There is a possibility that your application may be denied for one or more of collowing reasons: The recommendation of the committee regarding the application shall be based on evidence presented at the hearing. Per MCO 85-4-4, unless otherwise specified in the code, probative evidence concerning non-renewal, suspension or revocation may include evidence of the following: failure of the applicant to meet municipal qualifications, pending charges against or the conviction of any felony, misdemeanor, municipal offense or other offense, the circumstances of which substantially relate to the circumstances of the particular licensed or permitted activity, by the applicant or by any employee or other agent of the applicant. If the activities of the applicant involve a licensed premises, whether the premises tends to facilitate a public or private nuisance or has been the source of congregations of persons which have resulted in any of the following: disturbance of the peace; illegal drug activity; public drunkenness; drinking in public; harassment of passers-by; gambling; prostitution; sale of stolen goods; public urination; theft; assaults; battery; acts of vandalism including graffiti, excessive littering, loitering, illegal parking, loud noise at times when the licensed premise is open for business; traffic violations; curfew violations; lewd conduct; display of materials harmful to minors, pursuant to s. 106-9.6; or any other factor which reasonably relates to the public health, safety and welfare, or failure to comply with the approved plan of operation. See attached police report or correspondence.

Notice for applicants with warrants or unpaid fines:

Proof of warrant satisfaction or payment of fines must be submitted at the hearing on the above date and time. Failure to comply with this requirement may result in a delay of the granting/denial of your application.

Failure to appear at this meeting may result in the denial of your license. Individual applicants must appear only in person or by an attorney. Corporate or Limited Liability applicants must appear only by the agent designated on the application or by an attorney. Partnership applicants must appear by a partner listed on the application or by an attorney. If you wish to do so and at your own expense, you may be accompanied by an attorney of your choosing to represent you at this hearing.

You will be given an opportunity to speak on behalf of the application and to respond and challenge any charges or reasons given for the denial. No petitions can be accepted by the committee, unless the people who signed the petition are present at the committee hearing and willing to testify. You may present witnesses under oath and you may also confront and cross-examine opposing witnesses under oath. If you have difficulty with the English language, you should bring an interpreter with you, at your expense, so that you can answer questions and participate in your hearing.

You may examine the application file at this office during regular business hours prior to the hearing date. Inquiries regarding this matter may be directed to the person whose signature appears below.

The Milwaukee Police Department's investigation regarding this application revealed the following:

1. On 05/03/2014 Officers conducted underage tavern enforcement. At 11:13pm an underage Police Aid gained access to Pourman's at 1127 N. Water St. through the front door. The Police Aid then ordered, paid for and obtained a Miller Lite from the bartender without being asked for ID to verify her age.

2. On 07/27/2014 at 1:50am officers conducted a tavern check at Pourman's, 1127 N. Water St. The officer asked the employee at the door stated there were about 60-65 patron in the bar but did not have a counting device. The officer conducted a count of patrons and upon reaching 100 called for a supervisor. The supervisors responded and closed the bar by controlling the exits. The patrons were videotaped and counted as they left. The total was 119 patrons. The business has a total capacity of 79.

3. On 08/19/2014 the applicant had a meeting with Asst. City Attorney Nick DeSiato, Sgt. RADEN, and Capt. THIELE. The applicant stated he has added more security on Saturday nights and they would have a clicker for counting people as they entered. He has roped off an area in front of the bar in order to keep an orderly line and separate the people waiting to get in the bar from people loitering on the sidewalk. The applicant stated he will also look into more cameras. The applicant was advised to contact Code RED officers if he was having issues he could not control with his personnel. ACA DeSiato went over concerns regarding the overcapacity issue and stated his recommendation for the citation to be reduced.

- 4. On 02/03/2015 Milwaukee police responded to a battery complaint at 1127 North Water Street (Pourman's tavern). Investigation revealed a subject, that appeared intoxicated when he entered the business, was asked to leave. This patron refused and was ultimately escorted out of the establishment by the applicant and another patron. During this incident, the intoxicated patron fell to the ground injuring his shoulder. This patron was cited for disorderly conduct and trespassing.
- 5. On 08/07/2015 a 20 year old Milwaukee police aide, working in conjunction with Milwaukee police, was able to enter Pourmans tavern (1127 North Water Street) unchallenged. Once inside, the police aide was able to purchase a Corona beer from the bartender.

PA-33E Narrative

This report is written by Police Officer Zachary JOHNSON, assigned to District One, Late Power Shift.

On the evening of Friday, August 7, 2015 through the morning of Saturday, August 8, 2015 District One personnel performed an underage tavern enforcement initiative. There were three teams that were part of this initiative. Each team had an MPD Police Aide, a Police Officer, both of which were acting in a plainclothes capacity with a uniformed Police Officer or Sergeant monitoring from a short distance. The Police Aide for each team was under the age of 21. This was verified by their respective Wisconsin driver's license. Police Aide Laura Nirode (PS 024687, DOB 06/15/1995), Police Aide Elizabeth Sauer (PS 024693, DOB 08/11/1994), PA Chelsey McDowell (PS 024685, DOB 08/16/1994), PO Karlee Kennon (PS 021519), PO Dorian Andress (PS 019758) and PO Kira Williams (PS 019786) were in plainclothes while PO Mariolys Flores (PS 024325), PO Zachary Johnson (PS 022614) and Sergeant Thomas Ackley (PS 018520) were in full uniform.

Prior to attempting any checks of licensed establishments the Police Aides and Police Officers were given instructions. All plainclothes members of this initiative were advised they are not allowed to consume any intoxicating beverages. If asked about their age, the members were told to tell the truth. The Police Officers were directed to produce ID's, but the underage Police Aides were directed to not produce any form of identification. It was explained that the Police Aide was to order an alcoholic beverage. It was explained that at all times the plainclothes Police Officer should be in visual sight and observe the financial transaction for alcoholic beverages. All plainclothes members of this initiative submitted a sample of their breath to a PBT test before and after the initiative. All members registered 0.0% BAC.

After the briefing, the teams conducted underage checks at multiple taverns and convenient stores located throughout the District One boundaries.

Police Officer KENNON and Police Aide MCDOWELL attempted to gained entry to the class "B" licensed tavern, Pourmans located at 1127 N. Water. Police Aide MCDOWELL was not challenged at the point of entry. MCDOWELL stated that the bouncer at the door is a black male wearing glasses. Once inside, MCDOWELL stated that at the bar she purchased a Corona beer for \$5.00. MCDOWELL described the bartender as a black female, with shoulder length dread locks, wearing a white tang top with a open blue jean shirt over it.

On Thursday, August 11 2015, Sgt. ACKLEY informed Ben HEBL, the owner, that they failed. While at the tavern, Sgt. ACKLEY, asked HEBL if they had an ID scanner, at which time HEBL replied that they did not.

PA-33E Narrative

This report is submitted by P.O. Josh POST, who is assigned to District One, Late-Power Shift.

On Tuesday, 02-03-15 at 10:35PM, Squad 1442 (P.O. Mariolys FLORES and myself) was dispatched to 1127 N. Water St. regarding a Battery complaint.

Upon arrival, I observed the caller in this incident approaching our squad. The caller identified himself as Taylor L. DANCIK (W/M, 03-03-88). DANCIK appeared to be holding his right shoulder. DANCIK stated that prior to our arrival, he was pushed to the ground by an employee of Pourman's tavern at that location. As a result, DANCIK stated that his right arm had been dislocated. Bell 402 was on scene and appeared to express frustration that DANCIK was uncooperative with allowing treatment. P.O. FLORES convinced DANCIK to re-enter the medical rig with her so that he could be medically treated.

I then entered the tavern and spoke with the bartender/owner who identified himself Ben A. HEBL (W/M, 10-25-83). HEBL stated that on today's date, at approximately 10:20PM, DANCIK entered the tavern and stated that he was having the worst day of his life. HEBL stated that he believed that DANCIK was already under the influence of alcoholic beverage and he observed that DANCIK was visibly impaired. HEBL stated that DANCIK appeared to have trouble standing still and stumbled into a couple of patrons seated at the bar. HEBL stated that DANCIK then pretended to know the couple, which he did not.

HEBL stated that he determined that DANCIK was too intoxicated and that he (HEBL) was not going to serve him alcohol. Based on DANCIK's conduct, HEBL stated that he exercised his right to refuse service to DANCIK and asked DANCIK to leave the tavern. HEBL stated that DANCIK refused to leave the tavern and instead questioned why HEBL would not serve him. HEBL stated that he explained to DANCIK that he was too intoxicated to be served and that he was not going to serve him any more alcohol. HEBL stated that DANCIK did not accept that explanation and continued to question why HEBL would not serve him. HEBL stated that he asked DANCIK approximately ten times to leave the tavern and each time, DANCIK refused and asked why he needed to leave.

HEBL stated that, realizing DANCIK would not leave voluntarily, he took control of DANCIK's arm and informed DANCIK that he was going to physically remove him from the tavern. HEBL stated that he began escorting DANCIK to the door and DANCIK began to resist. HEBL stated that a patron at the tavern who he knows only as "Tim", stepped in and assisted HEBL in removing DANCIK from the tavern. HEBL stated that he opened the door to the tavern and both he and "Tim" forcibly ejected DANCIK from the tavern. HEBL stated that as a result, DANCIK fell to the ground outside of the tavern. HEBL stated that as DANCIK fell, he (DANCIK) held onto both HEBL's and "Tim's" arms and pulled them with him to the ground. HEBL stated that this caused both he and "Tim" to fall to the ground on top of DANCIK. HEBL stated that he and "Tim" then stood up and re-entered the tavern. HEBL stated that he then secured the door so that DANCIK could not re-enter. HEBL stated that DANCIK did attempt to re-gain entry to the establishment. HEBL stated that DANCIK also began shouting at passersby in front of the business. HEBL stated that he then called police.

At 11:03PM Squad 1442 then followed Bell 402 to Aurora Sinai Medical Center for further medical evaluation of DANCIK.

DANCIK was admitted to the hospital at 11:09PM and treated by Dr. Ann LAGERLUND.

While at the hospital, I interviewed DANCIK regarding this incident. DANCIK appeared heavily intoxicated by alcohol. Regarding this incident, DANCIK did eventually state that he entered

Pourman's tavern with the intent to have an alcoholic beverage. DANCIK stated that he had consumed alcohol prior to his arrival to the tavern. DANCIK stated that for no apparent reason, he was asked to leave the tavern. DANCIK admitted that when asked to leave, instead of leaving, he questioned why he was being told to leave. DANCIK stated that the bartender then pushed him out of the tavern. DANCIK stated that this caused him to fall to the ground and the impact of that caused his right shoulder to become dislocated. DANCIK stated that this is the approximate sixth time that his shoulder has dislocated. DANCIK stated that his shoulder is very easily dislocated due to previous incidences of dislocation. DANCIK stated that he then called police.

While at the hospital, I spoke with DANCIK's treating physician who identified herself as Dr. Ann LAGERLUND. Dr. LAGERLUND stated that DANCIK's shoulder was not broken and that she would be treating him for a dislocated right shoulder.

On Wednesday, 02-11-15 at 9:57PM, Squad 1442 returned to Pourman's tavern. There, I spoke with HEBL who stated that he did view, and could provide, video surveillance regarding this incident. HEBL stated that he viewed the video surveillance regarding this incident and captured it from the surveillance monitor with the use of his personal cellular phone. HEBL stated that he could e-mail me the recordings of the surveillance from his cellular phone. I provided HEBL my departmental e-mail address and observed him send those videos to me. I then asked HEBL to show me the videos on his cellular phone.

HEBL allowed me to view the videos and the following is a synopsis of what I observed:

The video was taken using an iPhone cellular phone which recorded a television monitor that was displaying the surveillance. This surveillance is recovered from a camera that is situated on the front entrance of the tavern. The video showed DANCIK entering the tavern and apparently stumbling into two patrons seated on stools at the bar. A short time later, HEBL approached DANCIK and moved him away from the patrons to the side of the bar. HEBL and DANCIK appear to be conversing for a few minutes. DANCIK then re-approaches a male subject of the patrons he previously stumbled into. HEBL identified that male subject as "Tim". HEBL then extends his hand to shake DANCIK's hand, which HEBL stated was an attempt to convince DANCIK to leave the tavern voluntarily. HEBL then appears to take hold of DANCIK's jacket and walk him a few feet towards the front door of the tavern. Upon doing so, DANCIK appears to actively resist being physically removed from the tavern. "Tim" is then observed assisting HEBL by taking control of the other side of DANCIK. Both "Tim" and HEBL then escort DANCIK to the front door and HEBL holds the door open. "Tim" and HEBL appear to forcibly eject DANCIK from the tavern as DANCIK appeared to continue to actively resist. Upon his ejection, DANCIK appears to fall to the ground directly in front of the front door to the tavern. I then observe both "Tim" and HEBL fall to the ground on top of DANCIK. The front door to the tavern closes and DANCIK, HEBL and "Tim" our outside of the tavern and out of view of the surveillance camera. A short time later, both HEBL and "Tim" re-enter the tavern and HEBL appears to secure the front door of the tavern to prevent DANCIK from re-entering the tavern.

Given the totality of the circumstances, I issued citations to DANCIK for Disorderly Conduct (#48989911074) and Trespassing (#48989911075). Those citations were mailed to DANCIK's address at 408 W. Washington St. #2, Dodgeville, WI, 53533.

Officers spoke to a security guard identified as Sedrick Peoples (b/m 01-31-73), who stated he works for the Ladybug Club. Peoples stated that a male subject tried to enter the bar but was refused entry due to being intoxicated. Peoples further stated that this subject then grabbed a chain rope and began to drag it down the street. The manager, identified as Habib Manjee, (w/m 07-16-64) tried to calm this male subject down by talking to him and asking him to leave. This subject then punched Manjee in the face and shoulder. Peoples stated this is when he took this subject down to the ground. Maniee stated he was not injured. Officers then spoke with the suspect, who identified himself as Christopher Brown (b/m 08-04-83 2734 N 48th St, 702-0481). Brown stated he was trying to get into the club where his friend was at and that the security guard refused him entry. Brown stated he told the security guard that he knew Alderman BOHL and that he was going to call him. Brown further stated that is when an unknown male pointed a finger in his face and that he felt he had to defend himself. Brown stated to officers that he is an intern in BOHL'S office and to make sure the officers put his statement in a report. Brown was then cited for Disorderly Conduct and told to leave the area. Brown then began walking back towards the club and started to take pictures with his cell phone. Brown was then told by officers to leave the area or face being arrested for loitering. 14. On 11/12/06 at 2:47 am, Milwaukee Police were dispatched to 951 N James Lovell Street for a Battery. Investigation revealed that the victim was at the Lady Bug Club when she attempted to retrieve her coat, but did not have the claim ticket. The victim admitted to yelling and causing a disturbance when security began to escort her out of the tavern. The victim further stated that she bit the security guard on the hand while she was being escorted out of the tavern. The victim stated that the security guard then stuck his fingers inside the victims' month and decentralized her to the ground and she hit her head on the concrete sidewalk. As he was escorting out a female, she began to fight him causing him to fall on her (the caller). Medical personnel were on scene and treated those injured for cuts and bruises. - 16. On 11/11/07 at 12:13 am, Milwaukee police were dispatched to 618 N Water for a Battery complaint. Investigation revealed that a patron spilled her drink on another patron and alleged that that subject punched her. Security detained the subject until police arrived. Manjee was given a warning by officers and stated future violations would result in citations being issued. Four squads and one sergeant were assigned to the area to enforce violations that were found. A total of 17 parking tickets were issued, two loud music citations and 4 uniform traffic citations that were related to the patrons going to and leaving the tavern. A total of 5.15 hours of police resources was used to monitor this event.
- 21. On 02/03/08, Milwaukee police were assigned to monitor the area of 622 N Water, Lady Bug Club. Due to past problems at the tavern, four squads and one sergeant were assigned to area to enforce violations found. 22 parking tickets, 2 uniform traffic citations, 3 towed vehicles, 1 city license citation, 2 disorderly conducts citations, 2 assault and battery citations, 1 public drinking and 1 littering citation were all issued to patrons of the Lady Bug Club. This was the first night the tavern was open after their suspension. MANJEE stated he had a private promoter that night and he was insisting on letting people in that he would not have. MANJEE stated he had replaced many of his security staff and the doorman was still learning what to look for.
- 32. On 02/08/2009 Milwaukee Police Department squads were assigned to monitor 622 N water St for problems with its crowd and traffic congestion outside. There were also several NTF squads in the area that were ordered down to monitor the tavern and do traffic enforcement. The district squads were in the area for 3 hours and 15 minutes.

On 02/15/2009 at 1:52AM, while on patrol a Milwaukee Police Department squad observed a large crowd gathering outside of the Lady Bug Club, 618 N Water St and several subjects arguing in the street. The officer observed a female lying on the ground in pain and she stated that security from the club had pushed her to the ground. Several squads were called to the scene to disperse the crowd. The victim had x-rays, which revealed that her left wrist and right wrist were broken. The victim was unable to identify which security guard pushed her.
- 34. On 02/21/2009 at 12:01AM, a Milwaukee Police Officer was flagged down by a taxi cab driver for a fight at 622 N Water Street. The owner, Habib MANJEE, stated an unknown black female was escorted out of the club for being disorderly. As she was being escorted out of the club, she became aggressive with security and was yelling at them. Security stated they did not want anything to be done as far as prosecution for disorderly conduct.
- 35. On 03/14/2009 at 2:00AM, a Milwaukee Police Department squad observed traffic was backing up due to Lady Bug Club 622 N Water St letting out. Numerous squads and a sergeant were needed to clear the traffic congestion as well as other incidents.
- 36. On 05/31/2009 at 2:20AM, Milwaukee Police Department squad was doing crowd control at Michigan/Broadway for Tavern 618 Live. The officers observed security trying to escort a subject out of the middle of the street who was yelling, screaming, using profane language and swinging his arms toward security personal. The security guard stated he was grabbed by the subject who punched him with a closed fist on his right side about four times causing pain and swelling. The subject also punched him in the face and chest. Officers approached the subject and tried to conduct a field interview and the subject fled and was taken into custody after a brief foot pursuit. The subject refused to cooperate with police and stated "Fuck You". The subject was very combative and had to be shackled and have a spit mask placed over his face due to his agitated state he was expelling spit during his yelling. The subject was arrested for disorderly conduct and resist or obstruct a police officer.
- 37. On 06/14/2009 at 1:26AM, Milwaukee Police Department squad was dispatched to 618 N Water St for a battery complaint. The victim was observed bleeding from the right side of her head. The victim as well as her friend stated she was hit with a bottle. The security had the suspect detained but did not know it was her so let her go and did not get a name. The video was also looked at but it was of poor quality and the scene was already cleaned up. The victim received two stitches to the right side of her forehead.
- 38. On 07/03/2009 at 3:39AM, Milwaukee Police Department squad was dispatched to 2323 N Lake Dr (St Mary's Hospital) for a battery complaint. The victim stated a known actor struck her in the face with a "martini glass" inside the bar at 618 N Water St and caused her pain. The victim received 7 stitches to her left cheek for the laceration. The case was reviewed at the DA's office and was a "no process" because the victim did not show up.

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RE: MANJEE, Habib

39. On 08/01/2009 at 2:45AM, Milwaukee Police Department detective responded to the shooting investigation at 250 E Wisconsin Avenue. During the investigation an interview of a witness stated he was at "Club 618" located at 618 N Water St with his friend the victim. They were both waiting outside the club to talk with women as they left and they were also walking unknown females to their cars to get their phone numbers. At one point they decided to stand on the northwest corner of N Broadway and E Wisconsin and observe. The witness said at one point a bluish green, medium size, older model 4-door SUV pulled up to the corner and one of the two occupants said "Break yourself." Both of them started to run at which time the witness heard a single shot. The victim said he was shot and the SUV fled in an unknown direction. The witness is unable to provide a description of the occupants of the vehicle as he was extremely intoxicated at the time and it happened so fast. The victim was treated for his gunshot to his right thigh at Froedtert Hospital. The owner, Habib MANJEE was issued a citation for:

40. On Sunday, Oct 18, 2009 AT 12:45 am, a squad was sent to the 618 N. Water St. (Ladybug Club/618 Live) for a fight. The squad had been there 20 minutes earlier for 'trouble with a subject'. At that incident, club security was holding an individual who they did not want cited, but just to leave. The subject was allowed to leave. The same person then returned, and punched a security guard in the nose. The actor was cited.

41. On 11/01/09 at 2:11 am, Milwaukee police were dispatched to 618 N Water For a Subject With Gun complaint. Upon arrival, officers observed several subjects in handcuffs next to an auto along with Wisconsin State Patrol officers and security from 618 Club standing in the middle of the street in front of the tavern. Officers also observed several patrons entering and exiting the club screaming and causing a disturbance. Due to the large crowd and lack of additional squad cars, the scene was slow in being controlled. Officers began to speak with the State Patrol who advised them they received a call regarding shots being fired and a description of an auto involved. Upon their arrival, they observed the car and recovered a 9 mm pistol, which was located under the front passenger seat and placed all occupants in custody. While the State Patrol was attempting to investigate, security from the club interfered with the troopers who were attempting to conduct a high-risk traffic stop. The troopers repeatedly ask security to stay back and were unable to identify where all the occupants were all seated except for the driver, hindering the investigation. Milwaukee officers spoke to Habib Manjee along with security guards for the club to determine what occurred. Manjee was not able to give any accurate details of the incident nor was he able to describe the individuals who were fighting or where the shots came from. Officers spoke to the driver who denied knowledge of a gun being in the car

The driver stated he was at the club to pick up women and that all of a sudden, a large fight erupted and that he ran from the club because he was scared due to being shot in the past. The driver further stated he ran to his car when three males asked for a ride to their auto and got in. The driver stated he began to accelerate when he was stopped and pulled out of the car by security guards and cops. The other occupants were interviewed and denied having any knowledge of the pistol in the auto. No one on scene appeared to be injured or shot and no reports of any gunshot wound victims came in from area hospitals. The gun was placed on inventory.

- 42. On 11/28/09 at 1:25 am, Milwaukee police were flagged down by Ladybug security for a Trouble With Subject complaint. Security guard Jonathan Howard stated a patron in the club had just been removed for causing a disturbance and that he was threatening to beat up Howard and to come back with a gun and shoot up the club. Howard stated he feared for his safety. Officers spoke to the actor who stated he was kicked out of the club but denied making any threats. A citation was issued to the subject for disorderly conduct.
- 43. On 02/05/10 at 1:43 am, Milwaukee police were dispatched to 622 N Water Street for a Fight complaint. Officers observed a fight on the sidewalk and investigation found that one of the subjects was a patron inside the club prior to the fight.
- 44. On 02/06/10 at 1:43 am, Milwaukee police observed a Club 618 security trying to break up a fight in front of the Lady Bug Club. A crowd began to gather and other fights began to break out. Additional officers were called to the scene to help restore order. A total of six patrons were cited for disorderly conduct and fighting. One other subject was arrested on warrants.
- 45. On 02/07/10 at 1:00 until 2:30 am, Milwaukee police monitored club activity during this time with one minor altercation. The incident was video taped and placed on inventory.
- 46. On 02/21/10 at 11:30 pm, a Milwaukee police officer while on patrol observed a large amount of vehicular traffic clogging the intersection at Michigan and Broadway. The officer also observed several subjects hanging out of vehicles and heard an unnecessary number of vehicle horns being honked for no apparent reason. The officer also heard the unnecessary revving of vehicles engines and observed a large amount of people standing in the street. Shortly after, the officer then observed several people fighting while other subjects gathered and cheered on. This incident was capture on video by a citizen and it was placed on police inventory. More squads were called to help with crowd control and several citations were issued for assault and battery. As patrons were observed leaving 618 Live, they would enter the cars and generally drive around in circles around the block. Officers conducted follow up at 618 Live and spoke to Manjee. Manjee was irate when questioned by officers regarding the activity that was occurring in and around the club. A citation was issued to Manjee for Disorderly Conduct by Patrons. Citation was not found in the Municipal Court system.
- 47. On 02/27/10, while on patrol, a Milwaukee police officers was flagged down by the owner of 618 Live, Habib Manjee, regarding two patrons who were asked to leave the bar because they were causing trouble. These subjects threatened to come back and shoot up the place. Habib stated the subjects left in auto with temporary plates. A check of the area was done and officers could not locate the auto.

RE: MANJEE, Habib

- 48. On 03/14/10 at 8:15 pm, Milwaukee police were dispatched to 2356 N 47th Street for a Battery complaint. Investigation found the victim was a patron at 618 Live and got into an argument with a known subject and that it became physical. The suspect hit the victim over the head with a glass causing a laceration to the top of her head. The victim sought treatment at a nearby hospital and received 6 stitches and 6 staples to close the wound. She then reported the incident to police. On Friday, March 19, 2010, officers conducted follow up at 618 Live and spoke to Manjee regarding the incident. Mangee stated he was unaware of any incident that occurred that day and there was no video surveillance of the incident.
- 49. On 07/16/10 at 1:10 am, Milwaukee police were flagged down by the manager of 618 Live regarding an auto that was driving around spraying pepper spray at patrons who were leaving the club. Officers were provided a description of the auto, which they located and stopped when they were approached by another auto with the female driver who had an unconscious female in the back seat. Medical personnel were called to the scene and the unconscious female was taken to the hospital. Officers spoke to the driver who stated she and her friend were at 618 Live when a fight broke out inside the club. Security began pushing people out of the club when an unknown male punched her friend in the face causing her friend to fall into some bushes. An unknown female then began hitting her friend in the head with the heal of a shoe until she was unconscious. Police also spoke to the victim who relayed similar events of what occurred only adding she believed she knew who the female was that was hitting her with a shoe. The victim was treated for a fractured nose. Officers viewed video of the interior of the tavern, which shows security removing the victim and a group of friends she was with. No physical altercation was observed on video.
- 50. On 09/25/10 at 12:04, Milwaukee police were dispatched to 622 N Water Street for a Battery complaint. Upon arrival, officers were met by Habib Manjee and his security staff who had a subject in handcuffs laying on the ground in front of the club. Manjee stated the suspect had been involved in an altercation inside the club and was removed. Once outside, the suspect made threats of returning with a weapon to do the tavern harm. A citation was issued for disorderly conduct to the suspect. Several calls were received regarding this incident while police were on scene. While officers attempted to investigate this complaint, another fight involving patrons who were leaving the club occurred down the street.
- 51. On 10/17/10, Milwaukee police were dispatched to District Five to investigate a Battery complaint. The victim stated he was at the Lady Bug Club with his brother and a friend when a fight broke out. The victim stated security then began beating him with an unknown object, possibly a flashlight or baton, in the head. The victim stated he blacked out and when he woke up, he found himself at St Mary's Hospital. He further stated he did not know how he got there. Police spoke with the victim's friend who stated she was exiting the bathroom and someone told her that her friend "got jumped". She then walked to her vehicle where she saw her friend (the victim) stumbling around holding his face, which had blood all over it. Officers conducted follow up and spoke with Habib Manjee. Manjee stated he was informed of a fight taking place between two customers with security breaking it up. Manjee provided officers with video surveillance, which showed the victim in a fight with another patron and that security did not hit the victim. The victim received numerous stitches under his left and right eyes.

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RE: MANJEE, Habib

- 52. On 01/09/2011 at 1:10, a Milwaukee Police Department squad was flagged down by the licensee (MANJEE, Habib) of the Lady Bug Club at 622 N Water Street. MANJEE handed the officer a WI photo ID that was given to him by an underage subject at the door who was still standing on the sidewalk. The investigation revealed the subject and the photo on the ID didn't match. The subject admitted to using a fake ID to gain entry to taverns. While issuing the citation to the subject, the staff of the club escorted a disorderly subject outside. This subject began arguing with another officer who ordered her to leave the premises. As she was leaving she turned around and made verbal threats towards MANJEE, then spit on him. This subject was cited and advised by MANJEE she was banned for life from the Club. While finishing up this investigation another subject was escorted out of the Club for causing a disturbance. She was ordered to leave the area by officers, as she was walking away she continued to be loud and boisterous using profane language. She became involved in a fight around the corner. The other actor involved stated their fight started inside the Club earlier. A total of four (4) citations were issued outside the Club for the actions of its patrons.
- 53. On 02/05/2011 at 11:24PM, a Milwaukee Police Department squad was flagged down by the licensee (MANJEE, Habib) of the Lady Bug Club at 622 N Water Street. MANJEE handed the officer a WI photo ID that was given to him by an underage subject at the door who was still standing on the sidewalk. The investigation revealed the subject and the photo on the ID didn't match. The subject attempted to convince the officer the ID was her until the real person listed on the ID was brought over to the squad. The subject was issued three (3) citations for her actions.
- 54. On 03/11/2011, a Milwaukee Police Department squad was instructed to monitor a concert event-taking place at Lady Bug Club at 622 N Water Street. MANJEE earlier in the week contacted the Captain from District One and requested a police presence. In all this required 12 Milwaukee Police squads to control traffic as well as crowd control when the event let out.
- 55. On 04/02/2011, a Milwaukee Police Officer was instructed to file a PA-33 regarding a previous incident at the Lady Bug Club at 622 N Water Street. On 03/13/2011 at approximately 12:30AM, a Milwaukee Police Sgt and Lt observed a subject being escorted out of the Club who was causing a disturbance by shouting profanities and attempting to fight with the staff. The subject was cited for her actions.
- 56. On 05/01/2011 at 1:28, Milwaukee Police Department squads responded to a back up for several fights on the sidewalk in front of Lady Bug Club at 622 N Water Street. The security staff, as well as the licensee, was attempting to break up several fights. As more squads arrived the security staff disengaged from the fights and allowed the police to break them up. A security guard approached an officer and told him, "There is a guy in the backseat of that gray, Nissan, Altima with a gun in his left hand." As the officer looked over he observed a blackmale sitting in the backseat on the passenger side with his door open and holding a black semi-automatic handgun in his left hand. The actor observed officers approaching with guns drawn and lunged across the back seat putting his hand beneath the drivers seat before bringing it out empty. Once the actor was taken into custody after resisting a black semi-automatic handgun, with five (5) rounds in the magazine was found under the drivers seat. The actor admitted to having the gun and being a patron at Lady Bug Club.

- 57. On 09/22/12 and 09/23/12, Milwaukee police monitored the 618 Live on Water nightclub. Officers observed about 150-200 people standing in two separate lines in front of the club. Officers spoke with Habib Manjee, and advised him that the sidewalks needed to be kept clear. Security cleared the sidewalks, but when officers returned shortly after, the sidewalks were once again cluttered with patrons. It was then at 12:30 am, that the club shut the doors due to capacity limit with about 30-40 people still waiting outside. Manjee was speaking with officers when they observed security eject two patrons for fighting. Police believed there more fights inside the club and requested back up. As the crowd was exiting the club, many patrons were disorderly and several more arguments were occurring throughout the crowd. At one point, officers heard glass breaking while standing by the exit door and observed patrons attempting to leave with partial bottles of alcohol. Police could also smell a strong odor of marijuana filling the air and once officers were able to gain entry into the club, the odor was even stronger. The incidents that occurred required seven squads to control the crowd and clear the area. The incident began at 1:39 am and cleared the area at 3:44 am.
- 58. On 01/26/13 at 12:03 am, Milwaukee police were dispatched to a Noise Complaint at 622 N Water Street. Officers spoke to an employee (the caller) from Hilton Garden located at 611 N Broadway, who stated that she could hear bass and loud music coming into the Westside of the building in the basement where she is employed and found it was coming from Club 618. The caller stated her supervisor told her to call police. The caller escorted police into her building where officers could hear the music. Police then went to Club 618 and spoke with Habib Manjee who stated the music was fine and that he has no bass in the back. Manjee further stated, "What this is fine, I see no problem". Manjee was advised that there was a complaint and a citation would be issued. Manjee then became upset, stating that the police and the Alderman were out to get him and are trying to close down his establishment. Manjee further stated that he wanted a Supervisor because he didn't like how the officer was investigating the assignment. Manjee also stated, "I'm going to pay bums to sit in front of the hotel and go inside" in attempts to hurt the hotel. Per Captain Bastings, a citation was not issued at this time.
- 59. On 01/30/13 at 3:00 pm, a meeting took place between Captain Basting and the owner of the Club 618, Manjee Habib and Michele Klingbeil, Event Planning. Discussed were complaints of excessive noise in the alley behind the club adjacent to the Hilton Garden Hotel have encouraged Mr. Manjee to invest in adding insulation inside his club. Mr. Manjee has checked the decibel levels of other clubs and has made attempts to gain access to the hotel to measure the noise levels-without success. Mr. Manjee has also added another level of security to include monitoring the alley and streets around the club. Mr. Manjee conducts a "roll call" with his security force of 12-15 each weekend night and addresses issues that arise. Mr. Manjee also closely monitors his many cameras and also goes out on the street and assess the situation. He also refuses admittance to problem customers.

- 60. On 06/02/13 at 2:13 am, Milwaukee police were dispatched to 225 E Michigan for a Shooting complaint. Officers spoke to the victim who stated an unknown male shot him in the parking lot at 225 E Michigan. The victim further stated that the suspect and his friends were in Club 618 earlier, as was he and that they got into a fight before he was shot. On Sunday, June 2, 2013, police obtained video surveillance from the Hilton Hotel, which revealed four unknown males exit a SUV at approximately 1:02 am and walk west to the alley between Water and Broadway. On 06/04/13, police spoke with Habib Manjee and also obtained video surveillance footage, which shows the same four suspects who were observed on video obtained from the Hilton Hotel, entering the club at 1:07 am. The same four suspects returned to the SUV at approximately 1:55 am, after exiting the club. The suspects were also observed fighting with the victim and witnesses prior to the shooting. Manjee helped police identify the suspects through the archives of the photo ID system that he utilizes. Two of the four suspects were not required to scan their photo ID cards at the door the night of the shooting because they frequent the club often.
- 61. On 07/05/13 at 12:59 am, Milwaukee police were on directed patrol of the area at 622 N Water Street, and Michigan and Clybourn Streets. Police heard four shots in the area just North/East of their location and an officer walked through the parking lot East towards Broadway Street. Another officer drove a squad Northbound through the alley and onto Michigan Street. Officers observed several subjects crossing the street and one subject being carried. As an officer approached the subjects, an officer confirmed a shooting occurred via police radio. The officer observed that the subject being carried was shot to the stomach and another was shot to the upper leg. MFD arrived on scene and an officer questioned the victim who was shot to the leg and found that he was under the age of 21. When the officer asked why he was in an area with bars even though he was not at the legal drinking age, the subject stated that he and his friend were walking in the area of Club 618 because they knew there were going to be "HOES" (woman) in the club and wanted to holler at them. (Talk to them) Further investigation found that one of the shooting victim's brothers was in the club with friends from Miller record label. Miller record label represented the group that performed at Club 618.
- 62. On 07/12/13 at 1:00 am, Milwaukee police observed multiple subjects fighting near the intersection of N Water Street and E Michigan Avenue. Officers from the Mounted Patrol, Motorcycle Unit, and Neighborhood Task Force were needed to disperse the crowd and break up fights. Police observed multiple subjects one of which was refusing police orders from an officer on scene. This subject was placed into custody and eventually handcuffed and placed in the back of a squad. This subject appeared to police to be under the influence of alcohol. Officers could also detect an overwhelming smell of burnt marijuana coming from the crowd that had refused to disperse. The subject eventually calmed down and was released on scene. At approximately 1:50 am, police heard a gunshot coming from 630 N Broadway. Witnesses advised police that a subject in a white van had a gun. Police located the van and conducted a traffic stop, and found the driver to be the subject that police retained in the back of the squad earlier. Police recovered a gun and the suspect was arrested and charged with ENSBUDW and OWI. A passenger was arrested as well on warrants and told police that he and his friend, (the driver of the auto) were at Club 618 when a fight took place outside of the club. This subject denied seeing his friend with a gun, however heard shots being fired prior to the traffic stop and his arrest. The subject also stated that his friend was "wasted" drunk. While the traffic stop was being conducted, police heard several more shots being fired just south of their location.

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- 63. On 07/23/13 at 9:00 am, at the request of Captain Basting, Mr. Habib Manjee and his attorney Mike Maistelman along with Captain Basting, Lt. Looney and Michele Klingbeil met at the Police Administration Building to discuss the recent shootings and shots fired incidents in the area surrounding the club. In addition to the noise and clientele issues that have caused problems in the past, the most recent incidents that have prompted discussion of a revocation of license requested by the Hilton Garden Hotel. Discussed were adding more security to monitor the alley and streets around the club and soundproofing to the building. Mr. Manjee stated he too is tired of the all problems and has cancelled all of his outside promoters. In addition, he plans to close for a couple weeks in fall to re-assess, and that he is looking to change his venue to something other than the type of music that he currently offers and possibly return to Electronic Dance Music and having teen night that was successful in the past. Captain Basting asked that he submit a written plan and Attorney Maistelman gave assurance that they would complete it this week.
- 64. On 03/14/2014 Milwaukee police observed a subject, while waiting in line to enter the tavern 618 Live, throw U.S. currency into the air. This caused people to run into the street, blocking traffic. There were approximately 100 people in line waiting to enter the business.
- 65. On 04/20/2014 at approximately 1:30am Milwaukee police responded to the 600 block of North Water Street to assist with bar close. Officers observed two subjects fighting in the street in front of 628 North Water Street (Ultra Lounge). While investigating the fight, a third subject approached officers and asked for the status of one of the subjects involved in the fight. This subject left, but returned a short time later again asking officers about the status of one of the subjects involved in the fight. The subject again left, but returned a short time later armed with a semi-automatic pistol. This subject was arrested for disorderly conduct while armed and told officers he had been at Ultra Lounge prior to the incident. The two subjects originally detained were cited for disorderly conduct and told officers they had come from 618 Live (622 North Water Street). Milwaukee police incident report #141100020 filed.
- 66. On 05/24/2014 Milwaukee police observed a fight in front of 618 Live (622 North Water Street). Investigation revealed a group of approximately ten females were involved in a fight which stemmed from an incident which occurred inside the business. Four females were cited for Disorderly Conduct, two of which were under the legal drinking age of 21 and had used fraudulent identification to enter the business.
- 67. On 05/31/2014 Milwaukee police were monitoring the closing of the tavern Club 618 (622 North Water Street). Security guards from the business informed officers that there was an altercation occurring in the Chase Bank parking garage (525 North Water Street). Officers observed a large group of individuals in the lower level of the parking garage. Some of these individuals left the parking structure, once alerted to the presence of police. Officers continued on to investigate and observed two subjects sitting in the front seat of a vehicle parked inside the garage. Closer inspection revealed several unfired cartridges lying on the ground next to auto. The subject sitting in the driver's seat fled on foot, but was apprehended by police after attempting to throw a loaded 9mm semi-automatic handgun into the Milwaukee River. The subject sitting in the passenger seat also fled on foot but was apprehended by security guards from Club 618. Following an altercation with police, this subject was also arrested. On 05/31/14 at 10:00pm a Milwaukee Police Sergeant was able to view photos taken at Club 618,

which showed the suspects had been in the establishment before the incident occurred. Milwaukee police incident report #141510022 filed.

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- 68. On 06/15/2014 Milwaukee police observed 4 patrons fighting near the front door of 618 Live (622 North Water Street). One subject was cited for disorderly conduct, another subject was cited for disorderly conduct, misrepresent age, and presence of minor. Officers recovered a fake identification from the suspect and confirmed this was the identification used to enter the club from the clubs printout.
- 69. On 08/02/2014 Milwaukee police observed approximately 200 people waiting in line to enter 618 Live. Officers observed two people involved in an altercation at the south end of the line. Both of these subjects were cited for disorderly conduct. The Milwaukee police Mounted Patrol Unit was requested to assist in maintaining order.
- 70. On 08/03/2014 Milwaukee police observed a subject being ejected from 618 Live (622 North Water Street). This subject was arrested and cited for disorderly conduct when he refused to leave the area and was observed by officers shouting profanity at security.
- 71. On 10/03/2014 a Milwaukee police officer observed a stolen car being driven in the area of Old World Third Street and West Highland Avenue. The officer was later informed by other officers that the stolen auto was parked around the corner from 618 Live and that three occupants had exited the auto and were walking toward the club. It was believed that all three suspects entered the club prior to the arrival of police. After being informed of the situation by police, the applicant had club security trail the suspects which led to two of the suspects being apprehended. The apprehending officer writes "Without the clubs immediate assistance I would not have been able to get the information critical to the stolen auto complaint".
- 72. On 10/04/2014 at 1:46am a Milwaukee police officer went over the air with a "huge fight" in front of 618 Live. Subsequently, the Milwaukee police mounted patrol and 15 additional police squads responded and discovered numerous separate fights in the area involving 20-40 people each. While investigating these fights, officers were told by staff from the bar that there were still approximately 150 people inside the tavern The officer who originally called for assistance regarding the "huge fight" indicates that he had been assigned to monitor the release of The Ultra Lounge and 618 Live. This officer observed a subject screaming, pounding and pulling on the front door of 618 Live after being ejected from the business. The applicant told police that this subject had been ejected for fighting inside the business and that the other combatant had been kicked out of the back door of the tavern. The two combatants located each other again after being ejected from the club and again began fighting. This incident led to other fights and other patrons gathering to view the commotion. Security staff from 618 Live was observed assisting officers break up the fights. 618 Live staff also provided police with video footage of the incident. Five subjects were cited as a result of the fights. officers were unable to detain additional subjects because of the number of fights occurring in close proximity to each other. At one point an officer used Oleoresin Capsicum "pepper spray" to stop the actions of one of the combatants. One of the suspects citied admitted to coming from the Ultra Lounge
- 73. On 10/08/2014 the applicant and representatives of The Ultra Lounge met with representatives of the Milwaukee police department and the Milwaukee city attorney's office to discuss areas

of concern including fights that occur on a regular basis at the end of the night. Several suggestions were made to help alleviate these issues. Some of the suggestions recommended for implementation by The Ultra Lounge, such as using an ID scanner, are already in place at 618 Live. Some suggestions, such as a patron being banned from one business also being banned from the other, are applicable to both businesses. Suggestions that would apply only to 618 Live were to change their minimum age to 23 and decrease capacity from the current 480 to 350. On 10/09/2014 it was agreed that capacity would be lowered to 400 and the minimum age would be changed to 23. Upon entering the establishment Officers observed a member of 618 Live's security, Dewin Stewart, who appeared angry and yelling at other members of 618 security. Members of the secuirty staff informed officers they had just fought with Stewart because he attacked and injured Habib Manjee. Mr. Manjee had suffered a ½ inch laceration to back of his head and Stewart had a laceration below his left eye. Manjee stated that Stewart became upset after he was instructed to move around the club. Stewart grabbed Manjee and slammed him against the wall. Officers reviewed video which confirmed Manjee's account of the incident. Milwaukee police incident report #150390018 filed.
- 76. On 03/21/2015 a vehicle fled from Milwaukee police as they attempted to pull it over near North Broadway Street and West Wisconsin Avenue. One of the officers believed the driver of the vehicle had come from 618 Live on Water/Lady Bug Club. Officers went to 618 Live and asked to view surveillance video. The applicant's cooperation resulted in the driver of the fleeing vehicle being identified. Milwaukee police incident #150800010 filed.
- 77. On 04/23/2015 Milwaukee police observed security from 618 running towards East Michigan Street. Officers followed and observed approximately 30 people in the street causing traffic to stop. Officers then observed two females fighting, these females stopped fighting and left the area when the officers activated there squads lights and sirens. Staff from 618 along with additional officers cleared the area without further incident.
- 78. On 07/05/2015 Milwaukee police requested a copy of video surveillance from 618 Live of an incident that had occurred the previous night, not related to 618. The applicant provided police with a DVD of the requested video.
- 79. On 08/15/2015 a subject, Tommy Miller, was ejected from 618 Live (622 North Water Street). Approximately half an hour later, the passenger in a Pontiac Vibe was seen pointing a handgun at Milwaukee police officers. The operator of the Pontiac Vibe was the same Tommy Miller that had earlier been ejected from 618 Live. Milwaukee police incident report #152270023 filed.
- 80. On 08/15/2015 Milwaukee police observed a fight spill from the front door of 618 North Water Street (618 Live). While breaking up that and several other fights occurring in the area, one

Milwaukee police officer deployed elepresin capsicum and another officer used an electronic control device to take another subject into custody. This subject was cited for disorderly conduct. Milwaukee police incident report #152270016 filed.

- 81. On 10/09/2015 Milwaukee police observed approximately 200 waiting in line to enter 618 Live (622 North Water Street). This line of patrons obstructed the sidewalk, causing officers to intervene and move the crowd away from the congested area for about an hour.
- 82. On 10/11/2015 at 1:14am Milwaukee police conducted a count of patrons as they exited 618 Live (622 North Water Street). This count, which concluded at 2:00am, includes an unknown number of employees still inside the business and totals 566. The business's capacity is 400. The applicant was written citation #61458202 for Licensed Establishment-Exceeding Occupancy Limit with a court date of 12/18/2015.

On Saturday, August 15, 2015 at approximately 2:00 a.m. while on squad 1421 I was on the CODE RED deployment in the 600 block of N Water St. While on scene I observed a large fight spill out from the front door of 618 N Water St (618 LIVE). While on scene with multiple officers I began help to clear the crowd from the front of the tavern. While attempting to do so I observed Christopher J. BUFORD (B/M 10/21/86) exit the tavern and look at me a state "You want to see some bullshit? I'll show you some bullshit." BUFORD was walking south in the 600 block of N Water St. While attempting to breakup the other fights that were breaking out in the area I observed BUFORD chasing an unknown black male in a white t-shirt, with long dreadlocked hair, and another black male in a black t-shirt. BUFORD at the time was chasing the unknown black male with a raised fist in order to strike him. At this time in an effort to prevent any attack on myself or the male that was being chased I delivered a 3 second burst of my oleoresin capsicum spray. Following the delivery of my spray I was still attempting to break up active fighting still going on. As I attempted to find the suspect I sprayed I observed BUFORD on the ground at 618 N Water St, and it was apparent Squad 1340 (P.O. FIGUEROA) had deployed Electronic Control Device on BUFORD and had taken him into custody. BUFORD was arrested for misdemeanor charges for Disorderly Conduct and resisting an officer.

During the fights that were occurring the security staff along with MANJEE were trying to control the fighting as well as they could, but there were too many fights breaking out through out the 600 block of N Water St.

On Saturday August 15, 2015 at approximately 2:00 a.m. while on Squad 1421 I was in the front of 618 Live (622 N Water St) when a large fight broke out inside of the tavern and multiple people were ejected from the from the front door of the tavern. While at the front of the tavern I observed Tommy L. MILLER (B/M 07/09/91) being physically removed for the tavern for fighting. Following observing MILLER being eject myself and other officer were dealing with multiple large fights breaking out, and I did not observe MILLER again until responding the below incident to assist Squad 1420 (P.O. BALESTRIERI and P.O. MARTIN).

The following report is a synopsis of the incident report written by P.O. Patrick BALESTRIERI assigned to District Onc, Power Shift. Milwaukee Police Department IR#152270023.

On Saturday August 15, 2015 at approximately 02:36 AM, Squad 1420 was in the area of 618 N Water St, for fight call. When we reached the intersection of Water St and Wisconsin Ave. we were flagged down by 4 black females who were running from a silver vehicle (silver 2004 Pontiac Vibe LP# 760XKL, VIN 5Y2SL64844Z401152) that was facing eastbound on the north side of Wisconsin Ave. The four black females had previous contact with MARTIN and I during the fight and exclaimed "MARTIN, MARTIN they got a gun, they going to shoot us"

When the four black females pointed to the Vibe the driver, later identified as Tommy L MILLER (b/m 07/09/91, 6'1, 190 Lbs., blk hair, brown eyes) and the passenger later identified as Michael TATE (b/m 07/09/81, 5'9, 160 Lbs., brown hair in a short dread style with brown eyes) hastily entered the Vibe. We followed the Vibe in our squad car with the intention of conducting a traffic stop. As the Vibe reached the intersection of E Michigan Ave and N Water St, the driver disregarded the red traffic signal that was stopping east/west directional traffic. At the same time uniformed officers (PO Gregory KUSPA and PO Alexander KLABUNDE) were by their marked squad car with emergency lights activated taking down traffic barriers for northbound traffic on N. Water St. The officers were standing at the approximate address of 600 N. Water St. As the Pontiac Vibe was traveling through the intersection PO MARTIN and I both observed the front passenger (TATE) extend his arm out the front passenger window and point a handgun in the direction of PO KUSPA and PO KLABUNDE. At this time we made the decision to pursue this vehicle. Eventually the vehicle pulled to the side of the road and parked at the approximate address of 610 N. 2nd St. During the search of the vehicle a 9mm Smith and Wesson SD9VE with a silver slide and black handle with the serial number HEZ2602 was found in plain view, on the back seat behind the drivers seat. MILLER and TATE were arrested and charged with Pointing a Firearm at a Police Officer, Possession of Stolen Firearm, and MILLER was charged with Fleeing. The Milwaukee County District Attorneys office issued all charges.

PO SCHMIDT had his squad (Car 107) parked out front of 618 Live, with his squad car camera running, facing the entrance to the door. Most of these fights were caught on squad camera. There were several fights that were off camera also witnessed by PO Paul BJORKQUIST and PO SCHMIDT.

Due to the several fights and the bar crowd's behavior, Sq. 1413 (SGT. David LIGAS) had Sq. 1420 (PO James LUCKETT and I) pulled off our normal Code RED area, which is N. Old World Third St. SGT. LIGAS also had Sq. 1441 (PO Neil VERBURGT and PO Zachary JOHNSON) pulled off their street, which is E. Brady St. SGT. LIGAS also had another Sergeant respond to the 600BLK of N Water ST., which was Sq. 1210 (SGT. John SCHEERER)

On Sunday, 12/14/14 at 1:17A, Sq. 1413 (SGT. LIGAS) observed a B/F (Shanika WILLFORD, B/F, 07/15/91) yelling and cursing outside of 618 Live (622 N Water St.) attempting to start a fight, which caused a disturbance. WILFORD was issued a citation.

On Sunday, 12/14/14 at 2:11P, Sq. 1449 (PO BJORKQUIST and PO SCHMIDT) warned a subject, later identified as Travis O MCGEE (B/M, 04/07/89), who came out of the bar and started to loiter around the front entrance of tavern. There're several signs that indicate no loitering. MCGEE was advised several times to leave the area but he refused to do so.

Upon 618 Live letting out, the bar's crowd went northbound on N. Water ST and eastbound on E. Michigan Av. Due to the heavy crowd that was leaving, numerous streets were blocked off by squad cars. Several women started to dance in the street just east of N. Water St on E. Michigan Av. The crowd started to walk towards a parking lot near N. Broadway and E. Michigan St, which is a common place for patrons of 618 Live to park.

Sq. 1441 (PO JOHNSON and VEBURGT) were inside this parking lot monitoring the area, when a vehicle fired 4 shots and drove away (INC# 143480015). Casings were recovered at 341 E. Michigan Av. It should be noted that we were unable to determine which bar the subject who shot the firearm came out of.

PA-33E Narrative

This report was written by P.O. Todd Bohlen, assigned to District # 1 day shift.

On Sat. 02/07/2015, I was assigned to work Code Red Entertainment District Uniform Patrol for the nightclub, 618 Live, located at 618 N. Water St., from 10:00 pm - 3:00 am or so, with P.O. William Del Moral.

Squad 1449 (P.O.'s Joseph Serio and Gerald Schmidt) were also assigned to the same detail as we were.

At approximately 1:05 am, while we were seated in our squad car, which was parked directly across the street from 618 N. Water St., were flagged down (flashing of security flashlight) by a 618 Live's security personnel in regards to a fight inside the clubs entrance door. Squad 1449 was also seated inside there uniform squad car which was parked directly in front of unmarked squad car.

Upon all four of us uniform officers entering the clubs front entrance door, we observed a very large black male (6'04" tall and 430 lbs.) wearing the clubs issued red 618 Live standard security issued security shirt, standing just inside the front door breathing heavy and yelling at other security people who were wearing the same security shirt. This subject was later identified as: Dewin A. Stewart, b/m, 08/31/1981. Stewart appeared very angry and continued to yell at other security personnel, and the owner of the club - Habib (nmn) Manjee, w/m, 07/16/1964 (victim). Stewart was yelling about people putting there hands on him. I was initially confused about who the problem was with or what was going on. Security quickly related that they had just fought with Stewart for attacking and injuring Manjee. I observed Manjee to be bleeding from an approximately 1/2" long laceration to the back center of head. Manjee also had an approximately 6" long vertical tear by his left chest in the black cotton button up shirt he was wearing.

I asked Stewart several times to step outside of the club onto the city sidewalk, away from Manjee and the security personnel, so we could talk about what had occurred. I was trying to remove Stewart from this immediate area to avoid another fight from occurring and try to calm the situation down. I had feared that a physical fight would start again, and Stewart was very large and could seriously injure anyone if he wanted to. Also there were several club patrons in this front entry hallway waiting to gain entry to the club, and I did not want them to become involved nor injured in this incident. I also knew that were only a few people in the waiting line directly outside this entrance door. I talked Stewart into walking outside with us, which he did. While standing outside the club on the city sidewalk, P.O. Del Moral and I interview Stewart. At this point I observed Stewart to have an 1/8" bleeding laceration below his left eye. Stewart declined any medical treatment.

Interview of Dewin A. Stewart

Stewart stated that he has worked at this club 618 Live, for the owner for Manjee, since New Years Eve this year as a security person. He stated he always got along with Manjee and all the other 15+-security personnel and other staff members. He stated he has never had a prior problem with Manjee nor any other club personnel. He stated tonight he was assigned to roving inside security patrol inside the club. At about 1:00 am Manjee walked up to him and told him conflicting orders on where and how to walk around inside the club. He stated that he remained on the first floor of this two story club, because someone had just thrown a fist full of \$20.00 bills into the air which caused a mad scurry for the money by the surrounding club patrons. He stated he stayed at this location to make sure that everything would get back to normal. He stated he tried to tell Manjee this, but had to yell it at him because the music on this part of the 1st dance area floor was very loud. He stated that minutes later a fellow security person (Darren D. Townsel, b/m, 01/31/1970) approached him and told him he had to walk around. He stated he remained at this location to make sure that no fights occurred over the money that patrons picked up. He stated minutes later, Manjee again walked up to him and told him if he was not going to do his job and walk around like he told him, he should just go home. Stewart stated he tried to explain by yelling over the music to Manjee what he was doing, when Manjee punched him twice to the left side of his face. Causing the visible small 1/8" bleeding laceration below his left eye. (Stewart refused medical attention, stating he would go on his own if he felt he needed it.) Stewart stated that at this point he grabbed Manjee, so Manjee would stop striking him, and pushed Manjee threw the crowd towards the entrance door. He stated that's when other security personnel grabbed him and pushed him into the entrance hallway, and we walked in.

Neither Manjee nor Stewart showed any signs of any alcohol consumption, nor did any of the witnesses, nor any of the other club employees. Manjee has his employees adhere to a strict no alcohol drinking while working at his work place.

At this point we were unable to get to view the surveillance video recording of this incident. Due to conflicting stories by Manjee, and Stewart, I issued Stewart municit#6154857-2 for disorderly conduct and walked him to his auto to leave the scene. This incident seemed to inflame the club patrons and we only had (4) uniform officers to monitor this 300+ people club crowd.

This incident was captured on (2) in-club surveillance cameras. The first camera showed the dance floor and the second camera showed the entrance hallway and both clearly captured this incident. After the club closing at approximately 1:50 am, I was able to view the surveillance recording of this incident. Upon viewing this on screen recording, I observed the time and date stamp to be correct. 618 Live plain clothes security person Sirvest D. Hudson, b/m, 05/16/1982, burned a DVD of this incident. Upon viewing the video, it shows that Manjee never struck Stewart in the face at all.

Interview of Darren D. Townsel

Following viewing the surveillance video I interviewed Darren D. Townsel, b/m, 01/31/1970, regarding his observations of this incident. He stated that tonight he was working security at 618 Live nightclub, and was wearing his standard issued red 618 Live security shirt during his duties tonight. He stated at about 1:00 am, Manjee walked up to him and told him to get Stewart to walk around inside the club to monitor the crowd on both floors of the club. Townsel then walked up to Stewart and told him to start walking around the club as Manjee had told him to do. He stated he told Stewart this then walked away, figuring Stewart would comply with his request. He stated minutes later he saw Stewart facing Manjee and having a grip on Manjee's shirt by his chest, and to be pushing Manjee backwards, southeastbound towards the entrance door of the club. He stated he immediately came to aid of Manjee and attempted to break Stewarts grip of Manjee's shirt. At this time other security personnel who were nearby also assisted in trying to separate the two, and get Stewart out of the club to avoid further problems. He stated he and about (6) other security personnel were able to wrestle Stewart out of the club to the nearby entrance hallway. During this time Stewart continued to struggle against them and was eventually wrestled to the floor in the front entrance way. He stated they tried to keep him contained on the floor, but due to Stewart's immense size and strength he was able to stand back up. He continued to yell at Stewart to calm down, and Stewart yelled back "Get off me", "Don't touch me". Townsel stated that Stewart was wearing a pair of designer glasses that he believed during this struggle cut Stewart under his left eye. Once Stewart stood back up, security personnel backed away from and signaled for us to come into the club, and we entered at this point.

Interview of Habib Manjee

Manjee stated that on Sunday, February 8, 2015 at 1:00am, he approached one of his security staff members, Dewin Stewart who was standing in the middle of the dance floor and instructed him to move around the club and not to stand in one location. Manjee stated a short time later he observed that Stewart did not comply with his instructions and was still standing in the same area. Manjee stated that he then spoke with another member of his security staff, Darren D. Townsel and instructed him to speak with Stewart and tell him that he can not stand in one location and to move around the club. Manjee stated that he again approached Stewart, instructed him to move around the club and if he didn't like it he could go home. Manjee stated that Stewart became more enraged and began yelling louder. Manjee stated that he turned to walk away from Stewart. Manjee stated that Stewart then grabbed him by the front of his shirt with two hands and began to push him across backwards (southbound) across the club. Manjee then stated that Stewart slammed him into the corner of the club entrance door jam, where he sustained a laceration on the back of his head and back pain. I observed that Manjee had a 1/2" laceration on the back of his head. Manjee stated that Stewart then pushed him (westbound) through the entrance doors onto the ground, where Stewart fell on top of

him. Manjee stated his staff pulled Stewart off him. Manjee stated that he never pushed or struck Stewart.

While P.O. Del Moral was still standing outside the club on the sidewalk with Stewart, I want back into the club and recovered his designer glasses from a security person. These glasses had both arms of the glasses severely bent, one up and one down. I returned this pair of glasses to Stewart, he stated they were prescription glasses and he needed them to drive home.

Note: Bell # 408 responded to treat Manjee and cleaned the 1/2" laceration to the back of his head. Manjee stated he would have to later receive medical attention for this laceration because he had to close the club tonight.

On Sunday, 02/08/2015 at approximately 4:35 pm I opened my MPD E-mail and found that Manjees wife - Shamsa Manjee - had E-mailed me Manjee's medical treatment form from the injuries he received from this incident. Manjee was treated at West Allis Memorial Hospital, admitted at 4:50 am, and was treated by Dr. Michelle D. Hiebert for the listed rear scalp laceration which required (3) medical staples to close the wound, as well as cervical spine strain. Manjee was treated and released.

On Wed. 02/11/2015, I took the original CD-R that 618 Live security person Hudson gave to me on 02/08/2015, to M.P.D. Forensic Video Examiner Shanku Mayes. Mayes transferred these (2) camera-recorded files to a program that was compatible to play on M.P.D. computers. The original was placed on inventory # 15004869.

This case is ordered in to the Milwaukee County District Attorneys Office on 02/11/2015 at 1:30 pm. I ordered the suspect Stewart to appear at this time in the D.A.'s Office. Manjee was not ordered into the District Attorney's Office due to medical reasons from his injury, he is unable to appear.

On Wed. 02/11/2015 at 1:45 pm this case was reviewed by Milwaukee County Assistant District Attorney Jeremy Arn who pended this case for 5 weeks, for an in-house diversion. Stewart did not appear at this charging conference. Arn informed Stewart's lawyer who appeared for Stewart, that Stewart should not have any contact what so ever with Manjee.

PA-33E Narrative

This report is typed by P.O. Daniel Boeck, District-1, Late Power Shift.

On 10-09-15 at 10:30 P.M. while working squad 1421, my partner P.O. Matthew Anderson and I worked Code Red at 622 N. Water St (618 Live.).

While on scene I observed the line in front of the tavern was swelling to approximately 200 persons waiting to enter the tavern. The front of the tavern is organized with approximately four foot tall metal gate pieces, that are strung together to stretch the length of the front of the tavern. The gate is linked together except in the middle, which is directly in front of the door to enter. At one point in time there were many people waiting in the middle of the side walk that were trying to skip the line. This obstructed the side walk for normal pedestrian traffic. I spoke to security about the problem 5 times and no action was taken. I had to step in, and close the middle area due to the fact that the entire sidewalk was blocked by patron's. As a result I had to hand cuff the metal gates together to prevent people going through the middle. Officers on scene began moving the crowd for approximately one hour until it reached a point of order.

This repot is being submitted by P.O. Matthew ANDERSON assigned to District One, Power Shift.

On Sunday October 11, 2015 at approximately 12:30 p.m. Squad 1421 (P.O. BOECK and I) was on foot patrol in the 600 Block of N Water St, for our CODE RED deployment. While on patrol I received a phone call from my Supervisor Squad 1411 (Sgt. ACKLEY). Sgt. ACKLEY stated that he knew that the tavern located at 622 N Water St (618 Live) was busy, and would like me to conduct a count of there patrons as they left the tavern. I at 12:54 p.m. asked the doorman Sedrick D. PEOPLE (B/M 1/31/73) how many patrons were inside of the tavern to which he replied 398 patrons. At 1:14 a.m. I activated the video camera inside my marked squad car, which was pointing facing the front door of the tavern approximately 30 feet from the front door. I was outside of my squad during the count at approximately 30 feet from the front door as well. During the count there was nothing obscuring my view as depicted in the squad footage, at one point in time I moved from the passenger side to the driver side of the vehicle with still no obstruction to my view of the patrons exiting the tavern. During the count we were not able to deploy resources to the rear of the tavern, so I was not able to account for how many patrons if any left from the rear doors. At 2:00 a.m. I concluded my count following entering the tavern and counting the employees I could see at the time. At 2:00 a.m. I concluded my count with a total of 566 persons. The count was conducted using a hand counter. I asked MANJEE what his capacity is to which he stated 400 I then showed him the counter to which he became irate. MANJEE accused me of targeting his tavern stating that I did this because he was coming up of a license renewal hearing. MANJEE stated that there no way I could have counted that many people stating that they were leaving to fast, and that my view was obscured by a bus, which it was not. Sgt ACKLEY on Sunday October 11, 2015 did speak to MANJEE regarding this incident and did confirm that the capacity of 400 is printed on the Tavern License.

2. On 04/20/2014 Milwaukee police, while on patrol in the 600 block of North Water Street as part of Code Red, observed two subjects fighting in front of Ultra Lounge (628 North Water Street). After placing both subjects in custody, a third subject approached the arresting officers and yelled at one of the arrested subjects. This third subject approached officers a total of three times, the third time he was armed with a semi-automatic pistol. This subject, who was also arrested for disorderly conduct while armed, stated he was at Ultra Lounge prior to the incident. - 4. On 07/12/2014 Milwaukee police, while on patrol in the 600 block of North Water Street as part of Code Red, were speaking to bouncers outside Ultra Lounge (628 North Water Street) when a fight broke out inside the business. Bouncers were able to control the situation and held their positions until additional squads responded to assist with crown control.
- 5. On 09/27/2014 Milwaukee police were approached by security from Ultra Lounge and 618 Live, stating there was fight on the sidewalk at approximately 630 North Water Street. While responding, one of the officers fell and injured his right hand.
- 6. On 09/29/2014 a Milwaukee police officer was flagged down by a citizen who stated there was a large fight in the 600 block of North Water Street. Officers responded and discovered a group of 40-50 people in the street and on the sidewalk in front of Ultra Lounge (628 North Water Street), some of which were fighting. This group eventually dispersed and no citations or arrests were made.
- 7. On 10/04/2014 at 1:46am a Milwaukee police officer went over the air with a "huge fight" in front of 618 Live. Subsequently, the Milwaukee police mounted patrol and 15 additional police squads responded and discovered numerous separate fights in the area involving 20-40 people each. While investigating these fights, officers were told by staff from the bar that there were still approximately 150 people inside the tavern. The officer who originally called for assistance regarding the "huge fight" indicates that he had been assigned to monitor the release of The Ultra Lounge and 618 Live. This officer observed a subject screaming, pounding and pulling on the front door of 618 Live after being ejected from the business. The applicant told police that this subject had been ejected for fighting inside the business and that the other combatant had been kicked out of the back door of the tavern. The two combatants located each other again after being ejected from the club and again began fighting. This incident led to other fights and other patrons gathering to view the commotion. Security staff from 618 Live was observed assisting officer's break up the fights. 618 Live staff also provided police with video footage of the incident. Five subjects were cited as a result of the fights, officers were unable to detain additional subjects because of the number of fights occurring in close proximity to each other. At one point an officer used Oleoresin Capsicum "pepper spray" to stop the actions of one of the combatants. One of the suspects citied admitted to coming from the Ultra Lounge.

- 8. On 10/08/2014 the applicant and representatives of The Ultra Lounge met with representatives of the Milwaukee police department and the Milwaukee city attorney's office to discuss areas of concern including fights that occur on a regular basis at the end of the night. Several suggestions were made to help alleviate these issues. Some of the suggestions recommended for implementation by The Ultra Lounge, such as using an ID scanner, are already in place at 618 Live. Some suggestions, such as a patron being banned from one business also being banned from the other, are applicable to both businesses. Suggestions that would apply only to 618 Live were to change their minimum age to 23 and decrease capacity from the current 480 to 350. On 10/09/2014 it was agreed that capacity would be lowered to 400 and the minimum age would be changed to 23. The applicant was advised to contact the license division to update paperwork in order to reflect these changes.
- 9. On 10/20/2014 a Milwaukee police officer was dispatched to the front desk at Milwaukee police district #1 regarding a battery complaint. The victim told officers she had been attacked around 1:30am while inside Ultra Lounge (628 North Water Street) by another patron known to her as Brande Conner. The victim stated she was struck several times in the head with a bottle while inside the business. The victim was treated and released at Froedtert Hospital for a concussion. Milwaukee police incident report #142930140 filed.
- 10. On 10/31/2014 Officers were flagged down at 610 N. Water St by a City of Milwaukee Parking Checker. The checker stated she was writing citations when she was confronted by a group of females who wanted to know why they were getting tickets. The group was understanding except one person, identified as Brittany HORTMAN, who pushed the checker. The Police were flagged down at this point and HORTMAN was issued a Disorderly Conduct citation. HORTMAN stated she was at the Ultra Lounge having drinks right before the confrontation.
- 11. On 11/08/2014 Milwaukee police were flagged down regarding the possibility of an underage patron being inside Ultra Lounge. Officers discovered an 18 year old female inside the business that had used another person's identification to gain entry to the bar. The female was cited for Presence of Underage in Place of Sale and Misrepresentation of Age. The applicant was cited for Allow Underage on Premise and Liquor License Required (later amended to Refilling of Liquor Bottle).



- 12. On 11/15/2014 at 12:22am an Officer received a call about a large fight at 628 N. Water St (Ultra Lounge). When officers arrived they saw patrons leaving in all directions and the front glass door shattered. They were given a description of the actors and that one may be armed with a gun. The investigation revealed a fight occurred inside and continued outside. Two bouncers were injured during the altercation. The actors were not located but while on scene a patron of the bar was observed exiting the bar drinking an alcoholic beverage. The patron continued walking down the sidewalk where he was stopped and cited for public drinking.
- 13. On 01/16/2015 Milwaukee police conducted a tavern check at Ultra Lounge (628 North Water Street) regarding an order to close from the State Department of Revenue. Officers discovered the business was open. The applicant told officers he had obtained a different Tax number and believed the business could be open under this Tax number. Milwaukee police ordered the business closed until the applicant could provide proof from the State Department of Revenue that they were allowed to be open.
- 14. On 01/17/2015 the applicant, along with David Hinton, met with Milwaukee police regarding the status of the business "The Ultra Lounge". The applicant told officers he had obtained a new sellers permit for the business and they believed this new permit allowed them to be open for business. They also told officers they planned on being open that evening (01/17/2015) and they would see where the sellers permit issued went.
- 15. On 07/05/2015 Milwaukee police observed a commotion at Ultra Lounge. Investigation revealed a security guard emptied a canister of OC into the crowd inside the club to disperse a confrontation amongst patrons. The applicant was issued citation #48989511064 for Disorderly Premise. No record of this citation can be located.
- 16. On 08/07/2015 a 20 year old Milwaukee police aide, working in conjunction with Milwaukee police, attempted to gain entry to Ultra Lounge (628 North Water Street) but was denied when she could not produce proof she had attained the legal drinking age of 21.
- 17. On 08/15/2015 Milwaukee police observed an altercation at Ultra Lounge (628 North Water Street). A group of male and female patrons were fighting in the club. Officers followed this group away from the business until they were called away for another assignment.

Items #13, 14, 15, 16 and 17 were added on 08/18/2015 as part of previous premise




