WHEREAS, Sherman Hill always put people first, and he always advocated for a better quality of life for those he served, and he was always thinking strategically regarding necessary productive change in the African American community, and he was a student in the Ghanaian Rights of Passage process created by Dr. Anthony Mensah, and lived out that process by serving and teaching those less fortunate how to develop their capacity to become self-sufficient and advocate for themselves; and

WHEREAS, Sherman befriended and provided mentoring to hundreds of young black, Hispanic and white professionals throughout his career, and he left his footprints in many places, including 100 Black Men of Milwaukee, Father's, Inc., The Rites of Passage, the Male Adolescent Role Model Program and many others, and he became a father figure to many; now, therefore, be it
