### 1. Description of Grant Project/Program (Include Target Locations and Populations):

Even though immunizations are among the most effective and cost-effective prevention interventions available, we have yet to accomplish the Healthy People 2010 objective of having 90% of children completed their 4:3:1:3:3 immunization series. Immunization coverage rates for City of Milwaukee children are estimated to be as much as 29 percentage pointes lower than that of Milwaukee County (41% City versus 78% County for children 19-35 months of age for their 4:3:1:3:3 series - 4 doses of diptheria and tetanus toxiods and acellular pertussis (DtaP) vaccine, 3 doses of inactivated poliovirus vaccine, 1 dose of measles-mumps-rubella (MMR) vaccine, 3 doses of Haemophilus influenzar type b (HIB) vaccine, and 3 doses of hepatitis B vaccine). Furthermore, a substantial immunization gap exists between races/ethnicities within the City. Based on Data from the Wisconsin Immunization Registry, the 4:3:1:3:3 immunization completion rate for African American children ages 19 to 35 months is 36% as compared to 52% for White children and 57% for Hispanic children. The specific aim of this project is to implement a set of community intervention activities to reduce immunization disparities and increase immunization rates; and to develop sustainable and transferable interventions for reducing racial disparities in immunizations.

This grant is consistent with departmental strategic goals of reducing racial health disparities and with departmental objectives of increasing immunization completion rates.
