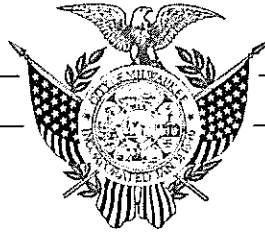


I am writing to invite you to an informational meeting on July 23, 2015, to discuss the City's proposed ordinance relating to a new "Recycling, Salvaging or Towing" license. The meeting will take place at City Hall's Room 301-A at 1 p.m., and will provide an opportunity for you to learn more about the proposed changes and to provide meaningful feedback regarding any of your remaining concerns.

As you may already be aware, the City's Licenses Committee discussed this ordinance and solicited comments at its May 14 meeting. The latest draft of the ordinance incorporates many of the comments provided by the industry at this meeting, and I hope to continue to work with you to develop policies and programs which are both conducive to the well-being of your industry and effective at deterring and prosecuting metal theft.
