Report on complaint seeking the revocation of the Public Passenger

Vehicle Driver's license of Cameron Radcliff.

FINDINGS OF FACT

- 1. Cameron Radcliff (hereinafter the "Licensee") is the holder of a Public Passenger Vehicle Driver's license (#20300), which was granted and issued on February 14, 2008.
- 2. A complaint seeking the revocation of said license was filed with the City Clerk by the Milwaukee Police Department.
- 3. Pursuant to Chapter 100 of the Milwaukee Code of Ordinances the complaint and a summons demanding the appearance of the Licensee before the Public Safety Committee of the City of Milwaukee Common Council on July 17, 2008 at 9:00 a.m. were served on Cameron Radcliff as Licensee on July 7, 2008 by Police Officer Tracy Tabzadon, a Police Officer of the Milwaukee Police Department.
- 4. At said date, time and place, the Licensee did not appear. He was not represented by counsel at the hearing.
- 5. Based upon the sworn testimony heard, the evidence received at the hearing, and the non-appearance of the Licensee, the Committee makes the following findings of fact as set forth in the revocation complaint against Licensee:

- A. That the Licensee is the holder of a valid Public Passenger Vehicle Driver's License #20300, issued by the City of Milwaukee.
- B. That the First Transit Transportation Company employs the Licensee for the purpose of transporting mentally ill patients.
- C. That pursuant to a review of Milwaukee Police Department offense report #081510165, while under such employ, on May 30, 2008, the Licensee intentionally fondled a female passenger's vagina under her clothes and without her consent. Further, the victim is 35 years of age with a cognitive functionality of a 4-5 year old.
- D. That pursuant to review of Wisconsin Circuit Court Access Files, the Licensee, on June 5, 2008, was charged with 2nd Degree Sexual Assault of a Mentally Ill Victim, Milwaukee County Case Number 2008CF002855.
- E. That the above charges reflect conduct substantially related to the licensed activity constituting a risk to the health, safety and welfare of the public.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

- 1. The Committee has jurisdiction to hold hearings and provide Findings of Fact, Conclusions of Law and a Recommendation to the full Common Council pursuant to Chapters 100 and 85 of the Milwaukee Code of Ordinances.
- 2. Based upon the above facts found, the Committee finds that the Licensee, Cameron Radcliff, has not met the criteria of Chapter 100 of the Milwaukee Code of Ordinances to allow the continued operation of license. Pursuant to MCO § 100-54-6-e, because of the Licensee's non-appearance, the conduct alleged in the police department's complaint is accepted as true. The Licensee's conduct is substantially related to the circumstances of the licensed activity of a public passenger vehicle driver.
- 3. The Committee recommends that the full Common Council of the City of Milwaukee exercise its judgment to suspend the Public Passenger Vehicle Driver's License held by Cameron Radcliff pending the disposition of the Licensee's criminal charges, consistent with Wis. Stat. § 111.335, based upon the danger that his conduct represents to the health, safety and welfare of the citizens of the City of Milwaukee.

RECOMMENDATION

Based upon the Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law stated above, the Committee, by a vote of five (5) ayes and zero (0) noes, recommends that the Public Passenger Driver's License held by Cameron Radcliff be suspended until the disposition of the criminal charges pending against Mr. Radcliff, consistent with Wis. Stat. § 111.335.
