

In-School Youth Proposal

Coordinators are placed in schools to provide a critical resource for youth to access school and community resources that may be available to support their individual career plans. Coordinators help youth assess their level of basic skills, work maturity and other career development goals. Coordinators assist youth in their preparations to identify and secure opportunities for work based learning experiences. Through work-based learning youth have an opportunity to gain productive employment that is nurturing to each youth's personal and career development. Youth will also be offered employer information based on MAWIB's five sector based employment sectors.

The Goals of the in-school model are to provide:

- 1. Structured well supervised and substantive work-based learning experiences in government agencies, non-profit organizations and private sector businesses.
- 2. Career planning including awareness, assessment, and exploration of vocational interests as well as learn about occupational alternatives.
- 3. Role models to at-risk youth that encourage them to continue in (or return) to school.
- 4. Work experience, training and support services for youth with special employability needs.
- 5. Opportunities that may lead to: full time unsubsidized employment for youth returning to school
- 6. Academic and job skill enrichment to maintain or increase academic levels.

The In-School Youth program model supports work-based learning that enhances the development of eight youth Development Competencies:

- Basic Skills
- Life Skills
- Career Development
- Pre-Employment

- Social Emotional Learning Skills
- Job Retention
- Work Maturity
- Leadership/ Personal Skills

Other considerations

The program will provide youth with access to the 14 WIOA program elements:

- 1. Tutoring, study skills training
- 2. Alternative or dropout recovery services
- 3. Paid and unpaid work experiences
- 4. Occupational skill training,
- 5. Leadership development activities
- 6. Supportive services
- 7. Adult mentoring
- 8. Follow-up services for at least 12 months after program completion

- 9. Comprehensive guidance and counseling, including drug and alcohol abuse counseling
- 10. Integrated education and training for a specific occupation or cluster
- 11. Financial literacy education
- 12. Entrepreneurial skills training
- 13. Services that provide labor market information about
- 14. Postsecondary preparation and transition activities

Each coordinator will be assigned to a:

- High School
- Alternative/ Private
- Middle School
