his liquor was being confiscated but cooperated with the investigation. I advised Zarate that I would be filing a PA-33. There weren't any other violations.


Homeowners have to pick up all the trash that patrons throw out their car windows. It blows west down Oklahoma and onto private property. Patrons also fling cans, bottles and other trash onto lawns along Oklahoma. 24-hr operation will just increase the problem.

There are no fences along the property line, therefore car lights shine into the windows of the homes on Oklahoma and apartment building to the north. This is especially a problem along the parking spaces that face west. Extending the hours will make this a terrible nuisance during the night.

The Kinnick Mart property is not well maintained. Trash is not picked up daily. What passes for landscaping is minimally maintained and is overgrown with weeds. It's an eyesore that greets visitors for the Bay View area along it's main streets. Frankly, it's an embarrassment.

Lastly, the opportunity for robbery in the late hours should be taken into consideration. There already have been many instances of the Kinnick Mart and Walgreens being robbed during their current open hours.

I don't see how 24-hr operation of this establishment will not intensify the negative impact on the welfare of the public and neighborhood. Thanks for hearing my concerns.




