There is a possibility that your application may be denied for one or more of the following reasons: The recommendation of the committee regarding the application shall be based on evidence presented at the hearing. Per MCO 85-2.7-4, probative evidence concerning whether or not a new license should be granted may be presented on the following subjects: whether or not the applicant meets the municipal requirements, the appropriateness of the location and premises where the licensed premises is to be located and whether use of the premises for the purposes or activities permitted by the license would tend to facilitate a public or private nuisance or create undesirable neighborhood problems such as disorderly patrons, unreasonably loud noise, litter, and excessive traffic and parking congestion. Probative evidence relating to these matters may be taken from the plan of operation submitted with the license application, if any, but shall not include the content of any music. Evidence regarding the fitness of the location of the premises to be maintained as the principal place of business, including but not limited to whether there is an overconcentration of businesses of the type for which the license is sought; whether the proposal is consistent with any pertinent neighborhood business or development plans, or the location's proximity to areas where children are typically present. The applicant's record in operating similarly licensed premises; and whether or not the applicant has been charged with or convicted of any felony, misdemeanor, municipal offense or other offense, the circumstances of which substantially relate to the activity to be permitted by the license being applied for or any other factor which reasonably relates to the public health, safety or welfare may also be considered. See attached police report or correspondence.

Notice for applicants with warrants or unpaid fines:

Proof of warrant satisfaction or payment of fines must be submitted at the hearing on the above date and time. Failure to comply with this requirement may result in a delay of the granting/denial of your application.

Failure to appear at this meeting may result in the denial of your license. Individual applicants must appear only in person or by an attorney. Corporate or Limited Liability applicants must appear only by the agent designated on the application or by an attorney. Partnership applicants must appear by a partner listed on the application or by an attorney. If you wish to do so and at your own expense, you may be accompanied by an attorney of your choosing to represent

You will be given an opportunity to speak on behalf of the application and to respond and challenge any charges or reasons given for the denial. No petitions can be accepted by the committee, unless the people who signed the petition are present at the committee hearing and willing to testify. You may present witnesses under oath and you may also confront and cross-examine opposing witnesses under oath. If you have difficulty with the English language, you should bring an interpreter with you, at your expense, so that you can answer questions and participate in your hearing.

You may examine the application file at this office during regular business hours prior to the hearing date. Inquiries regarding this matter may be directed to the person whose signature appears below.

- 3. On 10/12/2014 Milwaukee police responded to a shots fired complaint at 4923 West Villard Avenue (the Villard Inn). The manager of the business, Steve Riser, told officers that he observed a black male subject standing in the median firing a gun into the air. During the investigation, officers discovered a female patron of the business that had been struck in the face during one of the many fights occurring. Milwaukee police incident report #142850019 and #142850141 filed.
- 4. On 12/05/2014 Milwaukee police responded to a shooting complaint at 4923 West Villard Avenue (Leden's Villard Inn). The victim, who was a patron of the bar, told officers she had been shot in the neck and that the shooting was related to a fight that involved patrons of the business in a parking lot used by the bar. Milwaukee police incident report #143390023 filed.
- 5. On 12/12/2014 the applicant along with self-titled manager Steven Riser met with Milwaukee police and City Attorney Desiato at Milwaukee police district #7 regarding some nuisance activity that has been occurring at Leden's Villard Inn (4923 West Villard Avenue). Mr. Riser was told he needed to obtain the appropriate license if he is going to manage the business. Mr. Riser explained the security measures currently employed by the bar. City Attorney Desiato explained City Ordinance 80-10 to the applicant and Mr. Riser, and the applicant stated she wished to build a relationship with the community and would like Milwaukee police to conduct a security survey of the establishment.
- 6. On 12/29/2014 Milwaukee police responded to 4923 West Villard Avenue to investigate a complaint of a juvenile party. Officers discovered 120 patrons in the business, approximately 110 of which were under the legal drinking age of 21. The party was closed down and the patrons instructed to leave. One of the patrons displayed a firearm, which was later determined to be a BB gun, from the window of a vehicle as they were leaving the party. Two of the individuals who left the business were later shot while in the 4100 block of North Sherman Boulevard. It is unknown if the shooting was related in any way to the business.
- 7. On 01/03/2015 Milwaukee police responded to a shooting at 4923 West Villard Avenue (Leden's Villard Inn). Investigation revealed a patron of the business was shot in the parking lot at 4949 West Villard Avenue; the business has an agreement with The Word of Grace Fellowship Church to use this lot. Milwaukee police incident report #150030013 filed. Officers discovered the victim of this incident was 18 years old and used a fake ID to gain entry to the business. Additionally, a witness to the offense who had also been in the bar was 17 years old. The applicant received two citations.

- 8. On 01/17/2015 Milwaukee police, along with an Inspector from the Department of Neighborhood Services conducted a licensed premise check at 4923 West Villard Avenue (Leden's Villard Inn). Evidence was discovered during this inspection that the business may be buying liquor from other than a wholesaler/distributor. On 02/04/2015 Milwaukee police, along with an Inspector from the Department of Neighborhood Services and Agent Georgeann King from the State Department of Revenue conducted follow up at 4923 West Villard Avenue (Leden's Villard Inn) regarding the previous inspection. During this inspection, Agent King confiscated over 120 bottles of liquor and malt beverage that was purchased at local stores. Also on 02/04/2015, Inspector Karen Grade of the Milwaukee Health Department conducted an inspection and discovered several violations. Officers discovered during this inspection that Steven Riser, who had previously been identified as the manager of the business, still does not possess a valid Class B manager's license.
- 9. On 02/15/2015 Milwaukee police, while on routine patrol, observed people running in several directions in the area of 4923 West Villard Avenue. Officers then heard two gunshots from the parking lot of the business. A security guard from the business told officers he observed a subject he had put out of the bar firing shots in the parking lot. Officers recovered a spent casing and fired bullet in the parking lot. Milwaukee police incident report #150460008 filed.



To Whom It May Concern:

This is in regards to the restaurant and bar license being applied for the 4th Quarter Sports Bar N Grill which is located at 49th Street and Villard Avenue in Police District 7. The reason that I am against this establishment being granted a liquor license is because this building has been a bar for many years previously. I live a short distance away and this bar has always been a terrible nuisance to my neighborhood. There have been gun fights, shootouts, and cars racing thru the alleys and down the streets all with people coming out of that bar drunk. Litter always was a problem and it would blow from the parking lot of the bar all over the neighborhood. Men leaving that bar would walk down the alley beside my house and other men would hold them up to rob them at gunpoint. Since that bar that was called the Villard Inn has been closed down, all of these problems have not been seen or heard at all. The neighborhood is quiet with no cars zooming up and down alleyways or streets racing away from that bar. I have heard no fighting or gunfire stemming from patrons leaving that bar late at night either. The litter problem has been near nonexistent. Please reconsider licensing that place for liquor because of these concerns, even though the license is being applied for under a different name. False names are being used and felonies are not being reported.

- 1. The license application is scheduled to be heard at the above time. Due to other hearings running longer than scheduled, you may have to wait some time to provide your testimony.
- 2. You must appear in person and testify as to matters that you have personally experienced or seen. (You cannot provide testimony for your neighbor, parent or anyone else; this is considered hearsay and cannot be considered by the committee.)
- 3. No letters or petitions can be accepted by the committee (unless the person who wrote the letter or the persons who signed the petition are present at the committee hearing and willing to testify).
- 4. Persons opposed to the license application are given the opportunity to testify first; supporters may testify after the opponents have finished.
- 5. When you are called to testify, you will be sworn in and asked to give your name, and address. (If your first and/or last names are uncommon please spell them.)

- 6. You may then provide testimony.
- a. Include only information relating to the above license application.
- b. Include only information you have personally witnessed or seen.
- c. Provide concise and relevant information detailing how this business has affected or may affect the peaceful enjoyment of your neighborhood.
- d. If by the time you have the opportunity to testify, the information you wish to share has already been provided to the committee, you may state that you agree with the previous testimony. Redundant or repetitive testimony will not assist the committee in making its recommendation.
- 7. After giving your testimony, the members of the Licenses Committee and the licensee may ask questions regarding the testimony you have given or other factors relating to the license application.
- 8. Business Competition is not a valid basis for denial or non-renewal of a license.

Please Note: If you have submitted an objection to the above application your objection cannot be considered by the committee unless you personally testify at the hearing.



20. On 07/27/13 at 7:15 am, Milwaukee police were dispatched to Froedtert Hospital for a Battery complaint. Police spoke with the victim, James Pruitt, who stated he was at 3500 W Silver Spring at Mike's Tavern working as the bouncer when he observed an unknown female inside the bar smoking a cigarette. Pruitt told the female she had to go outside and smoke when an unknown male approached him and stated, "Don't disrespect my girlfriend". Pruitt stated he told both subjects to go outside so he could talk with them. Pruitt stated he attempted to diffuse the argument when the male took a "boxer stance". Pruitt stated he did the same because he wanted to protect himself. The male then removed an unknown type pistol from his front pants pocket and struck Pruitt in the face one time. Pruitt sustained a 1" laceration to the left side of his nose. Pruitt needed 12 stitches to close the wound. Police also spoke with Pruitt's brother who witnessed the incident and broke up the fight. Police later spoke with the owner Michael Patton, who stated he was in his office during the incident and was not aware that anything happened until Pruitt and his brother came back inside the tavern.

#17, #18 and #19 above previously reported, disposition added 10/01/2014.

21. On 03/15/2015 Milwaukee police responded to a shooting at 3500 West Silver Spring Drive (Mike's Place). Officers discovered the victim, Michael Patton Sr., laying on the floor near the entry to the business, bleeding from a gunshot wound to his left thigh. Investigation revealed Mr. Patton attempted to defuse an argument outside of the business when he was shot. Officers were not able to view the video at the time of the investigation, because Mr. Patton was the only person who was able to operate the system. Three bullet casings were located outside the business. Milwaukee police incident report #150730018 filed.

- 22. On 03/20/2015 Milwaukee police, along with an agent from the Wisconsin Department of Revenue, conducted a licensed premise check at 3500-02 West Silver Spring Drive (Mike's Place). During this inspection, three contaminated bottles of alcohol were disposed of and the bartender, Michael Zoske, received verbal warnings to have paperwork available for viewing in the future, that diluting or re-filling of bottles of alcohol was forbidden, and that all licenses and permits need to properly displayed.
- 23. On 05/20/2015 Milwaukee police responded to an armed robbery complaint at 3500 West Silver Spring Drive (Mike's Place). Investigation revealed the business was robbed by two subjects, one of which appeared to be armed with a handgun. Milwaukee police incident report # 151400123 filed.

This Report Of Incidents Involving Licensed Persons or Premises, original report, was submitted by P.O. Martinez MOORE PS# 015951 assigned to District 4, Late Shift.

On Saturday, March 14, 2015, at 1:34 A.M., Squad 4365, P.O. Ralph MCCLAIN PS# 015494 and I, was dispatched to a "shooting" complaint at 3500 W Silver Spring Dr, Mike's Place.

P.O. MCCLAIN and I, who were assigned the Licensed Premise squad, were assisted in our investigation by the following squads:

Squad 4310, Sergeant Sterling HARDING. Sergeant HARDING assisted the shooting investigation with scene security, resource management, facilitator, and subsequent debriefing.

Squad 4322, P.O. Moua VANG and P.O. Matthew BOUZEK. P.O. VANG assisted in the investigation by locating the scene, separation of witnesses, and scene security. P.O. BOUZEK assisted the shooting investigation by also locating the scene, and ascertained a brief synopsis of the incident then broadcast the pertinent information via open air. Furthermore, Squad 4322 was first on scene and confirmed the shooting.

Squad 4460, P.O. Antonio FITZGERALD and P.O. Nikhom LEE. P.O. FITZGERALD assisted in the shooting investigation by riding along with the victim to Froedtert Memorial Hospital and ascertaining essential information from the victim regarding the circumstances of the shooting. P.O. LEE assisted in the shooting investigation by locating the scene and monitoring pedestrian and personnel movement throughout the scene.

Upon our arrival on scene, I observed the victim, verbally identified as Michael J PATTON B/M, 04-20-72 address of 4121 W River Edge Circle #213; Milwaukee, WI 53209, cell phone# 975-5329, laying on the entryway floor and bleeding profusely from a gunshot wound to his left thigh. PATTON had an improvised tourniquet (black leather belt) tied around his left thigh to stabilize the excessive bleeding.

Milwaukee Fire Department, Truck 15, Red Shift, Commanded by Lieutenant Rick PRICE; and Med 4, Commanded by Captain Brian GARDNER, arrived on scene and immediately administered medical attention to PATTON'S gunshot wound. Succeeding the on scene medical evaluation and diagnosis, to stabilize PATTON, Med 4 conveyed PATTON to Froedtert Memorial Hospital for surgery.

After PATTON was conveyed to Froedtert Hospital, aforementioned squads secured the scene and identified the essential and non-essential witnesses. I interviewed the bartender, identified by her Wisconsin driver's license as Shalonda L WILLIAMS B/F, 11-09-74 address of 4625 N 40th St; Milwaukee, WI 53209, cell phone# 698-4184. My interview of WILLIAMS was conducted by the bar. Shalonda WILLIAMS was not under the influence of drugs or alcohol. WILLIAMS maintained a calm demeanor and was well spoken.

Interview of the Bartender, Shalonda L WILLIAMS B/F, 11-09-74

Shalonda WILLIAMS stated she was working behind the bar and was unaware of any commotions. WILLIAMS stated for no known reason there were gunshots emanating from the front entrance of the tavern. Shalonda WILLIAMS stated the patrons begun frantically scrambling from the tavern. WILLIAMS stated she suspected there were approximately 35 patrons inside the tavern prior to the incident. Shalonda WILLIAMS stated she did not see any of the shooters. WILLIAMS stated after the shooting, the owner, identified as Michael J PATTON B/M, 04-20-72, was physically assisted back into the tavern. Shalonda WILLIAMS stated at this time she was made aware that Michael PATTON was shot. WILLIAMS stated that PATTON laid on the entryway floor until the police and fire department arrived. Shalonda WILLIAMS did not have any further pertinent information pertaining to this investigation.

I then interviewed the victim's son, identified by his Wisconsin identification as Michael J PATTON JR B/M, 07-08-87. PATTON JR was interviewed in the lounge area. Michael PATTON JR was not under the influence of drugs or alcohol, maintained a calm demeanor, and was well spoken.

Interview of victim's son, Michael J PATTON JR B/M, 07-08-87

Michael PATTON JR stated he was on the dance floor (west side of the tavern) when he overheard a commotion coming from the patio (located on the northwest side of the tavern). PATTON JR stated he went to the patio then observed approximately 10 unknown black males, between the age of 25 and 30, engaged in a verbal altercation. Michael PATTON JR stated he attempted to defuse the escalating argument by physically separating the two parties involved. PATTON JR stated that several of the subjects climbed over the patio fence. Michael PATTON JR stated several minutes later he overheard approximately 4 gunshots emanating from the front of the bar. PATTON JR stated he was still in the patio area when the shots were fired. Michael PATTON JR stated moments later; he went to the front then realized that his father was shot. PATTON JR stated he did not see the actors involved in the shooting.

After interviewing Shalonda WILLIAMS and Michael PATTON JR, I collaborated with P.O. MCCLAIN, P.O. BOUZEK, and P.O. VANG who also interviewed witnesses to this incident. Succeeding our collaboration, my investigation revealed that the witnesses did not observe the shooters in this investigation. Furthermore, my investigation revealed that this incident was captured on the tavern's digital camera system. However, the only operator of the camera system was the victim, Michael PATTON SR. There were 3 different spent casings discovered during the investigation. There was also a shattered rear windshield, from a bullet projectile that traveled westward, to a red Cadillac Escalade, bearing WI plates of 713-WCJ, Vin# 1GYEK63N62R102227. The Escalade was parked in front of 3510 W Silver Spring Dr.

Squad 9353, Detective Shaun LESNIEWSKI, and Squad 9126, Detective Elizabeth STEWART, arrived on scene and were subsequently briefed. Detective LESNIEWSKI proceeded with the subsequent investigation and advised me to file a supplemental report regarding.

Camera Layout to Mike's Place

There were 3 exterior cameras to the tavern. The cameras will be notated in numerical order, however, the cameras are not noted in the order that is depicted on the actual camera system. The succeeding order is merely for report purposes.

Exterior Cameras

Exterior Camera #1- mounted on the southwest corner of the building, above the main entrance door, and approximately 15 feet from the ground. Camera #1, faces in a southward position, and captures the vicinity of the main entrance door.

Exterior Camera #2- mounted on the northeast side of the building, approximately 15 feet from the ground. Camera #2, faces south easterly, and captures the vicinity of N 35th St, just north of W. Silver Spring Dr.

Exterior Camera #3- mounted on the southwest side of the building, approximately 15 feet from the ground. Camera #3, faces easterly, and captures the walkway, just west of the main entrance door.

Interior Cameras

Interior Camera #1- mounted on the west wall, in the east room of the tavern. Camera #1 is approximately 10 feet from the floor. Camera #1, faces north easterly, and captures the bar.

Interior Camera #2- mounted on the west wall, 2ND camera to the north of camera #1. Camera #2 is approximately 10 feet from the floor. Interior camera #2, faces in a easterly position, and captures the main entrance doorway.

Interior Camera #3- mounted on the west wall, 3rd camera to the north of camera #1. Camera #3 is approximately 8 feet from the floor. Interior Camera #3 captures the cash register and faces in a downward position.

Interior Camera #4- mounted on the east side of the north wall, in the east room. Camera #4 is approximately 10 feet from the floor. Interior Camera #4 and captures the majority of the lounge area, in the east room of the tavern. Camera #4 faces in a southward position.

Interior Camera #5- mounted on the north wall, in the west dance room of the tavern. Camera #5, faces southward, and captures the dance floor.

Patio Camera

Patio camera- mounted on the exterior, on the north side of the building. Patio camera is approximately 10 feet from the ground. The patio camera, faces northwardly, and captures the enclosed patio area.

This Recklessly Endangering Safety (shooting) occurred in the City and County of Milwaukee. Subsequent investigation will be conducted by the aforementioned Detectives.

Follow-up Investigation

Follow-up investigation shall be conducted at Kimberly II Liquor and Food, located at 3510 W Silver Spring Dr.; and Spring Food Mart, located at 3432 W Silver Spring Dr, for possible evidentiary video footage.

On Friday, 03-20-15, at approximately 7:30pm, Squad 4281 (P.O. James KLUSMANN and I), along with Squad 4283 (P.O. Richard FREDERICKS and P.O. Matthew RITTNER), were asked to assist the Wisconsin Department of Revenue – Alcohol and Tobacco Enforcement with several establishment/premise checks.

During this time period from 2pm-10pm, numerous establishments were visited, where business documents, alcoholic beverages, and tobacco products were inspected and verified.

Our fourth visit was at the establishment Mike's Place, located at 3500-02 W. Silver Spring Drive, which is subsequently located within the City and County of Milwaukee. During this business contact, we identified the bar tender as Micheal ZOSKE (w/m, 08-16-78). ZOSKE was fully cooperative with our investigation, providing us full access to business records and documents, where a verbal warning was given to ZOSKE to have invoices and other paperwork properly organized for proper on sight viewing in the future. ZOSKE was then also given the same warning for the permit display, as well. During this inspection, three contaminated bottles of alcohol were loacted and disposed of in front of agents and officers. ZOSKE was then given additional warning against the diluting or re-filling of alcohol bottles, further informing him of possible consequences to licensure and permit approval upon the renewal period. Lastly, ZOSKE was given a warning about defacing the labeling on empty bottles, along with the proper disposal and recycling procedures of same bottles.

This report was written by PO Bradley Tremblay, assigned to District 4, Early shift.

On 05-20-15, I was dispatched to Mike's Place Tavern, located at 3500 W Silver Spring Dr for an armed robbery call. Upon arrival, I spoke to Michael ZOSKE. ZOSKE indicated that he is a bartender at Mike's Place and has been employed there for approximately 12 years. ZOSKE stated that his typical shift is 2 pm-8 pm and he has never been the victim of a robbery while employed at Mike's.

As it relates to this incident, ZOSKE stated that at approximately 7:40 pm, he was preparing for the end of his shift and getting the bar ready for his relief. ZOSKE stated that after the preparations were done, he was watching the Brewers game and glanced back towards the front entrance. As ZOSKE glanced back, he stated that he observed two subjects walking southbound on N. 35th ST. and these subjects then entered the bar. ZOSKE indicated that he asked the subjects "what can I get for you?" while standing behind the bar. ZOSKE stated that one of the subjects (suspect #2) mumbled "beer." ZOSKE stated that he believed both of the subjects were underage so he told both subjects "I need to see some ID." ZOSKE stated that it was at that time; suspect #1 reached into his front hooded sweatshirt pocket and retrieved a green towel, similar to a dish rag. ZOSKE indicated that suspect #1 then pointed what he believed was a gun at him and stated "gimmie the money out of the register." ZOSKE related that he did not see a gun under the towel but based on the way suspect #1 was holding his hand, ZOSKE assumed the suspect was armed.

ZOSKE indicated that he then raised his arms up to show the suspects he meant no harm and with his right arm, he (ZOSKE) pushed a button on the register to open the till. ZOSKE stated that he began to remove all of the money in the till and handed it to suspect #1. Suspect #1 grabbed the money and then asked ZOSKE "what's under the register?" ZOSKE stated that he removed the till to show the suspects no money was there and told them "there is no money there." ZOSKE stated that suspect #1 then asked ZOSKE where the bathroom was and he (ZOSKE) pointed to the north end of the building where the bathrooms are. Suspect #1 then told ZOSKE to go in the bathroom. ZOSKE then walked from behind the bar and towards the bathroom while suspect #1 followed. Once in the bathroom, suspect #1 told ZOSKE to stay in there and then left. ZOSKE stated that he remained in the bathroom for approximately 2 minutes before leaving. ZOSKE stated that while in the bathroom, he could hear the main entry door open at which time ZOSKE knew the suspects had fled. ZOSKE indicated that he remained in the bathroom for an additional minute to ensure the suspects were gone before he exited.

ZOSKE stated that he exited the bathroom, observed the suspects were fact gone and he (ZOSKE) then called 911 to report the robbery while locking the front door. ZOSKE stated that after he got off the phone with 911, he called PATTON to inform him the business was robbed. ZOSKE related that he was unsure what denominations were taken from the register but knew there were 2, \$20.00 bills and the remaining cash in \$10.00, \$5.00 and \$1.00 bills.

I asked ZOSKE if he could describe the suspects to me and he related the following:

Suspect #1: B/M, 18-20 years of age, 5'10", 150lbs, slim build, dark complexion, last seen wearing a black in color pull over hooded sweatshirt with the hood up and cinched tight around his face and unknown pants or shoes. This suspect as noted earlier, retrieved a green in color cloth from the pocket on his hooded sweatshirt or his front pants pocket. ZOSKE described the males voice as medium pitch.

Suspect #2: B/M, 20-25 years of age, 5'10", 150lbs, slim build, medium complexion, last seen wearing a brown baseball cap (unknown if a logo was displayed), dark colored hooded sweatshirt and unknown pants or shoes.

ZOSKE stated that suspect #2 did not do much other than ask for a beer and just stood around while suspect #1 made the demands. ZOSKE related that suspect #2 did not follow him to the bathroom.

ZOSKE indicated that he did not see the suspects wearing any gloves or masks but based on the lighting conditions and the short length of time, ZOSKE was not ordered in to view photos at this time. ZOSKE stated that he did not consent for anyone to point a gun at him.

ZOSKE had nothing further to add.

INTERVIEW OF PATTON

Michael PATTON stated that is the owners of Mike's Place and has been the owner for the past three years. PATTON stated that he has had no prior robberies in his time as owner and only one prior incident a couple of months ago when he was shot.

PATTON went on to state that the business has only three bartenders one being ZOSKE, Charmice L. DODSON (B/F 09-08-73) and himself. PATTON stated that he was not present during the incident and only learned of it after ZOSKE called him. PATTON indicated that he has not had any problems with patrons recently and does not suspect anyone at this time. PATTON indicated that he did not consent for anyone to rob his business.

VIDEO

While at the scene, I had the opportunity to review surveillance video of the incident. The video was recording about 34 minutes ahead of real time There were a total of six video feeds which were working (Channel 1, 3, 4, 5, 6, and 7).

Upon reviewing the video, the following times are of note:

8:02:13 p.m. - suspects are observed outside of the tavern "casing" it.

8:16:14 p.m. - suspects enter the tavern

8:17:42 p.m. - suspects flee from the tavern following the robbery

These video files were copied to a flash drive, and subsequently burned to a DVD, to create an original copy of the surveillance video files. The DVD was placed on MPD inventory # 15017408, item 1.

This report is written by Police Officer Robert WENGER, assigned to District Four, on Early Shift C.P.U. Squad 4272, with my partner Police Officer Kent Gordon.

On Friday, April 24, 2015 at approximately 6:02pm a tavern check was conducted at Kiss Ultra Lounge located at 7330 N. 76th St. Milwaukee, Wisconsin 53223.

This was conducted with the following personnel Police Officer Tracey GENIESSE, Police Officer Carrie RESNICK, Department of Neighborhood Service employee Amy WEED, Agent Georgean KING and Agent Rick UHLIO with Wisconsin Department of Revenue Alcohol and Tobacco Enforcement, and Officer GORDON and I.

Upon arrival Agent KING made contact with Marc A. BROWN (M/B 04-05-1970, 3206 N. 11th St. (262)295-5211) that identified himself as the business manager of promotions.

During this inspection at my arrival I observed one employee behind the southern side bar working on a point of sale system. She remained behind the bar during our time on scene. There as well were three full drinks on the bar, one empty drink, tin shakers out on the rail that appeared to be used, six patrons sitting on stools at the bar, and one patron filled her own drink by grabbing the dispenser gun over the bar. I made contact with the sole bartender who was identified via a Tennessee driver's license as Shakira T. LOGGIN and verbally gave her updated address and phone number. I asked her if she was the licensed bartender working and she replied she was. I then asked to see her bartender's license, she replied that the manager has it filed in the office. I asked her if she could get her bartenders license from the office for me but she evaded the question. I then asked if she even had a bartender's license, she stated she did in Tennessee. I asked if she had obtained one in Milwaukee and she stated she had not. She stated she had been employed at Kiss Ultra Lounge as a bartender for about one month. She was advised she would be getting a citation for operating without a bartender's license. She then wanted to debate with police that she did not serve any alcohol. It should be noted she had an attitude and was evasive to questions by police during this contact.

While on scene the Class B tavern manager arrived on scene. He was identified as Ralph E. JOHNSON (M/B 02-21-1965, 6644 N. 51st St. (414)581-7353. He has a valid Class B Managers license, BMGR-0196774, expiring 06-30-2015. He was advised of the violations observed and the citations to follow. He was cooperative.

The Class B, BTAVN-0202739 expiring 01-12-2016 with an addition pep-0002489 license. These were the only displayed licenses behind the bar in view.

During the inspection by Agent Georgean KING and Agent UHLIO with Wisconsin Department of Revenue Alcohol and Tobacco Enforcement observed and reported the following problems.

- -no licensed operator/bartender on premises
- -empty liquor bottles were not defaced
- -all alcohol on premises must be from a wholesaler and be listed on the invoice
- -retain invoices of order
- -hookah tobacco must be from a tobacco distributor and must have a license to provide to customers. They as well confiscated 2 bottles of Remy Martin 750ml alcohol, 5 containers of hookah tobacco, and 4 cash register receipts. It should be noted that one of the receipts showed that ice was being bought for the business by a Wisconsin issued Quest card.

I attempted to make contact with the Licensee, Jennifer GARCIA, by calling her listed telephone number on two occasions but the calls went to voicemail, which stated the phone number owner was a "Karen" so no message was left. we went to her listed address of 2767 N. 41st St. as well but there was no answer at the door.

The citation was mailed to her last listed address. LOGGINS was cited in person at 10:00pm on 04-25-2015 at Kiss Ultra Lounge.

This completes my current report.

Phase 1 Observations outside the location

The vast majority of vehicles and patrons of the tavern had left the location before our arrival. The remaining vehicles and citizens were employees of the tavern. On scene were two managers, three security officers and four bartenders. One of the security officers was armed. There are no exterior cameras.

Phase 2 Observations inside

The tavern was closed at the time of this incident and only employees were inside. The capacity limit for this location is 476.

This report is written by P.O. Jonathan MILLER assigned to Squad 4365, District Four, Late Shift. On 7-26-15 at 2:21 am Squad 4365 (P.O. Moua VANG and I) was dispatched to The Kiss Ultra Lounge located at 7330 N 76th. St. for a PI accident. Squad 4330 (P.O. Lisa BAAKE and P.O. William SCKLICKE), Squad 4320 (P.O. Martin WALLNER AND P.O. Jutiki X) also responded. Upon my arrival I observed tavern employees around WILSON in the parking lot. WILSON was sitting on the ground with his back against a vehicle. As I approached WILSON I observed that his pants were slightly ripped. WILSON informed me that a vehicle had struck him. WILSON stated that he was experiencing pain to his right leg, right hip, right torso and head. I observed WILSON'S ripped pant, abrasions on his right torso as well as his right elbow. I called for medical assistance and MFD Eng 39 (Blu shift) lead by Lt. Chris KIETZKE responded.

WILSON stated that he observed a fight between an unknown B/F and B/M. WILSON stated that he and others intervened to stop the fight and things calmed down for a short time. WILSON stated another fight began between multiple B/Ms and he as well as other security officers and patrons stopped the fight. WILSON stated as this fight was being stopped a dark colored van came speeding from the east end of the parking lot. It

is not uncommon for vehicles to drive erraticlly and at high speeds while leaving the taverns. WILSON stated he was unable to escape the path of the vehicle and was struck by it causing him to fall to the ground. WILSON stated that he has had no issues with anyone and does not suspect anyone specific of this incident. Paratech 107 transported WILSON to Froedtert Hospital.

I spoke to HOLMES who called police. HOLMES stated he heard someone outside yell that someone had been struck by a vehicle and called police. HOLMES had no further information regarding this incident.

I spoke with MOORE-SPICER who stated that he observed the above mentioned fights and the vehicle speed through the parking lot. MOORE-SPICER stated the driver of the vehicle appeared to be a B/M with a pencil line style of beard. MOORE-SPICER stated the vehicle exited the parking lot and drove N/B on N. 76th. St. MOORE-SPICER stated the vehicle was a dark colored newer van. MOORE-SPICER stated it was the style of mini van that had dual rear sliding doors. MOORE-SPICER stated he believed the vehicle to be a Chrysler product. MOORE-SPICER stated he was able to obtain the license plate of the vehicle. The plate given was 695-XNK. This vehicle is listed as a gray 2009 Toyota van, WI reg. 695-XNK, vin# 5TDZK22C19S241712. The listed owner of the vehicle is Schehera A. MUHAMMAD (B/F 12-19-87, 10300 W. Dean Rd. #106). A D.O.T check of MUHAMMAD indicated the same address.

The rest of the indicated staff was inside the tavern at the time of this incident. There were no calls for police service regarding the fights that occured before this incident.

Squad 4365 changed location to 10300 W. DEAN Rd. to attempt contact with MUHAMMAD to determine who had her vehicle. I did not observe the vehicle parked on the street or in the surrounding parking lots. The apartment complex was locked and we received no answer when using the doorbell. A check of ARS revealed a cell phone # of 748-8008 for MUHAMMAD from a report taken on 6-24-10. No one answered when I called this number and a voice message was left requesting that MUHAMMAD contact P.O. VANG or me.

I was later able to again make contact with WILSON at Froedtert Hospital in ER room 34. WILSON was admitted at 3:11 am and seen by Dr. Alicia PILARSKI. At the time of this report WILSON had suffered bruises and abrasions. WILSON was given P.O. VANG'S and my contact information if any further injuries were discovered.

P.O. VANG is filing crash report QPWQMFK regarding this incident. P.O. VANG and I will be conducting additional follow up regarding this incident to determine who was operating the vehicle mentioned above. Once the driver of the vehicle is discovered a state citaion of Duty upon striking person or attended vehicle / personal injury [statute 346.67(1)] will be issued as well as any other relevant citations or charges. This incident is still being investigated.
