There is a possibility that your application may be denied for one or more of the following reasons: The recommendation of the committee regarding the application shall be based on evidence presented at the hearing. Per MCO 85-4-4, unless otherwise specified in the code, probative evidence concerning non-renewal, suspension or revocation may include evidence of the following: failure of the applicant to meet municipal qualifications, pending charges against or the conviction of any felony, misdemeanor, municipal offense or other offense, the circumstances of which substantially relate to the circumstances of the particular licensed or permitted activity, by the applicant or by any employee or other agent of the applicant. If the activities of the applicant involve a licensed premises, whether the premises tends to facilitate a public or private nuisance or has been the source of congregations of persons which have resulted in any of the following: disturbance of the peace; illegal drug activity; public drunkenness; drinking in public; harassment of passers-by; gambling; prostitution; sale of stolen goods; public urination; theft; assaults; battery; acts of vandalism including graffiti, excessive littering, loitering, illegal parking, loud noise at times when the licensed premise is open for business; traffic violations; curfew violations; lewd conduct; display of materials harmful to minors, pursuant to s. 106-9.6; or any other factor which reasonably relates to the public health, safety and welfare, or failure to comply with the approved plan of operation. See attached police report or correspondence.

Notice for applicants with warrants or unpaid fines:

Proof of warrant satisfaction or payment of fines must be submitted at the hearing on the above date and time. Failure to comply with this requirement may result in a delay of the granting/denial of your application.

Failure to appear at this meeting may result in the denial of your license. Individual applicants must appear only in person or by an attorney. Corporate or Limited Liability applicants must appear only by the agent designated on the application or by an attorney. Partnership applicants must appear by a partner listed on the application or by an attorney. If you wish to do so and at your own expense, you may be accompanied by an attorney of your choosing to represent you at this hearing.

You will be given an opportunity to speak on behalf of the application and to respond and challenge any charges or reasons given for the denial. No petitions can be accepted by the committee, unless the people who signed the petition are present at the committee hearing and willing to testify. You may present witnesses under oath and you may also confront and cross-examine opposing witnesses under oath. If you have difficulty with the English language, you should bring an interpreter with you, at your expense, so that you can answer questions and participate in your hearing.

You may examine the application file at this office during regular business hours prior to the hearing date. Inquiries regarding this matter may be directed to the person whose signature appears below.

Limited parking for persons attending meetings in City Hall is available at reduced rates (5 hour limit) at the Milwaukee Center on the southwest corner of East Kilbourn and North Water Street. Parking tickets must be validated in the first floor information booth in City Hall.

Police observed alcoholic beverages in front of three patrons. Police also observed the owner Louise Burdue and two bartenders, Jason Peterson and Bethany Chamberlain, also in the bar. Burdue stated to police that she was yelling for the last 20 minutes to her bartenders to get the patrons out of the tavern. Burdue also stated she as well told patrons to leave. 3. On 03/04/11 at 10:05 pm, Milwaukee police conducted a License Premise Check at 100 W Maple. As police entered they observed two females smoking a cigarettes while in the tavern. The subjects were identified as Louise Burdue, owner of the bar, and the bartender, identified as Gale Benn. Burdue stated that she thinks the no smoking ban is a joke and that she will smoke in her bar if she wants to. She was advised to follow all laws and both received citations. Neither citation could be located in the municipal court system.

Incident # 3 citation for smoking was found in the municipal system. The applicant was found guilty and fined \$100.00 for the violation. (12011897)

On 11/18/2014, at 12:12AM, Squad 2340 (P.O. Adam BOEHM and I) was dispatched to Ollie's Bar located at 100 W. Maple ST., to investigate an Armed Robbery complaint.

Upon arrival I discovered Ollie's Bar to be a class B tavern located on the northwest corner of S.1st / W. Maple St. P.O. BOEHM interviewed the victim identified as Michael A. LOPEZ w/m 05-16-82. LOPEZ. It was determined Lopez was the victim of an armed robbery at Ollie's and at approximately midnight, while he was sitting at the bar Two suspects entered the tavern displaying handguns. Suspects attempted to rob patron inside the bar and also attempted to take money from the cash register. Suspects were only able to obtain LOPEZ'S phone and both suspects fled on foot out the main entrance and continued on foot west on W. Maple St. Owner of Ollie's bar identified as Luise A. Burdue, W/F, 03/08/1955, was present at the time of the robbery and was cooperative with the investigation. All licenses were displayed in plain view behind the bar counter and were valid. Bartender John ESSLINGER was also cooperative with the investigation. No violations were observed at this time.

ESSLINGER cooperated and allowed officers access to view the licenses, which were all current and up to date. ESSLINGER provided me with an expired BART License (BART 208128) but stated that he has a valid one but was posted at a different bar that he works at.

During the check, I observed no visible violations and the staff was cooperative with police. ESSLINGER stated that there were no problems that night at the establishment.

- 1. The license application is scheduled to be heard at the above time. Due to other hearings running longer than scheduled, you may have to wait some time to provide your testimony.
- 2. You must appear in person and testify as to matters that you have personally experienced or seen. (You cannot provide testimony for your neighbor, parent or anyone else; this is considered hearsay and cannot be considered by the committee.)
- 3. No letters or petitions can be accepted by the committee (unless the person who wrote the letter or the persons who signed the petition are present at the committee hearing and willing to testify).
- 4. Persons opposed to the license application are given the opportunity to testify first; supporters may testify after the opponents have finished.
- 5. When you are called to testify, you will be sworn in and asked to give your name, and address. (If your first and/or last names are uncommon please spell them.)

- 6. You may then provide testimony.
- a. Include only information relating to the above license application.
- b. Include only information you have personally witnessed or seen.
- c. Provide concise and relevant information detailing how this business has affected or may affect the peaceful enjoyment of your neighborhood.
- d. If by the time you have the opportunity to testify, the information you wish to share has already been provided to the committee, you may state that you agree with the previous testimony. Redundant or repetitive testimony will not assist the committee in making its recommendation.
- 7. After giving your testimony, the members of the Licenses Committee and the licensee may ask questions regarding the testimony you have given or other factors relating to the license application.
- 8. Business Competition is not a valid basis for denial or non-renewal of a license.

Please Note: If you have submitted an objection to the above application your objection cannot be considered by the committee unless you personally testify at the hearing.

Vargas stated with the help of other patrons, she was able to break up the fight and escort them out of the bar before police arrived. The victim was treated for a laceration to the head and received five staples and six stitches to close the wound. On 04/24/13, at 3:30 pm. the CLO officer from District Two, spoke with Antonio Martinez regarding the incidents that occurred on 04/12/13 and 04/20/13, and advised Martinez that if a third violent incident occurred within one year, that the business would be required by MCO to have working cameras at all times operating during business hours.

Martinez stated he does have cameras however, that they are non-functioning digital video recorders and that in the near future, he would be replacing the equipment.

This report is written by PO Eliel CONTRERAS assigned to District 2, Late Power Shift.

On Sunday, 5-10-15, at approximately 12:06am Squad 2470 (PO Andrew WILKIEWICZ and I) responded to 1900 W Lincoln Ave (El Caminante Bar) for a tavern violation.

According to an anonymous caller, the caller stated the Manager/Bartender, Jose A LOPEZ (W/M 10-12-78) was allowing under age individuals inside the establishment. The caller also stated there was drug dealing occurring inside the establishment.

With the assistance of Squad 2351 (PO Ronald ZIARNIK and PO Jason STACHOWIAK) and Squad 2341 (PO Christapher GREER and PO Erik ANDRADE), we entered the establishment and conducted a license premise check.

While on scene, we also checked all the patrons identification cards to make sure they were of legal age, which is 21 years old or older, to be inside the establishment. PA-33E Narrative

This report is written by PO Eliel CONTRERAS assigned to District 2, Late Power Shift.

On Saturday, 2-28-15, at approximately 2:34am Squad 2470 (PO Francisco CARTAGENA and I) was dispatched to 1900 W Lincoln Ave (El Caminante Sports Bar) for a fight complaint.

During the investigation, it was determined that an Aggravated Battery had occurred inside the El Caminante Bar.

Upon arriving on scene, I observed two individuals across the street from El Caminante Sports Bar with visible injuries. Both individuals were very uncooperative and refused medical attention on scene. Although uncooperative, one of the individuals stated they were inside El Caminante Sports Bar when they were involved in a fight with some MP gang members. The individual also stated the gang members were carrying guns and were currently in the alley located behind El Caminante Sports Bar.

Upon receiving this information, we requested additional squads to our location. Squad 2490 (PO James COLLINS), Squad 2341 (PO James SPINATO and PO Jason STACHOWIAK), Squad 2330 (PO Adam LUEBBE and PO Adam WILKIEWICZ), and Squad 2411 (Sgt. Bradley SCHLEI) responded to our location and assisted with the investigation. We were not able to locate any MP gang members in the alley or in the surrounding area.

After securing the area, I responded to El Caminante Sports Bar with PO LUEBBE. Upon approaching the establishment, I heard the door unlock and observed people attempting to exit the establishment. With the assistance of officers on scene, we instructed the individuals to step back into the establishment.

Upon entering the establishment, I observed 9 individuals who were attempting to leave prior to police arriving. Among the individuals still in the establishment was Jose Alberto LOPEZ (W/M 10-12-78), who stated he was the manager/owner of El Caminante Sports Bar.

The following individuals were in the establishment when we arrived on scene.

Martha TOSCANO (W/F 6-11-76) who stated she was waiting for her sister, Claudia TOSCANO GOMEZ (W/F 12-3-79), who was a bartender at El Caminante Bar.

Jorge Gabriel DE JESUS RAMOS (W/M 10-25-76). DE JESUS RAMOS admitted to being a patron at El Caminante.

Jose O OQUENDO (W/M 9-2-83) stated he was the DJ for El Caminante Bar.

Monica C MARRERO (W/F 4-14-83) stated she was the girlfriend of OQUENDO and was at the El Caminante Bar as a guest of OQUENDO.

Jose CARRASQUILLO (W/M 8-15-64) stated he was security at El Caminante Bar. According to LOPEZ, CARRASQUILLO is the one who informed him not to call the police. CARRASQUILLO is also depicted in the video playing pool prior to the fight occurring.

The other two individuals were employees of CARRASQUILLO but they were not on scene when the fight occurred at the establishment.

While speaking with LOPEZ, I observed that he was intoxicated. LOPEZ had glossy eyes and I also smelled a strong odor of intoxicant beverages emanating from his person and breath. I asked LOPEZ what had occurred

but LOPEZ was hesitant to answer my question. While waiting for LOPEZ's answer, I observed blood splatter on the southeast corner of the pool table. After observing the blood and asking LOPEZ again what happened, LOPEZ stated there had been a fight inside the establishment prior to police arriving. I asked why he did not call the police right away and he stated he was informed by security on scene not to call the police because it would effect the establishment in a negative way.

While conducting a walk through, I observed blood on a cue stick, which was near the pool table. I also observed a tremendous amount of blood splatter in the men's restroom and hallway leading to LOPEZ's back office. I also observed paper towels, mops and disinfectant spray bottles scattered through out the establishment. I asked LOPEZ if was attempting to clean up the blood and he stated yes. While on scene, I observed video cameras inside the establishment. I asked LOPEZ to show us the video footage regarding the incident. The video footage depicts two different fights occurring inside the establishment at the same time. One of the fights occurred next to the pool table and the other fight occurred on the north end of the bar counter. The video also depicted on scene security playing pool prior to fight occurring.

I informed LOPEZ that he would be receiving citations regarding the violations observed at the establishment.

While conducting my investigation at El Caminante Bar, PO CARTAGENA responded to Squad 2320's (PO Peter ULATOWSKI) Battery Complaint at St. Francis Hospital. The complaint stated the victim had been battered while walking home from the bar on S 19th and W Lincoln Ave. PO CARTAGENA identified the victim, Emilio BARRERAS (W/M 10-29-90), as the same individual we observed when we first arrived on scene at S 19th and W Lincoln Ave. BARRERAS was very uncooperative with the investigation and refused to provide information regarding the incident. BARRERAS also stated he did not want to prosecute.

The other individual/victim was identified by PO CARTAGENA as Juan G NAVARRO (W/M 10-23-90). NAVARRO stated he was at the El Caminante Bar playing pool when a fight broke out. NAVARRO stated he was struck in the face but did not know who struck him. NAVARRO stated he did not want to prosecute and refused to provide more information regarding the fight.

While at District 2, I looked up LOPEZ in LIRA. LOPEZ had a valid Class D Bartender's License but did not have a valid Class B Manager's License and he was not listed as the licensee/owner of El Caminante Sports Bar. I also looked up TOSCANO GOMEZ in LIRA and she did have a valid Class D Bartender's License.


PO CARTAGENA will be writing a detail supplemental report regarding the incident at El Caminante Sports Bar.

- 6. You may then provide testimony.
- a. Include only information relating to the above license application.
- b. Include only information you have personally witnessed or seen.
- c. Provide concise and relevant information detailing how this business has affected or may affect the peaceful enjoyment of your neighborhood.



6. On 9-23-2004 Milwaukee Police entered the Peoples Inn tavern, 1139 W Maple St. to conduct a licensed premise check. They spoke to a Jose J Zayaz-Gonzalez of 1804 S 12th St who stated that he and his wife, Maria Rodriguez are the owners of the tavern. When asked if there were any guns on the premises, Zayaz-Gonzalez stated that there was one behind the bar. The officers found a Taurus .38 Special revolver behind the bar. Zayaz-Gonzalez stated that the gun was his wife's and that she keeps it in the tavern for her protection, Maria Rodriguez was not on the premises at this time; she was in the upstairs apartment. It was learned that Jose J Zayaz-Gonzalez was convicted of a 2nd Degree Reckless Injury (Felony) on 5-12-1999 under the name of Jose J. Gonzalez. He was ordered in the District Attorney's Office and was charged with Felon Possessing Firearm (Felony, Case 2004CF004778 scheduled for Circuit Court 1-25-2005.

- 7. On 12/14/09 at 7:30 pm, Milwaukee police conducted an investigation at 1139 W Maple. This report is written by PO Kevin PANFIL, assigned to District 2, early shift. On Sunday, May 17, 2015, at 11:13pm, I along with my partner PO Luis VARGAS-RAMOS, squad 2221, were dispatched to a Shotspotter complaint at 1718 S. 12th Street. Officier VARGAS and I were in the area of S. 10th Street and W. Mitchell Street prior **to** the Shotspotter complaint and heard one gunshot in the area.

Upon arrival, we observed that the scene of this incident was the People's Inn, located at 1139 W. Maple Street. When we arrived, we observed a subject later identified as Adrian AVILES (w/m 03/15/1988 0f 1959 S. 11th Street) standing at the passenger side door of a 2000 Mitsubishi Galant, 4 door, white in color, with a Wisconsin plate of 144-XKK. AVILES was limping and stated that he had been shot in his left leg. I then observed a gunshot wound to his left hip and right hip area. I called for medical attention and Milwaukee Fire Department Engine 31, blue shift, commanded by Captain Ronald FIRNROHR arrived on scene along with Milwaukee Fire Department Med Unit 18, blue shift, commanded by Lieutenant MINH-HIEU. AVILES stated that he was in front of the bar an the time of the incident and heard one gunshot. AVILES stated that there was a fight outside in front of the bar when he heard the gunshot. AVILES stated the he did not see who shot him. AVILES was conveyed to Froedert Hospital by Milwaukee Fire Department Med Unit 18.

When we arrived on scene Officer VARGAS-RAMOS and I also observed two Hispanic male subjects running from the inside of the bar towards a van parked facing westbound in the 1100 block of W. Maple Street with their hands in their waistbands. Officer VARGAS-RAMOS chased the subjects on foot to the vehicle, which was parked at 1128 W. Maple Street. The vehicle was a 1999 Toyota Sienna with a Wisconsin truck plate of KM2045. The subject who got into the driver's seat was identified as Miguel A. MORALES (w/m 11/19/1991 of 1522 W. Mineral Street, Milwaukee, WI). The subject who got into the passenger seat was identified as Juan C. MORALES-RIVERA (w/m 03/21/1988 of 1522 W. Mineral Street, Milwaukee, WI 53204)

Upon approaching the subjects Miguel stated that he had a gun and shot the victim. A search of the Toyota Sienna revealed two semi-automatic handguns, which were recovered and placed on Milwaukee Police Department inventory. One .40 caliber casing was recovered from in front of the bar and also placed on Milwaukee Police Department inventory.

I then spoke to the bar owner, who was identified as Maria M. RODRIGUEZ (w/f 08/05/1943 of 1804 S. 12th Street, Milwaukee, WI) who stated that she was inside of the bar at the time of the incident and stated she did not see what had happened. All the licenses were properly posted and RODRIGUEZ was cooperative during the investigation. RODRIGUEZ also stated that she had cameras which might have captured the incident.

Miguel MORALES Juan MORALES-RIVERA were both arrested and conveyed to Central Booking for processing.
