could not be identified and the existing island stop is unsafe and not ADA accessible.

Results: The committee recommends that the stop be relocated approximately 120 feet to the east. The existing

far-side stop is located too close to 91st Street after the bus makes its southeast turn from the north, which makes it difficult for operators to effectively and safely service the stop. Operators currently have problems getting the bus parallel to the curb, so the back end of the bus sticks out into the traffic lane, as well as buses colliding with the bus stop pole with their mirror. Mr. Mohammad also requested a shelter so passengers can wait at the stop, and not in his business, but there is insufficient space in the right-of-way to install one at this time. Alderman Puente's office will investigate the possibility of

added infrastructure for a shelter.
