Dear Council Members:

In accordance with Common Council Ordinance 320-27.3(c), the Milwaukee Police Department Safety Division submits the following 2003 traffic reports as requested by Alderman Terry Witkowski.

- City of Milwaukee Crash Trends (years 1992 through 2003)
- City of Milwaukee Annual Traffic Analysis (years 1922 through 2003)
- City of Milwaukee 2003 Fatal Traffic Accident Summary

In 2003, the City of Milwaukee experienced a decrease of 837 reportable crashes. Total reportable crashes for 2003 were 12,755, compared to 13,592 in 2002. As well, the number of traffic injuries decreased in 2003 by 438, to 4,354 from 2002's total of 4,792. The number of traffic fatalities decreased by 7; in 2003 total traffic fatalities were 28, compared to 35 in 2002. In addition, pedestrian fatalities decreased by 3. The total number of pedestrian crashes for 2003 was 7, compared to 10 in 2002.

The City of Milwaukee Crash Trends report shows that the various types of crashes remained relatively unchanged, with the exception of motorcycle crashes and bicyclists injuries. Motorcycle crashes increased by 38 in 2002. There were 159 motorcycle crashes in 2002, compared to 197 in 2003. Bicyclists injured or killed in 2003 decreased by 87; in 2002 there were 199 injured or killed bicyclists compared to 112 in 2003.

The City of Milwaukee registration rate for 2003 was 0.7%, which is the second lowest rate for the city on record. The registration rate is calculated by the total number of traffic fatalities divided by the number of registered motor vehicles.

To help decrease the number of traffic crashes, injuries and fatalities in the City of Milwaukee, the Milwaukee Police Department continuously enforces traffic violations. In the Police Districts, radar cars are deployed to combat the traffic problems within the communities each serves. The Patrol Support Division staff relentlessly enforces traffic violations citywide for Milwaukee, as part of their duties. In addition, to help with the

efforts to improve traffic safety in Milwaukee, the Department of Transportation (DOT) awarded the Police Department several enforcement grants.

The grants awarded by DOT focused on pedestrian, bicycle and seat belt enforcement. Although the grants required enforcement to focus on the aforementioned safety issues, the grant did require law enforcement of speed and drunk driving. In addition, the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA) awarded the Police Department a pedestrian enforcement grant, which is titled Milwaukee Safe Routes. This grant is a 2-year pilot project that focus on traffic safety in communities to help encourage more people to walk and reduce the number of motor vehicle trips in their communities, largely to help increase the number of students that walk to and from school. News releases were sent out by the Police Department announcing enforcement efforts.

Education, enforcement and engineering are important components when trying to improve traffic safety; however, most crashes and fatalities occur because of senseless actions beyond any official's control. I do believe efforts are relentlessly taken by the Police Department and other agencies to improve traffic safety in our communities and will continue.

Dear Council Members:

In accordance with Common Council Ordinance 320-27.3(c), the Milwaukee Police Department Safety Division submits the following 2004 traffic reports.

- 1. A report on motor vehicle traffic accident trends. This report shall include, but not be limited to, comprehensive accident data, a narrative interpreting the data and a listing of the locations of all traffic fatalities. (Attachment #1-A and #1-B)
- 2. A report containing data, including tables, charts or maps, highlighting locations with high accident frequencies in the previous calendar year. (Attachment #2-A, #2-B and #1-C)
- 3. A report summarizing the status of the matters the safety commission has the responsibility to review. The reports shall include, but not be limited to, recommendations on appropriate actions necessary or advisable to be taken by the various departments, boards, commissions or agencies or by the mayor and common council to reduce the rates of accident occurrences, and comparisons and analysis of citywide public safety actions over time to determine the extent of progress being made to reduce and eliminate the public safety matters. (Included in report narrative.)

In 2004, the City of Milwaukee experienced a decrease of 867 reportable crashes. Total reportable crashes for 2004 were 11,888, compared to 12,755 in 2003. As well, the number of traffic injuries decreased in 2004 by 109, to 4,245 from 2003's total of 4,354. The number of traffic fatalities in 2004 increased by 24; for a total of 52, compared to 28 in 2003. In addition, pedestrian fatalities increased by 10. The total number of pedestrian fatalities for 2004 was 17, compared to 7 in 2003.

The City of Milwaukee Crash Trends report shows that the various types of crashes remained relatively unchanged, with the exception of motorcycle crashes and school bus crashes. Motorcycle crashes decreased by 44 in 2004. There were 153 motorcycle crashes in 2004, compared to 197 in 2003. School bus crashes declined 33 in 2004 to 195, when compared to 197 in 2003.

The City of Milwaukee registration rate for 2004 was 1.4%. The registration rate is calculated by the total number of traffic fatalities divided by the number of registered motor vehicles.

The Patrol Support Division continues their arduous efforts to enforce traffic violations citywide throughout the City of Milwaukee. The Department's success of enforcement has been enhanced through the receipt of various Wisconsin Department of Transportation (DOT) Grants. These grant awards have included funding for Pedestrian and Bicycle Safety Enforcement, and the "CLICK IT OR TICKET MOBILIZATION PROJECT", which includes two components: "YOU DRINK & DRIVE, YOU LOSE" alcohol mobilization; and the "SEAT BELT MOBILIZATION." The implementation of these grant fund programs demonstrates the Department's efforts in the reduction of traffic violations.

EDUCATION, ENFORCEMENT and ENGINEERING Tools are factors in addressing efforts to improve traffic safety. The Department continues to employ relentless measures to eradicate traffic violators within our community.

As you know, the Safety Division of the Milwaukee Police Department, with the assistance of the Department of Public Works, is required to submit three reports to the Common Council in compliance with ordinance 320-27-3(d). These reports concern traffic accident data. These reports have been presented in October or November for the previous year.

The submission of these reports has been delayed primarily due to the Wisconsin Department of Transportation's installation of a new Accident Retrieval System. The implementation of this new system delayed them in providing the necessary traffic data to the Department of Public Works, Infrastructure Services Division - Traffic Engineering Section for compilation and reporting to the Safety Division. The Wisconsin Department of Transportation is the only entity that tracks and provides these comprehensive traffic statistics for the entire State of Wisconsin.

Jeffrey Polenske, City Engineer, DPW-Infrastructure Services Division-Traffic Engineering Section, has indicated that the Wisconsin Department of Transportation was eight months behind in providing the traffic statistics to them. His staff has indicated that it is their hope that the report can be completed and forwarded to the Safety Division by October 30, 2006.

If the report is provided to the Safety Division by October 30, 2006 as projected, I anticipate that we will present the required reports to the Public Safety Committee on November 23, 2006.

Per our prior discussion, we are providing the following information to you concerning the status of the compilation of year-end accident statistics for the City of Milwaukee.

As you are aware, we receive electronic data files from the Wisconsin Department of Transportation (WISDOT) to process and compile the statistics on accidents in the City of Milwaukee. The data files necessary to compile the statistics are typically transmitted to the City in April or May following editing and finalizing the Statewide accident database. Earlier this year, WISDOT made a conscientious decision to dedicate available staff time and resources to completion of the statewide GPS based accident location reporting system, which delayed finalization of the statewide accident database until this project was substantially completed. As a result, the accident data needed to compile the Citywide year-end accident statistics did not become available until late this past summer. We now have been able to incorporate all 2005 data accident data into our database and are currently in the process of doing the data analysis necessary to complete the accident summary. We anticipate this work to be completed by the end of October.

In 2005, the City of Milwaukee experienced a small decrease of 73 reportable crashes. Total reportable crashes for 2005 were 11,815, compared to 11,888 in 2004. As a result, the number of traffic injuries decreased in 2005 by 69 to 4,176 from 4,245 in 2004.

The number of traffic injuries in 2005 decreased by 18, for a total of 34, compared to 52 in 2004. Pedestrian fatalities decreased from 17 in 2004 to 11 in 2005, a reduction of 6.

The City of Milwaukee Crash Trends report shows that the various types of crashes remained relatively unchanged, with the exception of motorcycle crashes. Motorcycle crashes increased by 41 for a total of 194 in 2005, compared to 153 in 2004.

According to MSNBC, the City of Milwaukee was ranked as the eighth safest driving city in the United States. Drivers in Milwaukee ranked 22nd in population, and are likely to experience a crash once every 12.5 years. The best average for cities with between 500,00 and one million people.

The Milwaukee Police Department and DPW-Infrastructure Services Division-Traffic Engineering Section continues to partner on various initiatives in the City's efforts to address and improve traffic safety, particularly speeding in residential areas. EDUCATION, ENFORCEMENT and ENGINEERING Tools are factors in addressing efforts to improve traffic safety. The Department continues to employ relentless measures to eradicate traffic violators within our community.

The Department's success of enforcement has been enhanced through the receipt of various Wisconsin Department of Transportation (DOT) Grants. The implementation of these grant fund programs demonstrates the Department's efforts in the reduction of traffic violations. (Attachment #1-D).





In accordance with Common Council Ordinance 320-27.3(d), the Milwaukee Police Department Safety Division submits the following 2006 Traffic Reports.

- 1. A report on motor vehicle traffic accident trends. This report shall include, but not be limited to, comprehensive accident data, a narrative interpreting the data and a listing of the locations of all traffic fatalities. (Attachment #1-A, #1-B, 2-B, and 3-B.
- 2. A report containing data, including tables, charts or maps, highlighting locations with high accident frequencies in the previous calendar year. (Attachments #1-C, 2-C and 1-D)
- 3. A report summarizing the status of the matters the safety commission has the responsibility to review. The reports shall include, but not be limited to, recommendations on appropriate actions necessary or advisable to be taken by the various Departments, Boards, Commissions or Agencies or by the Mayor and Common Council to reduce the rates of accident occurrences, and comparisons and analysis of citywide public safety actions over time to determine the extent of progress being made to reduce and eliminate the public safety matters. There was an increase of 650 in the 2006 Reportable Crashes (12,465) compared to (11,815) during 2005. The data further indicates an increase of 105 in the number of related injuries occurring from 2005 (4,176) to 2006 (4,281). An analysis of the 2006 Fatal Traffic Accident Summary (1-B) compared to 2005 shows an increase in the number of Fatal Traffic Crashes in the following Aldermanic Districts; #1, #2, #3, #5, and #13, The most significant decrease of Traffic Fatalities occurred in Alderman Witkowiak's Aldermanic District #12.

A breakdown of driver causes showed no significant increase or decrease in percentage, other than Motorcycle crashes which were down by 41, (194 vs153) and Pedestrians injured or killed increased by 50 from 2005, (469vs 520) which is lower than the ten year average of 602. The use of alcohol continues to impact on the number of fatal crashes. During 2006, there were

fourteen related fatal crashes of which thirteen of those fatal crashes were over the .08 alcohol level.

Lowest fatality rate ever on roads in '06

Motorcycle deaths up for 9th year

The nation last year saw the argest drop in traffic deaths in nore than a decade, which led o the lowest highway fatality are ever recorded, Transportaion Secretary Mary Peters said vionday.

Last year, 42,642 people died n traffic crashes, down 868 leaths from 2005. That 2% drop ed to a historic low fatality rate of 1.42 per 100 million vehicle niles traveled, Peters said.

"Tough safety requirements ind new technologies are helpng make our vehicles safer and our roads less deadly," she said. 'But we all must do more when so many are killed or seriously hurt on our roads every day."

Fatalities of occupants of passenger vehicles - cars, SUVs, vans and pickups — fell to 30,521, the lowest annual total since 1993. Injuries were also down, with passenger car injuries falling 6.2% and large truck injuries 15%, Peters said. The National Highway Traffic

Safety Administration (NHTSA) collects crash statistics annually from the states, the District of Columbia and Puerto Rico.

USA TODAY reported in January, based on its independent state-by-state analysis, that traffic deaths dropped substantially last year in 16 states.

creases reflected stepped-up enforcement, education campaigns and new laws. For example, three states - Alaska, Kentucky and Mississippi — enacted seat belt laws, bringing the number of states requiring more death in 2006 than in 2005, while traffic deaths declined in Kentucky and Mississippi, where officials credited the drops to the new law.

A troubling finding in the new NHTSA report: Motorcycle deaths rose for the ninth straight year, by 5.1% to 4,810.

This year for the first time ever, more people died in motorcycle crashes than the number of pedestrians killed," said Jonathan Adkins, spokesman for the Governors Highway Safety Association, which advises states on traffic safety. "We want to see states adopt a comprehensive strategy to reduce these deaths."

Only 20 states and the District of Columbia have laws requiring helmets for all motorcy-

seat belts to 25. Alaska had one cle riders. Louisiana is the only state to adopt such a law in the past 10 years. The trend has been in the opposite direction, with some states repealing their helmet laws, Adkins said.

Alcohol-related fatalities increased slightly last year. There were 15,121 fatalities involving a driver or motorcycle operator, pedestrian or cyclist with a blood-alcohol concentration of 0.08 or above, compared with 15,102 in 2005. Enforcement of impaired-driving laws will remain a priority for the Transportation Department, said NHTSA Administrator Nicole

"There is a personal story behind these statistics, and for every alcohol-related fatality, the family left behind is shattered forever," Nason said.

Milwaukee drivers among safest in nation

Milwaukee drivers are some of the safest drivers in the nation, according to an Allstate Insurance internal review of 197 U.S. cities released June 14.

Milwaukee drivers ranked safest among cities with populations of 500,000 to 1 million and ninth safest nationwide, according to the study Drivers in the Brew City were 21 percent less likely to be involved in an accident compared to the company's national average, which was compiled from internal property damage reports from January 2004 to, December 2005.



Collaborated with the Water Safety Task Force and the Boys and Girls Club of Greater Milwaukee to offer free swim lessons to children.

Provided the Water Safety Teaching Curriculum and brochures to the Boys and Girls Club of Greater Milwaukee to be utilized at all of their sites to teach Water Safety during the past Summer.

Implemented the Second Annual Water Safety Shoppers Program at three (3) area grocery stores; El Rey, Jewel Osco and Lena's Food Market.

In cooperation with the Community Services Division collaborated on outreach programs to address, broaden the awareness and to educate students and the community of the dangers of firearms (distribution of "Kids and Weapons" and "IT'S TIME TO STOP THE VIOLENCE" Let's Start with Weapons" brochures).

On an ongoing basis provided Car Seat Installations and Presentations on Seat Belt Safety including the distribution of the new Booster Seat Law Pamphlet.

Coordinated the "Annual International Walk Our Children To School Day" on October 4, 2006 at Guadalupe Elementary School. There were one hundred and fifty participants including elected officials.

Conducted Training Programs to participating schools with a School Cadet Program.

Coordinated Recognition Luncheons for selected schools with outstanding School Cadet Programs:

Exchange Club Recipients: Grantosa Elementary, St. Sebastian and Cooper Elementary St. Joseph Foundation Recipients: St. Roman, Fairview and Curtin Elementary Schools North Milwaukee Lions' Club Recipients: Parkview and Mt. Calvary Lutheran Schools Wisconsin Service League Recipients: Phillips Elementary School

Maintenance and upkeep of an adequate inventory of uniforms, rule books for the administration of a School Cadet Program.

TRAFFIC SAFETY:

Successfully facilitated the transfer of the administration of all Court Mandated Referrals from the Municipal Court to the Safety Division for the Defensive Driving Class. This included Administrative Procedures and appropriate forms for the tracking of referrals for the Municipal Court to verify compliance and participation.

In cooperation with the City Clerk's Office-Licensing Division and City Attorney's Office, revised the Public Passenger Vehicle Test and the Defensive Driving Course.

In cooperation with DPW-Infrastructure Services Division assisted with the implementation of the Street Share Program. (Program aimed to educate citizens regarding the rules of the road, safety and quality of life issues.)

On a continuous basis disseminated "Slow Down" signs to elected officials, city residents and community organizations. Set up the Speed Display Board in designated areas of the City of Milwaukee upon request.

Conducted forty-three Defensive Driving Courses and Public Passenger Vehicle Test. There were nine hundred and six participants enrolled in the DDC and PPV Classes.

Provided coordination and administration of the Line of Sight Ordinance: Conducted twenty-eight on sight inspections to homeowners and followed with written communication regarding corrective action needed to comply with Ordinance.

CITYWIDE CENTRAL SAFETY COMMITTEE:

Staff represents the MPD on this committee and serves as Co-Chair of the Training Committee

In an effort to reduce the number of work related injuries within the Department, staff analyzed all work related injury statistics Quarterly and developed Safety Tips to address and reduce injuries within the work place. These Safety Tips were prominently posted in all work locations (STRESS WARNING SIGNS and SLIPS, TRIPS and FALLS).

MEDIA/PUBLIC RELATIONS:

On a continuous basis provided news releases to the Public Information Officer on traffic statistics, special holiday safety tips, Water and Pedestrian Safety, for distribution to the media.

On air appearances at 1290AM and 860AM Radio Stations and Channel 25 "Insight Program". Public Service Announcements on Safety Tips were aired on Channel 25 and Wisconsin On Demand Television Stations.

In cooperation with the University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee's Asian Studies Program and the Community Services Division provided written materials in Hmong and Spanish to area local publications.

OUTREACH EFFORTS:

Implemented a collaborative initiative with the Community Services Division to implement a "Speed Watch" Program to address the issues on speeding on Appleton Ave., Lisbon Ave and Burleigh Street.

In cooperation with the DPW-Infrastructure Services Division- Traffic Engineering employed various traffic initiatives to address speeding within the community.

Provided ongoing support to various organizations seeking ways to reduce speeding in area residents.


